STATE OF WYOMING

1 (a) There is created a prescription drug assistance program to assist residents of the state. The program shall 2 3 be a state funded program to provide prescription drug 4 assistance, in addition to the services provided under the 5 Wyoming Medical Assistance and Services Act. Effective July 1, 2002, the prescription drug assistance program shall 6 minimum medical program. Eligibility for 7 replace the assistance under the program created by this section shall 8 9 not constitute an entitlement and services shall be provided under this section only to the extent funds are 10 11 available.

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13 (b) Residents of the state may apply for the prescription drug assistance program in the manner provided 14 in W.S. 42-4-106. Upon a determination of eligibility, the 15 applicant remains eligible for assistance 16 under the 17 prescription drug assistance program as provided in this section. If a recipient ceases to be a resident of the 18 state, his eligibility under the program shall terminate. 19 20 The department shall by rule and regulation establish 21 income eligibility guidelines no later than July 1 of each year based on the federal poverty levels in effect on 22 23 January 1 of such calendar year. Persons with family income of one hundred percent (100%) of the federal poverty level 24

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1 or less shall be eligible under this section. The rules 2 shall take into consideration family size up to four (4) 3 individuals. Eligibility for families consisting of more 4 than four (4) individuals shall be determined on the basis 5 of the income of a family of four (4) individuals. Persons eligible for prescription drug assistance under other state 6 7 or federal programs, except the state high risk health insurance pool, shall be ineligible for assistance under 8 9 the prescription drug assistance program.

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11 (c) Except as provided by this subsection, an 12 eligibility determination made under subsection (b) of this 13 section shall be valid for one (1) year. A recipient whose 14 monthly income changes by more than one-third (1/3), shall report the change in income to the department. Such 15 recipient is entitled to a redetermination if his income 16 17 has declined and may, at the option of the department, be subject to a redetermination if his income has increased. 18

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20 (d) A recipient shall be required to pay a 21 copayment per prescription of ten dollars (\$10.00) for 22 generic drugs and twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) for brand 23 name drugs.

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(e) The department shall project costs of the program 1 2 created by this section at least quarterly and compare 3 those projected costs against the funds appropriated for 4 the program. If the funds available to the program are 5 insufficient to meet the projected costs of the program, the department shall take action to prevent the program 6 7 from incurring costs beyond available funds, including taking any of the following actions: 8 9 10 Imposing a moratorium on new enrollments in (i) 11 the program; 12 13 (ii) Reducing the gross family income eligibility level specified in subsection (b) of this 14 15 section; 16 17 (iii) Imposing higher prescription drug copayments not to exceed twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) per 18 prescription; 19 20 21 (iv) Eliminating specified drugs from 22 eligibility under the program; 23

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(v) Carrying claims for payment into the next 1 2 biennium if the amount of claims are less than one twenty-3 fourth (1/24) of the appropriation that has been enacted 4 for the next biennium.

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6 (f) Only prescription drugs that are medically 7 necessary and cost effective are reimbursable under the program created by this section. In determining which drugs 8 9 are reimbursable the department shall consult with the drug utilization review board for Wyoming established pursuant 10 11 to Title XIX of the federal Social Security Act.

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13 Section 2. This act is effective immediately upon completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law 14 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming 15 Constitution. 16
