A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to nursing education programs; establishing a Wyoming investment in nursing program as specified; 2 specifying eligibility criteria; providing procedures for 3 application, administration and repayment of loans under 4 5 the Wyoming investment in nursing program as specified; providing for appeals; requiring the Wyoming community 6 college commission to coordinate the development and 7 8 implementation of a mobile licensed practical nurse 9 education program as specified; requiring the commission to 10 coordinate internet or similar proprietary or common 11 carrier electronic system courses to meet prerequisites for entry into nursing programs as specified; specifying 12 conditions under which the Wyoming community college 13 14 commission and the University of Wyoming shall fund 15 additional teaching positions in nursing education

- 1 programs; providing appropriations; and providing for an
- 2 effective date.

4 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

6 **Section 1.** W.S. 9-2-123 is created to read:

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- 8 9-2-123. Wyoming investment in nursing loan and grant
- 9 program; eligibility criteria; procedures.

10

- 11 (a) There is created the Wyoming investment in
- 12 nursing program administered by the Wyoming higher
- 13 education assistance authority created under W.S.
- 14 21-16-703. The program shall be known as the WYIN program.
- 15 Applicants may apply for grants or loans from the WYIN
- 16 program in accordance with this section.

17

- 18 (b) To qualify for a loan or grant under the WYIN
- 19 program, the applicant shall first:

- 21 (i) Be accepted into a nursing education program
- 22 at a Wyoming community college, the University of Wyoming,
- 23 or, in the case of a candidate for a doctoral degree, an
- 24 institution providing the required nursing education

1 courses under contract with the western interstate

2 commission for higher education; and

3

4 (ii) Apply for federal financial

5 assistance. Wyoming community colleges shall allow

6 students who apply for admission into an approved nurse

7 aide training or nursing education program, and who will

8 enroll in fewer than six (6) academic credit hours, to

9 apply for federal financial assistance.

10

11 (c) Subject to the availability of funds appropriated

12 for this program, loans under the WYIN program may be

13 granted to applicants enrolled or planning to enroll in

14 nursing education programs as follows:

15

16 (i) An applicant who is accepted into a Wyoming

17 licensed practical nurse or registered nursing education

18 program may be eligible for a loan to pay the costs of

19 attendance at the licensed practical nursing education

20 program or the registered nursing education program.

21 Students who complete a licensed practical nursing

22 education program at a Wyoming community college shall be

23 deemed to have completed all first year nursing education

24 program requirements for a registered nursing education

1 program leading to an associate's degree offered at the

2 Wyoming community college which awarded the license

3 practical nurse certificate;

4

5 (ii) A registered nurse with a baccalaureate

6 degree who holds an unencumbered license with the Wyoming

7 board of nursing, has the equivalent of at least two (2)

8 years of full-time, continuous service in Wyoming as a

9 registered nurse with a baccalaureate degree and is

10 accepted into a Wyoming nursing education program at the

11 University of Wyoming leading to a master's degree in

12 nursing may be eligible for a loan to pay the costs of

13 attendance at the nursing education program leading to a

14 master's degree in nursing;

15

16 (iii) A registered nurse with a master's degree

17 in nursing who holds an unencumbered license with the

18 Wyoming board of nursing, has the equivalent of at least

19 two (2) years of full-time, continuous service in Wyoming

20 as a registered nurse with a master's degree in nursing and

21 is accepted into a nursing education program at an

22 institution providing the required nursing education

23 courses under contract with the western interstate

24 commission for higher education leading to a doctorate

- 1 level degree in nursing may be eligible for a loan to pay
- 2 the costs of attendance at the nursing education program
- 3 leading to a doctorate level degree in nursing.

- 5 (d) A nurse educator at a Wyoming community college
- 6 or the University of Wyoming who is required to pursue an
- 7 advanced degree for the purpose of satisfying accreditation
- 8 requirements, may be eligible for both a loan and a salary
- 9 replacement grant not to exceed the actual salary of the
- 10 nurse educator at the time of entry into the advanced
- 11 degree program.

12

- 13 (e) Except for a salary replacement grant under
- 14 subsection (d) of this section, a grant or loan provided
- 15 under this section shall not exceed the cost of attendance
- 16 for the approved program, reduced by the amount of any Pell
- 17 or other federal grant received by the applicant.

- 19 (f) A recipient of a WYIN loan under this section may
- 20 repay the loan without cash payment by working in Wyoming
- 21 as a nurse or nurse educator as provided in subsection (g)
- 22 of this section. To qualify as repayment under this
- 23 subsection, work shall be performed within the following
- 24 time periods which begin with the calendar month following

1 the month in which the student completed the academic

2 program:

3

4 (i) If the loan can be repaid with work of two

5 (2) years or less, within three (3) years;

6

7 (ii) If the loan can be repaid with work of

8 greater than two (2) years, but no more than four (4)

9 years, within five (5) years;

10

11 (iii) If the loan can be repaid with work of

12 greater than four (4) years, within the amount of time the

13 loan could be repaid, plus two (2) years.

