A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to game and fish; consolidating various
- 2 accounts within the game and fish fund into a wildlife
- 3 legacy trust account; providing additional funding for the
- 4 account; specifying use of funds; specifying legislative
- 5 findings and intent; and providing for an effective date.

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7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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9 **Section 1.** W.S. 23-1-504 is created to read:

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- 23-1-504. Wildlife legacy trust expenditures;
- 12 purposes.

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- 14 (a) Revenues deposited into the Wyoming wildlife
- 15 legacy trust income account established under W.S.

1 23-1-501(f) shall be available for expenditure by the

2 commission:

3

4 (i) For wildlife habitat improvement. To further

5 this goal the commission and department shall work with

6 individuals, communities and industry to improve and

7 conserve existing habitat and minimize and mitigate the

8 effect of development on habitat. No expenditure shall be

9 made from the trust income account to purchase or acquire

10 any interest in real property;

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12 (ii) For gathering information and other

13 necessary work related to species which are likely

14 potential candidates for listing under the federal

15 Endangered Species Act. As directed by the commission, the

16 department shall collect biological information on these

17 species and enhance their habitats when necessary to help

18 ensure their future under state management authority and

19 eliminate the need for listing and recovery programs under

20 the federal Endangered Species Act;

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22 (iii) Address human-wildlife conflicts

23 associated with increased development. To accomplish this

24 goal the commission and department shall work with

- 1 communities and industry to minimize human-wildlife
- 2 conflicts associated with increased residential and
- 3 industrial development and demand for wildlife associated
- 4 recreation;

- 6 (iv) To promote the enjoyment of wildlife,
- 7 including the nonconsumptive use of wildlife;

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- 9 (v) To promote the maintenance and growth of the
- 10 Wyoming wildlife legacy trust account through additional
- 11 long term, sustainable funding sources for the account;

- 13 (vi) To make payments in accordance with W.S.
- 14 23-1-901, for property damage caused by trophy game
- 15 animals.

- 17 **Section 2.** W.S. 9-4-601(b)(i)(intro), (iv) and by
- 18 creating a new paragraph (v), 23-1-302(a)(xxviii),
- 19 23-1-501(f), 23-2-101 by creating a new subsection (n) and
- 20 23-2-201 by creating a new subsection (f) are amended to
- 21 read:

- 23 9-4-601. Distribution and use; funds, accounts,
- 24 cities and towns benefited; exception for bonus payments.

2 (b) The state treasurer shall ascertain and withhold 3 all bonus payments received from the federal government 4 attributable to coal, oil shale or geothermal leases of 5 federal land within Wyoming and shall distribute it as follows: 6 7 (i) Fifty percent (50%), the first seven million 8 9 five hundred thousand dollars (\$7,500,000.00) of which 10 shall be distributed as follows, but for the fiscal year 11 beginning July 1, 2002 and ending June 30, 2003 any amount 12 in excess of seven million five hundred thousand dollars 13 (\$7,500,000.00) shall be deposited in the Wyoming wildlife 14 legacy trust account established under W.S. 23-1-501(f), and thereafter any amount in excess of seven million five 15 16 hundred thousand dollars (\$7,500,000.00) per year shall be 17 deposited into the school capital construction account established under W.S. 21-15-111(a)(i): 18 19 20 (iv) For the fiscal year commencing July 1, 21 1994, and for each fiscal year thereafter And: 22

23 Ten percent (10%) but not to exceed one (A) 24 million six hundred thousand dollars (\$1,600,000.00) per

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- 1 year, to an earmarked revenue fund account which may be
- 2 expended by the community college commission in accordance
- 3 with and in addition to appropriations available under W.S.
- 4 21-18-205(c). For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2002
- 5 and ending June 30, 2003, any amount in excess of one
- 6 million six hundred thousand dollars (\$1,600,000.00) shall
- 7 be deposited in the Wyoming wildlife legacy trust account
- 8 established under W.S. 23-1-501(f). Thereafter any amount
- 9 in excess of one million six hundred thousand dollars
- 10 (\$1,600,000.00) together with any unexpended revenues
- 11 within the account at the end of any biennial budget period
- 12 shall be credited to the school capital construction
- 13 account established under W.S. 21-15-111(a)(i);

- 15 (B) For the fiscal year beginning July 1,
- 16 2002 and ending June 30, 2003, forty percent (40%) to the
- 17 Wyoming wildlife legacy trust account established under
- 18 W.S. 23-1-501(f) and thereafter to the school capital
- 19 construction account established under W.S.
- $20 \quad 21-15-111(a)(i)$.

