A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to rabies management; authorizing the
- 2 animal damage management board to manage rabid wildlife;
- 3 providing an appropriation; and providing for an effective
- 4 date.

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6 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 8 **Section 1.** W.S. 11-6-304(a), (b)(ii), (iv) through
- 9 (vi) and (d) and 11-6-306(c) are amended to read:

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- 11 11-6-304. ADMB responsibilities; animal damage
- 12 management policy; rules; methods to manage predatory
- 13 animals, predacious birds, depredating animals and rabid
- 14 wildlife; manner of calling meetings; frequency.

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1	(a) The ADMB is responsible for the formulation of
2	the damage prevention management policy of the state, and
3	by and through an executed memorandum of understanding
4	(MOU) with the Wyoming game and fish commission is
5	responsible for management of rabid wildlife, crop,
6	livestock and wildlife damage done by depredating animals
7	and wildlife damage by predatory animals and predacious
8	birds. The ADMB in conjunction with its responsibility may,
9	consistent with the Wyoming Administrative Procedures
10	Procedure Act adopt rules to implement policies
11	administered by the ADMB. After consultation with the
12	livestock board, the ADMB shall promulgate rules pertaining
13	to rabies prevention in wildlife including surveillance,
14	public education, vaccination protocol, post-exposure
15	procedures and quarantines. The ADMB may enter into the
16	agreements with law enforcing agencies to carry out the
17	quarantine provisions. Nothing in this article shall
18	preempt the Wyoming game and fish commission authority to
19	manage wildlife or determine damage pursuant to any
20	provision in title 23.

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22 (b) In its deliberations the ADMB shall:

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1 (ii) Specify programs designed to prevent dam

2 by predatory animals, rabid wildlife, predacious birds and

3 depredating animals to livestock, agricultural crops,

4 wildlife, property, human health and safety;

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6 (iv) Specify methods for the prevention and

7 management of damage and for the selective control of

8 predatory animals, rabid wildlife, predacious birds and

9 depredating animals;

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11 (v) Maintain responsibility and appropriate

12 funds for the purpose of providing damage prevention and

13 management to agricultural livestock and crops, wildlife,

14 property $_{\tau}$ and human health and safety caused by predatory

15 animals, rabid wildlife, predacious birds and depredating

16 animals;

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18 (vi) Cooperate with federal, state and county

19 governments, educational institutions and private persons

20 or organizations to effectuate agricultural and wildlife

21 damage and rabid wildlife prevention policies;

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23 (d) The ADMB may adopt rules and regulations

24 necessary for carrying out the purpose and provisions of

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1 this article. The ADMB may appoint employees and assistants

2 as necessary and fix their compensation. The ADMB may enter

3 into cooperative agreements with boards of county

4 commissioners, predatory animal control districts, federal

5 or state agencies or other commissions, organizations or

6 associations for the purpose of managing predatory animals,

7 rabid wildlife, predacious birds and depredating animals.

8 Predatory animal control district boards which choose not

9 to enter into a cooperative agreement with the ADMB shall

10 not be precluded from continuing with, or entering into, a

11 cooperative agreement or memorandum of understanding with

12 the United States department of agriculture, animal and

13 plant health inspection service, wildlife services

14 (USDA/APHIS/WS), other entities of government,

15 organizations or associations. This act is not intended and

16 shall not replace, rescind, modify nor cancel cooperative

17 agreements or cooperative service agreements between the

18 USDA/APHIS/WS and the county predatory animal districts

19 created under W.S. 11-6-201 through 11-6-210.

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21 11-6-306. Animal damage management account.

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23 (c) Any supplemental contributions received by the

24 department from livestock owners for predatory animal,

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- 2 programs or the prevention and management of rabid wildlife
- 3 shall be deposited into the animal damage management
- 4 account.

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- 6 Section 2. There is appropriated to the animal damage
- management board created by W.S. 11-6-303, two hundred 7
- thirty thousand dollars (\$230,000.00) from the general fund 8
- for the biennium beginning July 1, 2002, to be distributed 9
- to county predatory advisory boards to develop and 10
- implement a rabies management program in each county of the 11
- 12 state.

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14 Section 3. This act is effective July 1, 2002.
