5 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

- 7 **Section 1.** W.S. 14-3-107(a) and (c) is amended to
- 8 read:

- 10 14-3-107. Tattooing or body-piercing of persons who
- 11 have not reached the age of majority; penalties;
- 12 **definitions**.

- 14 (a) No person shall knowingly perform a body-piercing
- or place a tattoo upon or under the skin of a person who
- 16 has not reached the age of majority, except with the
- 17 consent of the person's parent or legal guardian who is

1 present at the time the body-piercing or tattoo procedure 2 is performed upon the person. The tattooist person 3 performing the body-piercing or tattoo procedure shall 4 demand proof of age prior to administering a tattoo the 5 procedure upon the person. A motor vehicle driver's license, a registration card issued under the federal 6 Selective Service Act, an identification card issued to a 7 member of the armed forces, a valid United States passport 8 9 or an identification card issued by the department of transportation is prima facie evidence of the age and 10 11 identity of the person. Proof that the tattooist person performing the body-piercing or tattoo procedure demanded, 12 13 was shown and acted in reasonable reliance upon the 14 information contained in any one (1) of the above documents as identification and proof of age is a defense to any 15 16 criminal prosecution under this section.

20 (i) "Tattoo" means any indelible design, letter,
21 scroll, figure, symbol or any other mark placed upon or
22 under the skin with ink or colors, by the aid of needles or
23 other instruments;

1 (ii) "Body piercing" means the perforation of
2 any human body part to create a permanent hole for cosmetic
3 purposes.

5 Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2002.
