A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to state parks; providing for special
- 2 events at state parks, recreation areas, archeological
- 3 sites and historic sites; providing for a waiver of permit
- 4 fees for special events; providing for a separate fee for
- 5 special events; providing for the deposit, appropriation
- 6 and use of fees; and providing for an effective date.

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8 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 10 **Section 1.** W.S. 36-4-121(a) (xiii) and by creating a
- 11 new subsection (n) is amended to read:

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- 36-4-121. Permits to use state parks, recreation
- 14 areas and historic sites.

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1 (a) The department of state parks and cultural 2 resources shall offer for sale permits that allow use of 3 the state parks, recreation areas, archeological sites and 4 historic sites. Daily use permits shall be required at 5 Glendo, Guernsey, Curt Gowdy, Edness Kimball Wilkins, Buffalo Bill, Boysen, Seminoe and Keyhole state parks and 6 Fort Bridger, South Pass City, Trail End, Fort Fetterman 7 and Fort Phil Kearney state historic sites, and Hawk 8 9 Springs state recreation area. The department may 10 establish voluntary pay stations at Bear River and Hot 11 Springs state parks to allow users of those parks to make 12 voluntary contributions for the use of the state parks. 13 Persons who enter or use Bear River or Hot Springs state 14 park without paying daily use fees shall not be subject to the penalties provided for in subsection (j) of this 15 16 section. Overnight camping permits shall be required at 17 Boysen, Buffalo Bill, Curt Gowdy, Glendo, Guernsey, Keyhole, Seminoe and Sinks Canyon state parks, Connor 18 Battlefield state historic site, Medicine Lodge state 19 20 archeological site and Hawk Springs state recreation area 21 by the department during the entire calendar year. The cost 22 of the permits authorized under this section shall be:

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1 (xiii) Upon written request of a group 2 sponsoring a special event or upon the department's 3 sponsorship of a special event, the director of the 4 department may, with the approval of the parks and cultural 5 resources commission, waive any fees required under this subsection. A fee which may exceed the daily use permit 6 7 fee specified in this section may be charged for entry to special events. Holders of annual bucking horse daily or 8 9 overnight permits may be charged the special event fee. No 10 special event fee shall be charged at any park, area or 11 site unless a daily use fee has been established by law;

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The department is authorized to sponsor special events and to contract with groups sponsoring special events at state parks, recreation areas, archeological sites or historic sites. A special event fee may be charged as provided in paragraph (a) (xiii) of this section. All funds received from special event fees shall be deposited in a special events account within the enterprise fund. The funds deposited within the account are continuously appropriated to and may be expended by the department to conduct special events directly or pursuant to contracts entered under this subsection.
