7	Section 1. W.S. 5-1-110(a)(i) is amended to read:

11	(a) Subject to constitutional and statutory

13	judges of the supreme court, district courts and circuit
14	courts shall receive the following annual salaries which
15	shall be paid in equal monthly installments on the last

4	(b) There is appropriated from the general fund for
5	the period beginning January 7, 2003 through June 30, 2004,
6	to the Natrona county district attorney's office and to the
7	Laramie county district attorney's office thirty-six
8	thousand six hundred ninety dollars (\$36,690.00) each, to
9	implement salary increases for district attorneys resulting
10	from the salary formula established under this act.

12	Section 4. This act is effective July 1, 2002.
