15	37-2-401. Definitions.
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1 (a) As used in this article, unless the context 2 otherwise requires: 3 (i) "Residential consumer" 4 means a public 5 utility customer whose utility service is limited to his residence; 6 7 (ii) "Small business consumer" means a public 8 9 utility customer whose utility service is classified as a 10 small business user or a small commercial user pursuant to 11 a utility tariff established by the commission or a public 12 utility customer who is seeking such tariff status. 13 14 37-2-402. Office of consumer advocate; creation; 15 appointment. 16 17 There is hereby created within the office of the attorney general the office of consumer advocate. Assistant 18 19 attorneys general appointed by the attorney general shall 20 serve as legal staff for the office. The attorney general 21 also shall employ rate analysts and administrative and 22 clerical personnel necessary for operation of the office. 23

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37-2-403. Representation by office of consumer
advocate.

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4 (a) The office of consumer advocate shall promote the 5 best interest of the citizens of the state, and consistent 6 with that interest, obtain the lowest reasonable public 7 utility rates for residential and small business consumers. 8

9 In exercising discretion whether or not to appear (b) in a proceeding, the office of consumer advocate shall 10 11 consider the importance and the extent of the interest of 12 the citizens of the state. In evaluating the importance and 13 extent of that interest, the office of consumer advocate 14 shall give due consideration to the short and long-term 15 impact of the proceedings upon the classes of consumers as provided in subsection (a) of this section, so as not to 16 17 jeopardize the interest of one (1) class in an action by another. If the office of consumer advocate determines that 18 19 there may be inconsistent interests among the classes of 20 the consumers the office represents in a particular matter, 21 the office may choose to represent one (1) of the interests 22 or to represent no interest. Nothing in this section shall be construed to limit the right of any person, firm, or 23 24 corporation to petition or make complaint to the commission

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or otherwise intervene in proceedings or other matters
before the commission.

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4 (c) The office of consumer advocate shall fulfill the 5 duties assigned to it under subsection (a) of this section by appearing in proceedings before the commission, and 6 appeals from those proceedings, in matters which involve 7 proposed changes in a public utility's rates and charges, 8 9 in matters involving rulemaking which have an impact on the 10 charges, the provision of services, or the rates to 11 residential and small business consumers, and in matters 12 which involve certificates of public convenience and 13 necessity for facilities employed in the provision of 14 utility service, the construction of which would have a material effect on the utility's rates and charges. 15

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17 (d) The office of consumer advocate may provide 18 information and other assistance to individual consumers 19 regarding proceedings within the jurisdiction of the 20 commission but shall not advocate for or on behalf of any 21 individual, organization or entity.

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1 (e) The consumer advocate shall have the same access as the commission to books, maps, contracts, reports and 2 3 records of every description. 4 5 (f) The office of consumer advocate shall be served with notices of all proposed public utility tariffs, and 6 shall be served with copies of all orders of the commission 7 affecting the charges of residential consumers and small 8 9 business consumers. 10 37-2-404. Powers of office of consumer advocate. 11 12 13 (a) The office of consumer advocate: 14 15 (i) Shall be granted, by the commission, leave to intervene in all cases where such request is made in 16 17 conformance with the rules of the commission; 18 (ii) May contract for the services 19 of 20 technically qualified persons to perform research and to 21 appear as expert witnesses before the commission, such 22 persons to be paid from funds appropriated for the use of the office of consumer advocate; and 23 24

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(iii) Shall have access to the files of the
commission when conducting research.

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4 (b) The office of consumer advocate may petition for, 5 request, initiate, and appear and intervene as a party in any proceeding before the commission concerning rate 6 changes, rulemaking, charges, tariffs, modifications of 7 service, and matters involving certificates of public 8 9 convenience and necessity. Notwithstanding any provision of this article to the contrary, the office of consumer 10 advocate shall not be a party to any individual complaint 11 12 between a public utility and an individual.

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14 (c) The office of consumer advocate may petition for, 15 request, initiate, or seek to intervene in any proceeding 16 before a federal agency which regulates utility rates or 17 service, or federal court when the matter before such agency or court will affect a rate, charge, tariff, or term 18 of service for a utility product or service for a 19 20 residential or small business utility consumer in the state 21 of Wyoming. The phrase "federal agency which regulates 22 utility rates or service" does not include any federal 23 lending agency.

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(d) The employees of the office of consumer advocate 1 2 directly involved in a specific proceeding before the 3 commission shall refrain from ex parte communications with 4 members of the commission. The employees of the office of 5 consumer advocate shall have all rights and be governed by the same ex parte rules as all other intervenors. 6 7 Section 2. W.S. 37-2-110(b) is repealed. 8 9 Section 3. For purposes of this act, there are 10 11 created two (2) assistant attorneys general positions, 12 three (3) rate analyst positions and one (1) administrative 13 or clerical position within the office of attorney general. 14 There is appropriated from the general fund to the office of the attorney general eight hundred thirty-two thousand 15 five hundred dollars (\$832,500.00) to fund the positions 16 17 provided in this section. 18 19 Section 4. This act is effective July 1, 2002.
