Judicial taxation authority.

for

- 1 A JOINT RESOLUTION requesting Congress to propose and
- 2 submit to the several states for ratification an amendment
- 3 to the Constitution of the United States on the subject of
- 4 judicial taxation.

- 6 WHEREAS, separation of powers is fundamental to the United
- 7 States Constitution and the power of the federal government
- 8 is strictly limited; and

9

- 10 WHEREAS, under the United States Constitution, the states
- 11 are to determine public policy; and

12

- 13 WHEREAS, it is the duty of the judiciary to interpret the
- 14 law, not to create law; and

15

- 1 WHEREAS, federal district courts, with the acquiescence of
- 2 the United States Supreme Court, continue to order states
- 3 to levy or increase taxes in violation of the United States
- 4 Constitution and the legislative process; and

5

- 6 WHEREAS, the time has come for the people of this great
- 7 nation and their duly elected representatives in state
- 8 government, to reaffirm, in no uncertain terms, that the
- 9 authority to tax under the Constitution of the United
- 10 States is retained by the people who, by their consent
- 11 alone, do delegate such power to tax explicitly to those
- duly elected representatives in the legislative branch of 12
- 13 government whom they choose, such representatives being
- 14 directly responsible and accountable to those who have
- 15 elected them; and

16

- WHEREAS, several states have petitioned the United States 17
- Congress to propose an amendment to the Constitution of the 18
- United States of America which was previously introduced in 19
- 20 Congress; and

21

- 22 WHEREAS, the amendment seeks to prevent federal courts from
- 23 levying or increasing taxes without representation of the
- 24 people and against the people's wishes.

- 2 Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved By The Members of the
- 3 Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

4

- 5 1. That the Congress of the United States expeditiously
- 6 propose and submit to the Legislatures of the several
- 7 States for ratification an amendment to the Constitution of
- 8 the United States to add a new article providing as
- 9 follows:
- "Neither the Supreme Court nor any inferior
- 11 court of the United States shall have the power
- 12 to instruct or order a state or a political
- 13 subdivision thereof, or an official of such a
- 14 state or political subdivision, to levy or
- 15 increase taxes."

16

- 17 2. That this resolution constitutes a continuing
- 18 application in accordance with Article V of the
- 19 Constitution of the United States.

20

- 21 3. That the Legislatures of each of the several states
- 22 comprising the United States are urged to apply to the
- 23 United States Congress requesting that the referenced

1 amendment to the United States Constitution be submitted to

2 the states for ratification.

3

4 4. That the Secretary of State transmit copies of this

5 resolution to the President of the United States Senate,

6 the Speaker of the House of Representatives of the United

7 States, each Member of the Wyoming Congressional

8 Delegation, and the Secretary of State and the presiding

9 officers of both Houses of the Legislatures of each of the

10 other States in the Union.
