A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to peace officers; amending the
- 2 extraterritorial authority of peace officers as specified;
- 3 providing for immunity; apportioning compensation and costs
- 4 as specified; and providing for an effective date.

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6 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 8 **Section 1.** W.S. 7-2-106(a), by creating a new
- 9 subsection (b) and by amending and renumbering (b) as (c)
- 10 and 18-3-602(c) and by creating a new subsection (f) are
- 11 amended to read:

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- 7-2-106. Requests for temporary assignment of peace
- 14 officers; extraterritorial authority of peace officers;
- 15 liability; compensation.

1 (a) The chief of police of any municipality, or the 2 sheriff of any county, subject to rules and procedures 3 established by the governing body of any municipality or 4 county, may request the chief of police of any other 5 municipality, or the sheriff of any other county to assign certified peace officers under their respective command to 6 7 perform temporary law enforcement duties relating to a specific incident within the jurisdiction of the requesting 8 9 chief of police or sheriff and under the direction and control of the requesting chief or sheriff. Peace 10 11 officers, while so assigned and performing duties, are 12 subject to the direction and control of the requesting 13 chief or sheriff and shall have full peace officer's 14 authority within the requesting agency's jurisdiction during the temporary assignment. 15

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(b) Peace officers employed by a municipality may exercise all statutory powers as law enforcement officers in any location within the county in which the municipality is located when acting in fresh pursuit of a person. As used in this section, "fresh pursuit" means pursuit without unnecessary delay of a person whom the peace officer reasonably suspects of having committed within the

1 municipal officer's jurisdiction a violation of a municipal

2 ordinance or state statute, including traffic infractions.

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(b)(c) A peace officer designated in subsection (a) 4 5 or (b) of this section who makes an arrest or issues a section 6 citation pursuant to this outside his jurisdiction shall be deemed to be acting within the scope 7 of his duties for purposes of the Wyoming Governmental 8 9 Claims Act and the state self-insurance program, W.S. 10 1-41-101 through 1-41-111. All privileges and immunities 11 from liability, and all pension, disability, worker's 12 compensation and other benefits which normally apply to 13 peace officers while they perform their duties in their own 14 jurisdiction shall also apply to them when acting as provided in subsection (a) of this section. For purposes of 15 16 27-14-104, the W.S. requesting and assigning 17 enforcement agencies shall be a joint employer as defined under W.S. 27-14-102(a)(xix) and 18 the designated peace 19 officer shall be a joint employee as defined under W.S. 20 27-14-102(a)(xxi). The cost of salary and benefits accruing 21 to a peace officer, while performing duties at the request of another law enforcement jurisdiction, shall be borne by 22 the individual peace officer's own employing agency. The 23 24 cost of any damage to equipment belonging to the officer or

1 his employer occurring while acting under the provisions of

2 this section shall be borne by the requesting law

3 enforcement agency.

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5 18-3-602. Qualifications, appointment, duties and

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10 (c) Each county sheriff may also appoint special as

11 deputies to perform particular acts, which shall be

12 specified in each appointment and for whose official acts

13 he is responsible any other peace officers as defined in

14 <u>W.S. 7-2-101</u> located within the sheriff's jurisdiction for

15 the purpose of countywide law enforcement. Such

16 appointments are not required to be filed or revoked as in

17 the case of regular deputies. No county assessor shall be

18 appointed deputy sheriff.

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20 (f) A peace officer designated in subsection (c) of

21 this section who makes an arrest or issues a citation

22 pursuant to this section outside his own jurisdiction shall

23 be deemed to be acting within the scope of his duties for

24 purposes of the Wyoming Governmental Claims Act and the

Τ	state self-insurance program, w.s. 1-41-101 through
2	1-41-111. All privileges and immunities from liability,
3	and all pension, disability, workers' compensation and
4	other benefits which normally apply to peace officers while
5	they perform their duties within their own jurisdiction
6	shall also apply to them when acting as provided in
7	subsection (c) of this section. For purposes of W.S.
8	27-14-104, the requesting and assigning law enforcement
9	agency shall be a joint employer as defined under W.S.
10	27-14-102(a)(xix) and the designated peace officer shall be
11	a joint employee as defined in W.S. 27-14-102(a)(xxi). The
12	cost of salary and benefits accruing to a peace officer,
13	while performing duties at the request of another law
14	enforcement jurisdiction, shall be borne by the peace
15	officer's own employing agency. The cost of any damage to
16	equipment belonging to the officer or his employer
17	occurring while acting under the provisions of this section
18	shall be borne by the requesting law enforcement agency.
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20	Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2003.
