5 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

7 **Section 1.** W.S. 6-2-101 is amended to read:

9 6-2-101. Murder in the first degree; penalty.

- 11 (a) Whoever purposely and with premeditated malice,
- 12 or in the perpetration of, or attempt to perpetrate, any
- 13 sexual assault, arson, robbery, burglary, escape, resisting
- 14 arrest, or kidnapping, or abuse of a child under the age of
- 15 sixteen (16) years, kills any human being is guilty of
- 16 murder in the first degree.

2 (b) Whoever intentionally or knowingly shakes or 3 inflicts bodily injury upon a child under the age of 4 eighteen (18) years resulting in the child's death is 5 guilty of murder in the first degree, if the actor is an adult and is at least four (4) years older than the victim. 6 7

(b)(c) A person convicted of murder in the first 8 9 degree shall be punished by death, life imprisonment 10 without parole or life imprisonment according to law, 11 except that no person shall be subject to the penalty of 12 death for any murder committed before the defendant 13 attained the age of sixteen (16) years.

(c)(d) A person convicted of murder in the first 15 16 degree in a case in which the state seeks the death penalty 17 shall be sentenced in accordance with the provisions of W.S. 6-2-102. In all other cases, including any case in 18 which the state has determined not to seek the death 19 20 penalty at any stage of the proceeding, the judge shall 21 determine the sentence of life imprisonment without parole 22 or life imprisonment taking into consideration any negotiated plea agreement and any evidence relevant to a 23

1 determination of sentence which the court deems to have

2 probative value.
