A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to public schools; establishing a task 2 force to develop a statewide accountability process and 3 system for public schools; specifying membership; imposing 4 system criteria; providing for transitional accountability; 5 providing an appropriation; and providing for an effective 6 date.

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8 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 9

10 Section 1.

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12 (a) A statewide task force is created to assist the 13 state department of education in carrying out the 14 requirements of this section. The department in 15 consultation with the task force, shall investigate,

1 assemble and recommend necessary accountability processes 2 and systems to assist state efforts in addressing education 3 accountability requirements of the federal No Child Left 4 Behind Act of 2001 (NCLB), while maintaining uniformity and 5 quality of the statewide education program standards and state student content and performance standards as required 6 under W.S. 21-2-304. Recommendations under this subsection 7 shall specify a plan to implement sufficient accountability 8 9 processes and systems to enable the implementation of 10 rewards and sanctions as specified by the federal NCLB Act based on the educational performance and progress of each 11 12 school district and each school within a district.

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(b) The state superintendent of public instruction shall not later than April 1, 2003, appoint members to the task force providing for representation by the following participants in the education process:

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19 (i) School district administration personnel;
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21 (ii) Classroom teachers;

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23 (iii) Special education programs for children 24 with disabilities;

1 2 (iv) School board members; 3 4 (v) Business and industry; 5 (vi) Taxpayers; 6 7 8 (vii) Parents; 9 10 (viii) Legislators. 11 Recommendations developed under subsection (a) of 12 (C) this section shall: 13 14 15 (i) Integrate federal and state accountability requirements which shall be based upon the statewide 16 17 student assessment system established under W.S. 21-2-304(a)(v), statewide education program standards and 18 19 student content and performance standards; 20 21 (ii) Develop a system of rewards and sanctions applicable to all schools and school districts which is 22 23 consistent with school accountability and school improvement provisions specified by the federal NCLB Act 24 3

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and which requires corrective action for those schools not 1 2 meeting established progress levels; 3 4 (iii) Specify a level for and measure annual 5 progress of schools and school districts, including all schools receiving state assistance; 6 7 (iv) Be developed in sufficient time 8 for 9 implementation in the 2004-2005 school year. 10 11 (d) On or before August 1, 2003, the state department shall report its findings and recommendations developed 12 under this section to the joint education interim 13 14 committee. Following its review and approval, the committee shall present recommendations including any 15 necessary enabling legislation, to the legislature at the 16 17 2004 budget session.

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19 school year 2003-2004 and prior (e) For to 20 implementation of the recommendations developed under this 21 section for implementation during school year 2004-2005, 22 and as necessary to comply with the federal NCLB Act, the state department shall, in consultation with the task force 23 established by this section, establish a transitional plan 24

to provide a temporary system of rewards and sanctions for 1 2 all schools and school districts. Prior to implementation, 3 the transitional plan shall be presented to the joint 4 education interim committee on or before November 1, 2003. 5 The transitional plan shall terminate upon expiration of the 2003-2004 school year. 6

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(f) One hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000.00) is 8 9 appropriated from the general fund to the state department 10 of education to implement this section.

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Section 2. Rewards and sanctions imposed under the 12 federal No Child Left Behind Act of 2001 shall apply only 13 to those schools receiving federal Title I funds until the 14 processes and systems developed under section 1 of this act 15 16 are implemented and operational.

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18 Section 3. This act is effective immediately upon completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law 19 20 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming 21 Constitution.
