Wine-satellite sales.

A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to wine; providing a definition; providing
2 for dispensing of wine at satellite locations as specified;
3 providing for a licensing fee; and providing for an
4 effective date.

6 *Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:*

8 **Section 1.** W.S. 12-1-101(a) by creating a new
9 paragraph (xxvi) and 12-4-412(b) (v) are amended to read:

11 **12-1-101. Definitions.**

13 (a) As used in this title:

14

15 (xxvi) "Satellite" means all wholesalers,
16 manufacturers, rectifiers, distillers, importers,

1 breweries, microbreweries and wineries having related
2 business operations located away from the original licensed
3 location.

5 **12-4-412. Microbrewery and winery permits;**
6 **authorized; conditions; dual permits and licenses; fees.**

8 (b) The local licensing authority:

9

10 (v) (A) May allow the winery to sell its
11 manufactured wine on site for off-premises personal
12 consumption, not for retail sale, in packaging of bottles
13 of an aggregate volume not to exceed two thousand twenty-
14 eight (2,028) ounces per sale and at up to three (3)
15 satellite locations within Wyoming separate from its
16 licensed manufacturing site under the original permit fee
17 as provided in subparagraph (B) of this paragraph and with
18 the approval of the local licensing authority. The
19 satellite winery permit shall be issued on application to
20 the appropriate licensing authority without public notice
21 or hearing. The local licensing authority may require the
22 payment of an additional license fee not to exceed one
23 hundred dollars (\$100.00) regardless of the number of
24 satellite locations;

(B) The satellite winery permit shall be subject to the terms and conditions of W.S. 12-4-106, the schedule of operating hours provided in W.S. 12-5-101 and the dispensing room provisions of W.S. 12-5-201.

Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2002.
