2	prohibiting a vote by a legislator on any bill from which
3	he may receive a benefit; and providing for an effective

6	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:
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8	Section 1. W.S. 9-13-102(a) by creating a new
9	paragraph (xviii) and 9-13-106(a) are amended to read:
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11	9-13-102. Definitions.

13	(a) As used in this article:
14	
15	(xviii) "Political subdivision" includes any
16	county, city, town, school district, community college

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1 district, hospital district, water conservancy district, 2 cemetery district, fire protection district, or any other 3 political subdivision of the state constituting a body 4 corporate, whether incorporated under general act, special 5 charter, or otherwise. 6 9-13-106. Official decisions and votes. 7 8 9 (a) A public official, public member or public 10 employee shall not make an official decision or vote on an 11 official decision if the public official, public member or public employee has a personal or private interest in the 12 13 matter. In determining whether he has a personal or private 14 interest in a matter the public official shall recognize the importance of his right to represent his constituency 15 and shall abstain from voting only in clear cases of a 16 17 personal or private interest as defined in this subsection

18 <u>section</u>. A public official or public member shall not vote 19 to give money or any direct financial benefit to himself 20 except for tax reductions affecting the general public. For 21 the purposes of this section, a personal or private 22 interest:

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(i) Is, with respect to the public official, 1 2 public employee or public member, an interest which is 3 direct and immediate as opposed to speculative and remote; 4 and 5 6 (ii) Is an interest that provides the public 7 official, public employee or public member, a greater benefit or a lesser detriment than it does for a large or 8 9 substantial group or class of persons who are similarly 10 situated; - and 11 12 (iii) For a legislator who is an employee of any 13 political subdivision, exists and is clear, notwithstanding 14 paragraphs (i) and (ii) of this subsection, if as an employee of the political subdivision the legislator may 15 16 personally benefit from: 17 18 (A) Any salary or benefit increase 19 resulting from any bill; or 20 21 (B) Any new position or program created by 22 any bill. 23
