1	AN ACT relating to radiologic technologist licensing;
2	modifying the composition of the board of radiologic
3	technologists examiners; modifying license requirements;
4	modifying license renewal requirements; amending the
5	board's disciplinary authority; and providing for an
6	effective date.

8	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:
9	
10	Section 1. W.S. 33-37-102(d)(i), 33-37-103(a), (b)(i),
11	(ii) and by creating a new subsection (c), 33-37-104,
12	33-37-106(a), 33-37-107(a) and (b), 33-37-108(a),
13	33-37-110(b) and (c) and 33-37-111(a)(intro), by creating a
14	new paragraph (vi) and (b) are amended to read:
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16	33-37-102. Acceptable practices.
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1	(d) This act does not apply to:
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3	(i) Licensed practitioners and properly
4	certified physician assistants and properly licensed
5	advanced practice nurses qualifying under rules and
6	regulations of the state board of nursing as defined in
7	<u>W.S. 33-37-101(a)(iv)</u> ;
8	
9	33-37-103. Board of radiologic technologists
10	examiners; composition; terms; removal.
11	
12	(a) The board of radiologic technologists examiners
13	is created. The board shall consist of $\frac{\text{three}}{(3)}$ five (5)
14	members who are citizens of the United States and residents
15	of Wyoming appointed by the governor. One (1) member <u>Three</u>
16	(3) members shall be a radiologic technologist
17	technologists who is are registered or who possesses
18	possess suitable equivalent qualifications, one (1) member
19	shall be a licensed practitioner person licensed or
20	otherwise authorized by law to practice medicine
21	specialized in radiology and one (1) member shall be from
22	the general public. Vacancies in unexpired terms shall be
23	filled by the governor for the remainder of the term. The

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governor may remove any board member as provided in W.S. 1 2 9-1-202. 3 4 (b) The terms for each member are: 5 (i) One (1) Three (3) radiologic technologist 6 7 technologists for one (1) year two (2) years; 8 9 (ii) One (1) licensed practitioner person 10 licensed or otherwise authorized to practice medicine in 11 radiology for three (3) years; 12 13 (c) The board shall adopt rules to carry out the 14 provisions of this act. 15 16 33-37-104. Meetings; quorum. 17 The board shall meet quarterly and elect a chairman at the 18 first meeting of each year. Two (2) Three (3) board members 19 20 constitute a quorum. 21 33-37-106. Applicants; qualifications. 22 23

1	(a) The board shall grant a license to an applicant
2	who is at least eighteen (18) years of age <mark>,</mark> and who has
3	completed a course of study in radiologic technology
4	approved by the board or has otherwise met the requirements
5	of this act and provides satisfactory evidence to the board
6	of fitness to perform duties of a radiologic technologist.
7	
8	33-37-107. Examinations; fees.
9	
10	(a) The board shall establish <u>procure</u> examinations
11	for each class of license restricted licenses.
12	
13	(b) The board shall administer examinations at
14	<u>regular</u> intervals of not less than six (6) months <u>as</u>
15	established by rules.
16	
17	33-37-108. Licenses.
18	
19	(a) The board shall issue a license to each applicant
20	who meets the requirements of this act and the rules and
21	regulations promulgated by the board.
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23	33-37-110. Expiration of license; renewal.
24	

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1	(b) All licenses issued pursuant to this act with the
2	exception of a special license shall be renewed by the
3	board provided that the licensee has conformed with the
4	provisions of this act and submits a renewal fee in an
5	amount established by the board pursuant to W.S. 33-1-201 $_{\underline{\prime}}$.
6	and provided as follows:
7	
8	(i) Upon renewal, each person licensed by the
9	board as a radiologic technologist shall provide proof that
10	he has completed twenty-four (24) credit hours of
11	continuing education credit based upon the national
12	standards of the American Registry of Radiologic
13	Technologists;
14	
15	(ii) Upon renewal, each person licensed by the
16	board as a radiologic technician shall provide proof that
17	he has completed six (6) credit hours of continuing
18	education credit based upon the national standards of the
19	American Registry of Radiologic Technologists.
20	
21	(c) A radiologic technologist who has been licensed
22	in Wyoming, whose license has not been revoked or suspended
23	and who has ceased activities as a radiologic technologist

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for not more than eighteen (18) months, may apply for a 1 2 license and be evaluated by the board. 3 4 33-37-111. Discipline; proceedings; grounds. 5 (a) A person licensed pursuant to this act may have 6 7 his license revoked, suspended, restricted, censured or placed on probation by the board for any of the following 8 9 causes: 10 11 (vi) Violation of this act. 12 13 (b) All complaints alleging a violation under 14 paragraphs (a) (i) through $\frac{(v)}{(v)}$ (vi) of this section shall be in writing, verified by some party familiar with the facts 15 16 charged and shall be filed with the board. Upon receiving 17 the complaint, the board if it determines the complaint sufficient, shall proceed as in a contested case under the 18 Wyoming Administrative Procedure Act. Upon revocation 19 20 discipline of any license, the fact shall be noted upon the 21 records of the board and the license shall be returned to 22 the board and marked cancelled upon the date of its revocation licensee, the board shall notify the appropriate 23

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1	agencies and make other reports as required by law, rules
2	and regulations.
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4	Section 2. W.S. 33-37-105 is repealed.
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6	Section 3. Notwithstanding W.S. 33-37-103(b)(i), one
7	(1) of the additional radiologic technologists appointed to
8	the board of radiologic technologists under this act shall
9	be appointed for an initial term of three (3) years.
10	Thereafter all terms under W.S. 33-37-103(b)(i) shall be
11	for two (2) year terms.
12	
13	Section 4. This act is effective July 1, 2002.