14

15 (g) Qualified work under subsection (f) of this

16 section shall be credited so that the student's loan

17 balance is reduced on the basis of one (1) year of full-

18 time employment repaying the loan balance for one (1)

19 academic year. Qualified work shall be credited on a

20 proportional basis.

21

22 (h) Notwithstanding subsection (g) of this section,

23 for a recipient of both a WYIN loan and a salary

24 replacement grant, qualified work under subsection (f) of

- 1 this section shall be credited so that the student's loan
- 2 balance is reduced on the basis of two (2) years of full-
- 3 time employment repaying the loan balance for one (1)
- 4 academic year. Qualified work shall be credited on a
- 5 proportional basis.

7 (j) Any recipient of a WYIN loan who fails:

8

- 9 (i) To complete the academic program for which
- 10 the loan was provided shall commence repayment of the loan
- 11 no later than forty-five (45) days after the recipient
- 12 leaves the academic program;

13

- 14 (ii) To obtain employment in the targeted
- 15 occupation for which the person received the education
- 16 within ninety (90) days after successfully passing the
- 17 appropriate certification examination shall commence
- 18 repayment of the loan within one hundred twenty (120) days
- 19 after successfully passing the appropriate certification
- 20 examination;

- 22 (iii) The appropriate certification examination
- 23 on the first attempt may retake the appropriate
- 24 certification examination at the next available opportunity

1 before commencing repayment of the loan. The recipient

2 shall notify the Wyoming higher education assistance

3 authority or its contractor of the intent to retake the

4 examination and the date the examination will be taken. Any

5 recipient of a WYIN loan who fails the appropriate

6 certification examination after the second attempt shall

7 commence repayment of the loan within forty-five (45) days

8 after receipt of notification of the second failure by the

9 board of nursing. If the recipient of a WYIN loan who fails

10 the appropriate certification examination on the first

11 attempt does not retake the examination at the next

12 available opportunity, repayment shall commence within

13 forty-five (45) days after the next available examination

14 is conducted.

15

16 (k) Loan repayment options under this section may be

17 deferred for a period not to exceed six (6) years while a

18 loan recipient is serving on full-time active duty with any

19 branch of the military services of the United States.

20

21 (m) The Wyoming higher education assistance authority

22 shall have the powers and duties specified in W.S.

23 21-16-705 to implement this section and shall establish

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1 terms and conditions of loans issued under this section,

2 including:

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4 (i) Interest rates and loan terms;

5

6 (ii) The form and process for loan application,

7 review and award;

8

9 (iii) Criteria under which students may be

10 relieved from having to repay loans and interest thereon,

11 in whole or in part, where the requirement to repay would

12 cause undue hardship.

13

14 (n) Funding of the targeted loan program established

15 under this section shall be by appropriation of the

16 legislature. The authority shall transfer approved loan

17 amounts to the university of Wyoming and to Wyoming

18 community colleges at which loan recipients are enrolled.

19 In consultation with the university and affected community

20 colleges, the authority shall establish procedures for

21 transferring loan amounts and for reporting requirements on

22 the expenditure of transferred loan amounts.

1 (o) Repayment of loans and interest thereon shall be

2 credited to the general fund.

3

- 4 (p) The authority shall annually review the targeted
- 5 loan program established under this section and report to
- 6 the governor and the legislature in accordance with W.S.
- 7 9-2-1014, regarding program results, funds received and
- 8 loans issued during the preceding academic year, together
- 9 with the status of all outstanding loan commitments and
- 10 repayments under the program.

11

- 12 **Section 2.** W.S. 21-17-107, 21-18-202(b) by creating
- 13 new paragraphs (v) and (vi) and (c) by creating a new
- 14 paragraph (vii) and 21-18-317 are amended to read:

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16 **21-17-107**. Legislature to make appropriations.

- 18 (a) The legislature shall appropriate monies intended
- 19 for the support and maintenance of the University of
- 20 Wyoming. The appropriations shall specify the purposes for
- 21 which the monies are intended and may be used. The
- 22 appropriations shall apply to and include all monies
- 23 received by the university from the United States for the
- 24 endowment and support of colleges for the benefit of

1 agriculture and mechanic arts. No expenditure shall be

2 made in excess of an appropriation, and no monies so

3 appropriated shall be used for any purpose other than that

4 for which they are appropriated.

