1	AN ACT relating to trade and commerce; making profiteering
2	an unlawful deceptive trade practice; specifying elements
3	of profiteering; providing criminal penalty; and providing

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6	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:
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8	Section 1. W.S. 40-12-115 is created to read:
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10	40-12-115. Profiteering.
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12	(a) Upon a declared state of emergency and for a
13	period of thirty (30) days following that declaration, it
14	is unlawful for any person to make an unreasonable profit
15	on essential consumer goods and services. As used in this
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2 (i) "Declared state of emergency" means а 3 proclamation by the President of the United States, the 4 governor, or the governing body of any city, town or county 5 in Wyoming declaring a state of emergency due to a natural or man-made disaster or emergency; 6 7 (ii) "Essential consumer goods and services" 8 9 means merchandise that is or will soon be in short supply, 10 including food, water, flashlights, radios, batteries, 11 candles, blankets, soap, diapers, temporary shelters, tape, toiletries, plywood, nails, hammers, medical supplies and 12 13 qasoline; 14 (iii) "Unreasonable profit" means a monetary 15 gain realized by an excessive and unjustified price 16 17 increase in a consumer transaction when a price: 18 19 (A) Is more than ten percent (10%) above 20 the price charged by that person for the merchandise 21 immediately prior to the declared state of emergency; and 22

(B) Cannot be proven to be directlyattributable to additional costs imposed on the person by

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1 the supplier of the goods or directly attributable to 2 additional costs for labor or materials used to provide the 3 services, provided that if the price is directly 4 attributable to additional costs imposed by the person's 5 supplier, the price represents no more than ten percent (10%) above the total cost to the person plus the markup 6 customarily applied by the person for that good or service 7 in the usual course of business immediately prior to the 8 9 onset of the declared state of emergency.

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(b) Any person who violates this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment for not more than six (6) months, a fine of not more than seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00), or both, for each offense. Each violation and each day on which the violation occurs or continues shall be a separate offense.
