A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to health care; establishing a health care 2 commission within the governor's office; providing for

3 membership; authorizing an advisory board as specified;

4 specifying duties; requiring the commission to submit its

5 recommendations to the legislature as specified;

6 authorizing the commission to hire a director and staff;

7 providing an appropriation; providing for the termination

8 of the commission, board and staff positions as specified;

9 and providing for an effective date.

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11 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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13 **Section 1.** W.S. 9-2-2801 through 9-2-2805 are created

(c) Appointed commission members shall serve until 10

11 completion of duties delegated to the commission under this

12 article. If a vacancy occurs on the commission, the

13 governor shall appoint a new member to fill the vacancy for

the remainder of the term. The governor may remove members 14

as provided in W.S. 9-1-202. Commission members who are not 15

state employees shall receive a salary equal to the per 16

17 diem paid members of the Wyoming legislature under W.S.

18 28-5-101 for each day of actual service and when engaged in

necessary travel plus necessary expenses. 19

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21 (d) The governor shall designate one (1) member to

22 serve as chairman.

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1	(e) The commission shall meet not less than monthly
2	at the call of the chairman. Eight (8) members shall
3	constitute a quorum.
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5	(f) As used in this article, "commission" means the

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11	(a) There is created an advisory board to assist the
12	commission as necessary, consisting of the following
13	members appointed by the governor:
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15	(i) A physician licensed in Wyoming;
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17	(ii) A registered nurse licensed in Wyoming;
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19	(iii) A pharmacist licensed in Wyoming;
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21	(iv) A representative of a hospital;
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23	(v) A provider of long term care services;
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1	(vi) An attorney licensed in Wyoming;
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3	(vii) A representative for a health care insurer
4	operating in Wyoming;
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6	(viii) An uninsured resident of the state;

- 4 board members shall be voluntary and shall

- (c) Members of the advisory board shall meet at the 8
- 9 call of the chairman of the commission. Members of the
- 10 board may be appointed to serve as subcommittees of the
- 11 commission, rather than as an advisory board to the

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- 17 The governor, with the consent of the commission,
- shall appoint a director who shall serve at the pleasure of 18
- the commission. The director shall: 19

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- 21 (i) Serve as administrative head of the

- 2 and assist the commission in carrying out the duties
- 3 imposed under this article; and

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- 5 (iii) Not be subject to W.S. 9-2-1019, 9-2-1022
- 6 and 9-3-101 through 9-3-104 but shall receive compensation
- 7 and be reimbursed for travel and other necessary expenses
- 8 as prescribed by the commission and approved by the

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- 11 (b) Subject to approval by the commission, the
- 12 director may employ one (1) staff member to assist the
- 13 commission in performing its duties. The staff member shall
- 14 possess those administrative, technical, professional and
- 15 clerical qualifications determined necessary by the
- 16 commission. All staff to the commission shall serve at the
- 17 pleasure of the director.

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- 19 (c) The commission may contract for services with
- 20 nationally recognized health care systems experts as
- 21 necessary to assist in the technical aspects of data
- 22 development, review and analysis.

Health care commission duties; report; open 1 2 meetings; attorney general to represent; rulemaking. 3 (a) 4 The commission shall develop strategies to 5 improve health care and reduce health care and medical liability insurance costs for Wyoming citizens by holding 6 public meetings throughout the state, hearing from experts 7 and other interested parties, studying and researching 8 9 other states' actions on health care and medical liability 10 insurance reform, studying and utilizing Wyoming data, 11 considering past efforts, including, but not limited to, 12 the report issued by the Wyoming health reform commission 13 on December 1, 1994, and future possibilities that can be 14 useful in decision making by addressing the following: 15 16 (i) Access to an affordable, effective 17 quality health care system for Wyoming, including rural areas of the state; 18 19 20 (ii) Access to affordable health insurance; 21

(iii) Issues of wellness

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and individual

responsibility for personal health;

1	(iv) Disease prevention and management;

3	(v) Medical liability insurance reform;
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5	(vi) Workforce shortages among medical provider
6	professions;

8	(vii) Cost shifting by medical providers that
9	occurs as a result of low reimbursement from public and
10	other programs;

12	(viii) The aging population in Wyoming and the
13	long term care services that will be needed by that
14	population;
15	
16	(ix) Other issues as deemed appropriate by the
17	governor and the commission.
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19	(b) The commission shall consult and coordinate
20	with the state planning grant task force within the
21	department of health on issues relating to health

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insurance.

- 1 (c) The commission shall submit to the legislature,
- 2 joint judiciary interim committee and the governor a
- 3 preliminary report on its findings no later than June 30,
- 4 2004, and a final report with its recommendations for
- 5 legislative changes by December 1, 2004.

- (d) Public hearings of the commission shall be held 7
- in accordance with W.S. 16-4-401 et seq. The attorney 8
- 9 general shall be the legal adviser of the commission.

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9-2-2805. Termination of article. 11

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- 13 W.S. 9-2-2801 through 9-2-2804 are repealed effective June
- 30, 2005. 14

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- Section 2. There is appropriated three hundred fifty 16
- 17 thousand dollars (\$350,000.00) from the general fund to the
- governor's office for the period beginning April 1, 2003 18
- through December 30, 2004 to implement the purposes of this 19
- 20 act. Notwithstanding W.S. 9-4-207, the appropriation under
- 21 this section shall not lapse at the end of the biennium
- 22 ending June 30, 2004.

1 Section 3. This act is effective immediately upon

2 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law

3 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming

4 Constitution.