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6 (b) Subject to appropriation by the legislature, the 7 board of trustees shall fund an entry level teaching faculty position when the university expands its nursing 8 9 program capacity by not less than eight (8) students. The 10 university shall expend the funding under this paragraph 11 only if enrollment in the nursing program of the university 12 was not less than ninety-five percent (95%) of the total 13 nursing program capacity at the beginning of the most 14 recent fall academic semester. Funding available for expenditure under this paragraph for the specific purpose 15 of expanding a nursing program capacity shall be reduced by 16 17 an amount equal to that provided to fund one (1) entry level teaching position for every reduction of eight (8) 18 19 full-time equivalent students in the nursing program, as 20 determined by comparing the beginning enrollments of the 21 two (2) most recent fall academic semesters. Any 22 appropriation made for purposes of this subsection shall be 23 accounted for and distributed separately from

4	21-18-202. Powers and duties of the commission.
5	
6	(b) The commission shall perform the following
7	coordination functions. In performing these coordination
8	functions all affected colleges and the commission shall be
9	involved:
10	
11	(v) Subject to appropriation by the legislature,
12	coordinate the development and implementation of a mobile
13	licensed practical nurse education program which shall
14	provide appropriate educational services to students
15	enrolled in a licensed practical nurse education program
16	who are unable to attend classes at a community college
17	campus, including:
18	
19	(A) Reviewing applications for access by
20	communities to the program;
21	
22	(B) Establishing by rule and regulation the
23	application, review and decision process by which

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1	communities will be served and the order in which they will
2	be served;
3	
4	(C) Contracting with a Wyoming community
5	college to provide the program established under this
6	paragraph, giving due consideration to the community
7	college with responsibility for the service area in which
8	the community selected to host the program is located.
9	
LO	(vi) Coordinate the provision by means of
L1	electronic internet or similar proprietary or common
L2	carrier electronic system technology, by a community
L3	college or several community colleges, of all prerequisite
L 4	courses necessary for entry into an educational program in
L5	the field of nursing at a community college or a
L 6	baccalaureate degree program in nursing at the University
L 7	of Wyoming.

L 9	(c) The commission shall perform the following
20	administrative functions:
21	
22	(vii) Subject to appropriation by the
23	legislature, the commission shall fully fund an entry level
24	teaching faculty position when a community college expands

Ι	its nursing program capacity by not less than eight (8)
2	students. A community college shall be eligible to apply
3	for the funding under this paragraph only if enrollment in
4	the nursing program of the applicant institution was not
5	less than ninety-five percent (95%) of the total nursing
6	program capacity at the beginning of the most recent fall
7	academic semester. Funding provided under this paragraph
8	for the specific purpose of expanding a nursing program
9	capacity shall be reduced by an amount equal to that
10	provided to fund one (1) entry level teaching position for
11	every reduction of eight (8) full-time equivalent students
12	in the nursing program, as determined by comparing the
13	beginning enrollments of the two (2) most recent fall
14	academic semesters. Funding reductions shall not exceed the
15	total amount of funding provided to a community college
16	under this paragraph. Any appropriation made for purposes
17	of this paragraph shall, in accordance with W.S.
18	21-18-205(e), be accounted for and distributed separately
19	from the funding allocation model for community colleges.
20	
21	21-18-317. Authority to provide educational program;

22

scope and approval of program.

The community college district board of any community 1 2 college in this state may provide the an educational 3 program education in the field of nursing. The educational 4 program shall be of such the duration and intensity as may 5 be deemed appropriate by the community college district board and the Wyoming state board of nursing and shall lead 6 to an associate degree in nursing and prepare each student 7 for licensure as provided by law. Approval of the Wyoming 8

state board of nursing is required prior to the

establishment of any such the nursing education.

Section 3.

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14 (a) There is appropriated five million seven hundred hundred 15 fifty-four thousand six fifty dollars 16 (\$5,754,650.00) to the Wyoming higher education assistance 17 authority from the general fund for the biennium beginning July 1, 2002 to implement the provisions of W.S. 9-2-123. 18 Any funds appropriated under this subsection that are not 19 20 expended, encumbered or obligated at the end of the 21 biennium shall revert to the general fund as provided by 22 W.S. 9-4-207.

1	(b)	There	is	appropriated	from	the	general	fund	to
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- 2 the Wyoming community college commission one million one
- 3 hundred two thousand seven hundred twenty-eight dollars
- 4 (\$1,102,728.00) for the biennium beginning July 1, 2002, to
- 5 implement the provisions of W.S. 21-18-202(b)(v).

- 7 (c) There is appropriated from the general fund to
- 8 the Wyoming community college commission seven hundred
- 9 fifty-six thousand six hundred fifty dollars (\$756,650.00)
- 10 for the biennium beginning July 1, 2002, to implement the
- 11 provisions of W.S. 21-18-202(c)(vii).

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- 13 (d) There is appropriated from the general fund to
- 14 the University of Wyoming one hundred thirty thousand
- 15 dollars (\$130,000.00) for the biennium beginning July 1,
- 16 2002, to implement the provisions of W.S. 21-17-107(b).
