A BILL

for AN ACT relating to mines and minerals; providing for 1 suspension of certificates and temporary permits issued by 2 the mining council; specifying complaint requirements and 3 4 authority to dismiss complaints without hearing; and providing for an effective date. 5 6 7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 8 Section 1. W.S. 30-2-311(a) is amended to read: 9 10 11 30-2-311. Revocation of certificate after notice and 12 hearing; suspension; reexamination; revocation of certificate of inspector or deputy; filing of certificate. 13

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(a) Any certificate issued by the council or temporary 1 permit issued by the inspector may be suspended or revoked 2 by the council after hearing under W.S. 16-3-101 through 3 4 16-3-115 for violation of this act or rules and regulations 5 promulgated under this act, intoxication while in duty status, mental disabilities or neglect of duty. Except as 6 7 otherwise provided, the council may revoke or suspend a certificate or temporary permit only after a hearing in 8 9 accordance with the Wyoming Administrative Procedure Act. 10 Provided, the council may suspend any certificate or 11 temporary permit pending further investigation and a 12 hearing, for actions that pose a serious threat to the health and safety of miners. The council shall establish 13 14 by rule a time limit after the alleged date of an incident as provided in this subsection within which a complaint 15 16 shall be filed. All complaints shall be verified and 17 otherwise filed in accordance with the rules and regulations promulgated by the council. The council or 18 19 designated members of the council may, after reviewing the 20 complaint and conducting any investigation deemed 21 necessary, determine that the grounds alleged do not 22 warrant suspension or revocation and dismiss the complaint without hearing. No person whose certificate has been 23 24 revoked under this section for less than ninety (90) days

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1	shall be examined by the council. No person whose
2	certificate has been revoked under this section shall be
3	reissued a certificate unless the council finds the
4	incapacity, if any, on which the revocation was based has
5	ceased to exist.
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7	Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2003.

11	W. S. § 30-2-311(a), page 2-line 10 - added language to enable the Council to
12	suspend a certificate or permit when a threat to the health and safety of miners is
13	evident. The current statutory language requires a hearing prior to any action
14	being taken. Page 2-line 16 - The Council's intent is to discourage frivolous
15	complaints due to the time and cost involved in processing those complaints.
