A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to workers' compensation; replacing the standard industrial classification system with the North 2 American industry classification system for categorizing 3 extrahazardous employment; repealing the standard 4 5 industrial classification system as specified; conforming applicability of the classification systems; specifying 6 7 applicability of the classification system for purposes of 8 determining employers' premium rates for workers' 9 compensation; and providing for an effective date.

11 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 12

Section 1. W.S. 27-14-108(a) by creating a new paragraph (ii) and (o) and 27-14-201(c)(viii) and by creating a new paragraph (ix) are amended to read:
