12 **Section 1.** Definitions.

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14 (a) As used in this act:

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- 16 (i) "Commission" means the Wyoming water
- 17 development commission created by W.S. 41-2-117;

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(ii) "Hold project" means a project which has 2 had a previous legislative funding authorization for a 3 study at the same level authorized by this act, but has 4 5 been placed on hold status as a result of outstanding issues which warrant limiting future expenditures until the 6 issues are resolved. Hold status serves to document 7 commission or sponsor interest in a project subject to 8 9 resolution of issues; 10 (iii) "Water development account I" means the 11 account created by W.S. 41-2-124(a)(i); 12 13 14 (iv) "Water development account II" means the 15 account created by W.S. 41-2-124(a)(ii). 16 [AUTHORIZED LEVEL I AND LEVEL II STUDIES] 17 18 19 LEVEL I RECONNAISSANCE STUDIES - NEW Section 2. DEVELOPMENT. The following sums of money are appropriated 20 21 from water development account I to the commission to be 22 expended to conduct the following reconnaissance studies as defined in W.S. 41-2-114. Funds appropriated under this 23

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section for a particular project which are in excess of the

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1 actual amount necessary to complete the study may, subject

2 to the review of the select water committee, be expended by

the commission to complete the reconnaissance study for any 3

4 other project listed in this section. Appropriated funds

not expended prior to July 1, 2004, shall revert to water 5

development account I. The commission shall submit a report 6

7 to the legislature on each of the following studies prior

to the 2004 legislative session. 8

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- 25 1. The project sponsor for the Lake DeSmet Master Plan and
- 26 Reservoir Rehabilitation Plan shall execute a project

1 agreement with the commission which stipulates that the

2 cost of the study shall be repaid with interest at a rate

3 of seven and one-quarter percent (7.25%). Repayment of the

4 study is only required if the sponsor receives revenue from

5 a multi-year term water sales agreement for purchase of

6 Lake DeSmet water. Interest shall accrue upon execution of

7 a long-term contract. If the sponsor does not enter into a

8 long-term contract, the sponsor shall not be required to

9 pay for the study.

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11 Section 6. Contingent upon the availability of United

12 States Department of Interior, Bureau of Reclamation

13 matching funds, there is appropriated one hundred thousand

14 dollars (\$100,000.00) from water development account I to

15 the Wyoming water development office to meet the state's

16 proportionate share of the contract expense for the

17 conservation staff position for fiscal year 2003 and fiscal

18 year 2004.

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20 **Section 7.** W.S. 41-2-119 is amended to read:

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22 **41-2-119**. Groundwater studies.

The Wyoming water development commission may 1 (a) 2 grant not to exceed three million dollars (\$3,000,000.00) 3 four million five hundred thousand dollars (\$4,500,000.00) 4 to incorporated cities and towns, water and sewer districts 5 and improvement and service districts in Wyoming for exploration for and feasibility studies of the use of 6 7 underground water for municipal and rural domestic purposes, not to exceed two hundred thousand dollars 8 9 (\$200,000.00) four hundred thousand dollars (\$400,000.00) 10 for any one (1) exploration or study. The grants shall be 11 made from revenues from water development account I and 12 those revenues are hereby so appropriated. Any city or 13 town, water and sewer district or service and improvement 14 district receiving a grant pursuant to this section shall 15 provide at least ten percent (10%)—twenty-five percent 16 (25%) of the cost of the exploration or study from its own 17 funds. The commission shall adopt rules and regulations governing application procedures for the grants. 18

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(b) The commission may expend not to exceed one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00) from revenues from water development account I two million five hundred thousand dollars (\$2,500,000.00) from the funds appropriated under subsection (a) of this section for exploration and for

feasibility studies of the use of underground water for 1 2 municipal and rural domestic purposes subject to the 3 following conditions: 4 5 (i) The exploration or study shall be conducted in conjunction with an incorporated city or town, water and 6 7 sewer district or service and improvement district in Wyoming under an agreement; 8 9 10 (ii) Not more than two hundred thousand dollars 11 (\$200,000.00) four hundred thousand dollars (\$400,000.00) 12 in state funds shall be expended for any one (1) 13 exploration or study under this subsection; 14 15 (iii) The incorporated city or town, water and 16 sewer district or service and improvement district shall 17 provide at least twenty-five percent (25%) of the cost of the exploration or study from funds other than under this 18 19 subsection; 20 21 (iv) The incorporated city or town, water and 22 sewer district, or improvement and service district shall

apply for participation in this program under procedures

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1 established by rules and regulations adopted by the

2 commission.

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4 **Section 8.** This act is effective immediately upon

5 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law

6 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming

7 Constitution.
