8 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

12 (a) Thirty-six thousand dollars (\$36,000.00) is

13 appropriated from the general fund to the state

14 superintendent of public instruction for the establishment

15 of advisory groups necessary to assist the state department

1 of education with establishing policies and procedures 2 governing education information reporting and collection, 3 including the development of data collection instruments, 4 use and description of data within education reports, and 5 other data needs, requirements and issues. The advisory groups required under subsection (b) of this section shall 6 be established by not later than April 1, 2003. On or 7 before November 30, 2003, the state superintendent shall 8 9 report to the joint education interim committee 10 education information policies and procedures 11 recommendations for future education information reporting 12 and the use of advisory groups in this process. 13 (b) In addition to the school data advisory group 14 established under W.S. 21-2-203(b), advisory groups shall 15 16 be established in the following data areas: 17 18 Student data/demographics; (i) 19

meeting expenses and any consulting expertise required by 3
