A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to public school performance and graduation
- 2 standards; modifying requirements for graduation as
- 3 specified; imposing different types of student proficiency
- 4 with respect to performance standards; imposing assessment
- 5 duties upon school districts; conforming statutory
- 6 provisions accordingly; clarifying duties of the state
- 7 board of education; and providing for an effective date.

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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 11 Section 1. W.S. 21-2-202(c), 21-2-304(a)(iii), (iv)
- 12 and (v), (b)(ii) and (c), 21-3-110(a) by creating new
- 13 paragraphs (xxiv) and (xxv), 21-3-308(g),
- 14 21-9-101(b) (intro) and 21-13-101(a) (v) are amended to read:

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16 **21-2-202.** Duties of the state superintendent.

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1 (c) In addition to subsection (a) of this section,

2 the state superintendent may take appropriate

3 administrative action with the state board as necessary,

4 including but not limited to the changing of accreditation

5 status, against any school district or state institution

failing to comply with any applicable law or with the 6

uniform educational program standards specified under W.S. 7

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21-2-304. Duties of the state board of education. 11

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13 (a) The state board of education shall:

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15 (iii) By rule and regulation and in consultation and coordination with local school districts, prescribe 16 17 uniform student content and performance standards for the common core of knowledge and the common core of skills 18 specified under W.S. 21-9-101(b), and promulgate uniform 19 20 standards for programs addressing the special needs of 21 student populations specified under W.S. 21-9-101(c) that 22 ensure these student populations are provided the opportunity to learn the common core knowledge and skills 23 24 as prescribed by the uniform student content and

1	performance standards pursuant to this paragraph. Student

3	paragraph shall include standards for graduation from any
4	high school within any school district of this state based

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(iv) Establish, in consultation with local 7 school districts, through testing or other means, a 8 9 requirement requirements for each student to demonstrate 10 mastery of the common core of knowledge and skills in order 11 students to earn a high school diploma; as measured by each district's body of evidence assessment system prescribed by 12 rule and regulation of the state board and required under 13 14 W.S. 21-3-110(a)(xxii). A high school diploma shall provide for one (1) of the following endorsements which shall be 15 16 stated on the transcript of each student:

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(A) Advanced endorsement which requires a student to demonstrate advanced performance in a majority of the areas of the common core of knowledge and skills specified under W.S. 21-9-101(b) and proficient performance in the remaining areas of the specified common core of knowledge and skills, as defined by the uniform student

18	section.
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20	(v) Through the state superintendent and in
21	consultation and coordination with local school districts,
22	implement a statewide assessment system for measuring
23	student progress based upon uniform educational program and
24	student <u>content and</u> performance standards imposed by law

1 and by board rule and regulation. The assessment system 2 shall be administered at appropriate levels at specified 3 and at appropriate intervals aligned to the 4 standards. The assessment system shall be aligned to the 5 statewide educational program standards, shall specifically student performance in reading, writing 6 assess mathematics at grades four (4), eight (8) and eleven (11) 7 and may measure the other common core of knowledge and 8 9 skills established under W.S. 21-9-101(b) which can be 10 quantified. The assessment results will be used 11 conjunction with a school district's annual assessment to 12 educational strategies for design improvement and 13 enhancement of student performance. This design 14 improvement shall be part of each district's school improvement plan. In consultation and coordination with 15 school districts, the board shall review and evaluate the 16 17 assessment system regularly and based upon uniform statewide reports from each district, annually report to 18 the legislature on student performance at specified grade 19 20 levels and on school improvement plans.

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11 Section 2. This act is effective immediately upon 12 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming 13 14 Constitution.