- 22 (v) Not more than twenty million dollars
- 23 (\$20,000,000.00) shall be distributed to the Wyoming
- 24 wildlife legacy trust account pursuant to this subsection.

- 1 To the extent this limitation would be exceeded under
- 2 provisions of paragraph (b)(i) and subparagraphs (iv)(A)
- 3 and (B) of this section, the excess amount shall be
- 4 distributed to the school capital construction account
- 5 established under W.S. 21-15-111(a)(i).

7 23-1-302. Powers and duties.

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9 (a) The commission is directed and empowered:

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- 11 (xxviii) To reject or to accept and expend for
- 12 purposes authorized under this section any and all gifts of
- 13 cash, stocks, bonds or any other form of monies. Gifts
- 14 shall be deposited and expended as provided in W.S.
- 15 23-1-501.

17 **23-1-501**. Game and fish fund.

- 19 (f) A trust account separate and apart from the trust
- 20 account established under subsection (d) of this section is
- 21 created within the Wyoming game and fish fund to be known
- 22 as the Wyoming wildlife legacy trust account. The trust
- 23 account shall consist of those funds appropriated or
- 24 designated to the trust account by law or by gift from

1 whatever source. Revenues collected from the sale of 2 licenses under W.S. 23-2-101(j)(vii) and 23-2-201(d)(viii) 3 and conservation stamps as provided by W.S. 4 23-2-306(a)(ii)(A) shall be deposited within the trust 5 account. Funds deposited within the trust account are intended to be inviolate and constitute a permanent or 6 7 perpetual trust account which shall be invested by the state treasurer as authorized under W.S. 9-4-711 and in a 8 9 manner to obtain the highest return possible consistent 10 with preservation of the account corpus. Any The state 11 treasurer shall credit annually to a Wyoming wildlife 12 legacy trust income account interest earned from investment 13 of the trust account corpus shall be credited by the state 14 treasurer into the Wyoming game and fish fund to up to an 15 amount equal to six percent (6%) of the balance of the 16 corpus at the beginning of the fiscal year. Earnings above 17 the six percent (6%) amount shall be retained in the corpus 18 of the trust account. Notwithstanding subsection (b) of 19 this section, funds within the trust income account shall 20 be expended by the commission only for purposes specified 21 under subsection (b) of this section W.S. 23-1-504.

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23-2-101. Fees; restrictions; nonresident application 1 2 fee; nonresident licenses; verification of residency 3 required. 4 5 (n) In addition to other fees under this section, persons applying for a license or tag under this section 6 may contribute any whole dollar amount to the Wyoming 7 wildlife legacy trust account. 8 9 10 23-2-201. Fees; restrictions; verification of residency required. 11 12 13 (f) In addition to other fees under this section, 14 persons applying for a license or tag under this section may contribute any whole dollar amount to the Wyoming 15 16 wildlife legacy trust account. 17 18 **Section 3.** W.S. 23-1-501(c) and (d) is repealed. 19 The legislature finds that Wyoming's 20 Section 4. 21 wildlife resources are invaluable to the people of the 22 state and our progeny. Wildlife resources can be renewable, 23 but those resources currently face a major crisis requiring additional funding to maintain their full potential to the 24

1 state. Current funding for wildlife resources is provided

2 nearly exclusively by hunting and fishing license fees. The

3 value of wildlife resources extends to all people of the

4 state and the resources should be supported by funding

5 attributable to both consumptive users and other people of

6 the state. The intent of the legislature is to use funds

7 from nonrenewable resources together with funding provided

8 by consumptive users to fulfill the potential of renewable

9 wildlife resources. In making expenditures from the Wyoming

10 wildlife legacy trust income account the game and fish

11 commission shall be guided by the provisions of law and the

12 principles enumerated within this section.

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14 Section 5. All funds within the accounts created by

15 W.S. 23-1-501(c), (d) and (f) as of June 30, 2002 shall be

16 transferred to the Wyoming wildlife legacy trust account

17 established under W.S. 23-1-501(f).

19 Section 6. This act is effective July 1, 2002.
