1 (b) The secretary of state shall accept for 2 investigation purposes from an individual, either 3 personally or on behalf of an organization or governmental 4 body, a complaint in writing stating the name of the person 5 alleged to have committed a violation of this chapter setting forth the grounds for the complaint. 6 7 (c) If the secretary of state determines that a 8 9 complaint filed under subsection (b) of this section alleges facts sufficient to constitute a violation of this 10 11 chapter, the secretary of state shall determine whether to 12 investigate, act upon the complaint or certify his own acts 13 and records. 14 (d) The secretary of state shall adopt and enforce 15 16 rules and regulations to implement the provisions of this 17 chapter. 18 19 Section 2. 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(d) Each lobbyist activity report shall contain:

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3 (i) A listing of the lobbyist's sources of 4 funding, each loan, gift, gratuity, special discount or 5 hospitality paid or given, as defined by rules and regulations, to or on behalf of any legislator, state 6 7 elected official or state employee acting in his official capacity which exceeds fifty dollars (\$50.00) in value 8 9 identified by date, amount and the name of the legislator, 10 state elected official or state employee;-

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12 (ii) The date, location, name of the legislative 13 body invited and total expense incurred by each sponsoring 14 organization for special events, including receptions, 15 meals, entertainment, attendance at athletic events and 16 other functions, to which members of the legislature, of 17 either house of the legislature, of any committee of the legislature or any regional legislative delegation have 18 19 been invited; and

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21 (iii) A listing of total expenditures made by 22 the lobbyist and the lobbyist's employer on lobbying 23 activities including, but not limited to, salaries and 24 benefits, fees for professional and consulting services,

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1 telephone, postage, printing, copies, travel expenses, 2 meals, lodging, office equipment, rent, staff support and 3 advertising in any medium.

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5 (e) Special events, including receptions, meals, entertainment, attendance at athletic events and other 6 7 functions, to which members of the legislature, of either house of the legislature, of any committee of the 8 9 legislature or any regional legislative delegation have been invited shall be included in the report required under 10 this section. The total expenses of activities reported 11 12 pursuant to this subsection shall be reported by 13 event or function not by individual legislator. The report shall specify the group of legislators invited but is not 14 required to specify the names of individual legislators. 15 16 Informational publications and other printed materials used 17 for legislative purposes are not reportable under this 18 19 Section 3. W.S. 28-7-201(g) and (k) is repealed. 20 21 Section 4. This act is effective July 1, 2002. 22
