## A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to criminal procedure; providing for
- 2 notification to the state department upon the stopping,
- 3 detention or arrest of persons with diplomatic status;
- 4 making conforming amendment; and providing for an effective
- 5 date.

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7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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9 **Section 1.** W.S. 7-2-107 is created to read:

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- 11 7-2-107. Arrest or detention of persons with
- 12 diplomatic immunities.

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- 14 (a) This section applies to an individual who upon
- 15 being stopped, detained or arrested by a peace officer for
- 16 a violation of W.S. 6-2-106, a driving while under the
- 17 influence offense or a moving violation pursuant to the

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- 1 motor vehicle laws of Wyoming or local ordinance, provides
- 2 a driver's license issued by the United States department
- 3 of state or otherwise claims immunities or privileges
- 4 pursuant to title 22, chapter 6 of the United States Code.

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- 6 (b) If a driver as described in subsection (a) of
- 7 this section is stopped, detained or arrested by a peace
- 8 officer who has probable cause to believe that the driver
- 9 has committed a violation described in subsection (a) of
- 10 this section, the peace officer shall:

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- 12 (i) Within a reasonable amount of time, contact
- 13 the United States department of state and verify the
- 14 driver's status and possible immunity;

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- 16 (ii) Record relevant information from the
- 17 driver's license or identification card issued by the
- 18 United States department of state; and

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- 20 (iii) Within five (5) days after the date of the
- 21 stop, forward the following to the United States department
- 22 of state:

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24 (A) A written report of the incident; and

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2 (B) A copy of the citation or other

3 charging document if issued;

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- 5 (c) The provisions of this section do not prohibit
- 6 the application of any law to a criminal violation by any
- 7 individual who claims immunities pursuant to title 22,
- 8 chapter 6 of the United States Code.
