## A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to public school performance and graduation
- 2 standards; modifying requirements for graduation as
- 3 specified; imposing different types of student proficiency
- 4 with respect to performance standards; imposing assessment
- 5 duties upon school districts; conforming statutory
- 6 provisions accordingly; and providing for an effective
- 7 date.

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9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 11 **Section 1.** W.S. 21-2-202(c), 21-2-304(a)(iii), (iv)
- 12 and (v), (b)(ii) and (c), 21-3-110(a) by creating a new
- 13 paragraph (xxiv), 21-3-308(g), 21-9-101(b)(intro) and
- 14 21-13-101(a)(v) are amended to read:

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16 **21-2-202**. Duties of the state superintendent.

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- 1 (c) In addition to subsection (a) of this section,
- 2 the state superintendent may take appropriate
- 3 administrative action with the state board as necessary,
- 4 including but not limited to the changing of accreditation
- 5 status, against any school district or state institution
- failing to comply with any applicable law or with the 6
- uniform educational program standards specified under W.S. 7
- 21-9-101 and 21-9-102 and the student content and 8
- 9 performance standards prescribed by the state board.

21-2-304. Duties of the state board of education. 11

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13 (a) The state board of education shall:

- 15 (iii) By rule and regulation and in consultation
- and coordination with local school districts, prescribe 16
- 17 uniform student content and performance standards for the
- common core of knowledge and the common core of skills 18
- specified under W.S. 21-9-101(b), and promulgate uniform 19
- 20 standards for programs addressing the special needs of
- 21 student populations specified under W.S. 21-9-101(c) that
- 22 ensure these student populations are provided the
- 23 opportunity to learn the common core knowledge and skills
- 24 as prescribed by the uniform student content and

1	performance standards pursuant to this paragraph. Student
2	<pre>content and performance standards prescribed under this</pre>
3	paragraph shall include standards for graduation from any
4	high school within any school district of this state based
5	upon performance or mastery of and shall describe required
6	performance levels in order to achieve proficiency of the
7	common core of knowledge and common core of skills
8	prescribed under W.S. 21-9-101(b). Graduation standards
9	imposed under this paragraph shall require the successful
10	completion of the following components, as evidenced by
11	passing grades or by the successful performance on
12	competency-based equivalency examinations:
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14	(A) Four (4) school years of English;
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16	(B) Three (3) school years of mathematics;
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18	(C) Three (3) school years of science; and
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20	(D) Three (3) school years of social
21	studies, including history, American government and
22	economic systems and institutions, provided business
23	instructors may instruct classes on economic systems and
24	institutions.

2 (iv) Establish, in consultation with local 3 school districts, through testing or other means, a 4 requirement requirements for each student to demonstrate 5 mastery of the common core of knowledge and skills in order 6 students to earn a high school diploma; as measured by each 7 district's body of evidence assessment system prescribed by rule and regulation of the state board and required under 8 9 W.S. 21-3-110(a) (xxii). A high school diploma shall provide for one (1) of the following endorsements which shall be 10 11 stated on the transcript of each student:

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(A) Advanced endorsement which requires a student to demonstrate advanced performance in a majority of the areas of the common core of knowledge and skills specified under W.S. 21-9-101(b) and proficient performance in the remaining areas of the specified common core of knowledge and skills, as defined by the uniform student content and performance standards promulgated by the state board pursuant to paragraph (a) (iii) of this section;

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22 (B) Comprehensive endorsement which
23 requires a student to demonstrate proficient performance in
24 all areas of the common core of knowledge and skills

1 specified under W.S. 21-9-101(b) as defined by the uniform

2 student content and performance standards promulgated by

3 the state board pursuant to paragraph (a)(iii) of this

4 section;

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6 (C) General endorsement which requires a
7 student to demonstrate proficient performance in a majority
8 of the areas of the common core of knowledge and skills
9 specified under W.S. 21-9-101(b) as defined by the uniform
10 student content and performance standards promulgated by
11 the state board pursuant to paragraph (a)(iii) of this
12 section.

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(v) Through the state superintendent and in consultation and coordination with local school districts, implement a statewide assessment system for measuring student progress based upon uniform educational program and student content and performance standards imposed by law and by board rule and regulation. The assessment system shall be administered at appropriate levels at specified grades and at appropriate intervals aligned to the standards. The assessment system shall be aligned to the statewide educational program standards, shall specifically assess student performance in reading, writing and

1 mathematics at grades four (4), eight (8) and eleven (11)

2 and may measure the other common core of knowledge and

3 skills established under W.S. 21-9-101(b) which can be

4 quantified. The assessment results will be used in

5 conjunction with a school district's annual assessment to

6 design educational strategies for improvement and

7 enhancement of student performance. This design for

8 improvement shall be part of each district's school

9 improvement plan. In consultation and coordination with

10 school districts, the board shall review and evaluate the

11 assessment system regularly and based upon uniform

12 statewide reports from each district, annually report to

13 the legislature on student performance at specified grade

14 levels and on school improvement plans.

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16 (b) In addition to subsection (a) of this section and

17 any other duties assigned to it by law, the state board

18 shall:

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20 (ii) Enforce the uniform state educational

21 program standards imposed by W.S. 21-9-101 and 21-9-102 and

22 the uniform student content and performance standards

23 established by rules and regulations adopted under

24 subsection (a) of this section by taking appropriate

1 administrative action with the state superintendent,

2 including but not limited to the changing of accreditation

3 status;

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5 (c) The state board shall perform an ongoing review

6 of state board duties prescribed by law and may make

7 recommendations to the legislature on board duties. In

8 addition and not less than once every five (5) years, the

9 board shall evaluate and review the uniformity and quality

10 of the educational program standards imposed under W.S.

11 21-9-101 and 21-9-102 and the student content and

12 performance standards promulgated under paragraph (a) (iii)

13 of this section, and shall report findings and

14 recommendations to the joint education interim committee of

15 the legislature on or before December 1 of the year in

16 which the review and evaluation was undertaken. The joint

17 education interim committee shall report its

18 recommendations, based upon findings and recommendations of

19 the state board, to the legislature during the immediately

20 following legislative session.

A component of the district 8 9 assessment system required by this paragraph shall include 10 a body of evidence assessment system designed and used to determine the various levels of student performance as 11 12 described in the uniform student content and performance 13 standards relative to the common core of knowledge and 14 skills prescribed under W.S. 21-9-101(b). 15 21-3-308.
