## A BILL

## for

1	AN ACT relating to the legislature; providing for a
2	constituent service allowance; increasing the salary and
3	per diem paid to legislators as specified; providing an
4	appropriation; and providing for an effective date.

6	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:
7	
8	Section 1. W.S. 28-5-106 is created to read:
9	
10	28-5-106. Constituent service allowance.
11	
12	(a) There is created a constituent service allowance
13	account within the special revenue fund. All interest
14	earned on funds within this account shall be deposited in
15	the account. The legislative service office shall oversee
16	and provide reimbursement from the account.

1

2 (b) Each member of the legislature is entitled to 3 receive a constituent service allowance as provided under 4 this section. This allowance is intended to defray expenses 5 incurred by each member in providing service to and on behalf of their constituents, which services are 6 in 7 addition to attending sessions of the legislature, attending meetings of interim committees and engaging in 8 9 authorized interim work for which salary, per diem and 10 mileage is authorized by law. The allowance is subject to 11 the following:

13 (i) The allowance shall be paid quarterly from the constituent service allowance account upon submission 14 by the legislator to the legislative service office of a 15 16 claim form verifying that he is a member of the legislature 17 and thereby entitled to the allowance under this section. To the extent funds appropriated for purposes of this 18 section are not sufficient to pay vouchers, payment shall 19 20 be made on a proportional basis. Legislators may request 21 payment of less than the full amount of the allowance; 22

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2002 STATE OF WYOMING 02LSO-0168.E1 1 (ii) The allowance shall be four hundred fifty 2 dollars (\$450.00) per calendar quarter or fractional 3 portion thereof that the member is in office. 4 5 Section 2. W.S. 28-5-101(b), (d) and (e) and by creating a new subsection (f) is amended to read: 6 7 8 28-5-101. Schedule of compensation, per diem and 9 travel expenses. 10 11 (b) The amount to be received by each member of the 12 legislature for expenses is increased to forty-four dollars 13 (\$44.00) per day effective January 1, 1980, to sixty 14 dollars (\$60.00) per day effective January 1, 1983, and to eighty dollars (\$80.00) per day effective January 9, 1995 15 16 and to eighty-five dollars (\$85.00) per day effective 17 January 3, 2005. 18 (d) From and after January 1, 1985, each member of 19 20 the legislature shall receive seventy-five dollars (\$75.00) 21 per day as salary and thirty-five cents (\$.35) per mile for 22 necessary travel to attend and return from the legislature.

23 From and after January 9, 1995, each member of the 24 legislature shall receive one hundred twenty-five dollars

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1	(\$125.00) per day as salary in addition to the mileage rate
2	provided for in this subsection. From and after January 3,
3	2005, each member of the legislature shall receive one
4	hundred fifty dollars (\$150.00) per day as salary in
5	addition to the mileage rate provided for in this
6	subsection.

8	(e) During the interim each member of the legislature
9	shall be paid the following amounts, subject to subsection
10	(f) of this section:
11	
12	<u>(i) T</u> he full daily statutory salary for <del>only the</del>
13	four (4) days during which per month for each month the
14	legislature is not in session;
15	
16	(ii) The full daily statutory salary for each
17	day the member is engaged in work for the management
18	council, a standing committee, interim committee, select
19	committee or a committee authorized by law;-
20	
21	(iii) One-half (1/2) the full daily statutory
22	salary for each day the member is engaged in work for the
23	management council, a standing committee, interim
24	committee, select committee or a committee authorized by

1 law to allow the member to prepare for the interim 2 activity;

3

4 (iv) The member shall be paid Full daily 5 statutory per diem for each day during which he travels to engage in, return from or engages in an interim activity 6 7 for which he is entitled to receive salary under paragraph (ii) of this subsection, or an activity approved by the 8 9 management council or the chairman of an interim committee 10 of which he is a member; - and

11

12 (v) The member shall be paid Statutory mileage 13 for necessary travel to attend and return from an approved 14 interim activity.

15

16 (f) Notwithstanding subsection (e) of this section, 17 no member of the legislature shall receive a salary in any month the legislature is not in session in excess of the 18 19 amount equal to the full daily statutory salary multiplied 20 by the number of days in that month.

Section 3. There is appropriated one hundred sixty-22 two thousand dollars (\$162,000.00) from the general fund to 23 the constituent service allowance account created under 24

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W.S. 28-5-106(a). For purposes of this act for the fiscal 1 2 year beginning July 1, 2002. 3 Section 4. 4 5 (a) Sections 1 and 3 of this act are effective July 6 7 1, 2002. 8 (b) Section 2 of this act is effective January 3, 9 10 2005. 11 12 (END)
