## A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to a Wyoming senior services board;
- 2 creating a board, providing for membership and duties of
- 3 the board; specifying the distribution of funds;
- 4 authorizing rules and regulations; requiring reports;
- 5 providing definitions; providing an appropriation; and
- 6 providing for an effective date.

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8 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 10 **Section 1.** W.S. 9-2-1210 through 9-2-1215 are created
- 11 to read:

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9-2-1210. Wyoming senior services board created.

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There is created the Wyoming senior services board. The
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2 board shall consult with the division on aging to determine

3 the award of grants under W.S. 9-2-1214.

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5 9-2-1211. Wyoming senior services board; members;

6 expenses.

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- (a) The Wyoming senior services board shall consist 8
- 9 of seven (7) members, as follows:

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- (i) The administrator of the division on aging 11
- 12 within the department of health or his designee;

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- (ii) One (1) member of the advisory council on 14
- aging appointed by the governor; 15

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- 17 (iii) Three (3) persons who are senior citizens
- appointed by the governor; 18

- 20 (iv) One (1) member of the senate appointed by
- 21 the president of the senate;

1 (v) One (1) member of the house of

2 representatives appointed by the speaker of the house of

3 representatives.

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5 (b) The terms of members appointed under paragraphs

6 (a)(ii) and (iii) of this section shall be for four (4)

7 years. Legislators shall serve only for the term of office

8 during which they were appointed. Of the initial appointees

9 under paragraph (a)(iii) of this section, two (2) members

10 shall be appointed for two (2) years and one (1) member

11 shall be appointed for four (4) years. The governor may

12 remove any member appointed under paragraph (a)(ii) or

13 (iii) of this section as provided in W.S. 9-1-202. A

14 vacancy on the board shall be filled for the balance of the

15 unexpired term. The board shall select one (1) of its

16 members to serve as chairman.

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18 (c) The board shall meet not less than two (2) times

19 each year. Members shall serve without compensation but

20 shall be reimbursed for expenses incurred in the

21 performance of their official duties in the manner and

22 amounts provided by law for state employees. Members who

23 are government employees or public officials shall be

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considered on official business of their agency when 1 2 performing duties as members of the board. 3 4 9-2-1212. Board; duties and responsibilities. 5 (a) The Wyoming senior services board shall: 6 7 (i) Review innovative program grants and grant 8 9 proposals; 10 (ii) Approve criteria for grant categories and 11 12 grant applications through rules and regulations 13 promulgated by the division on aging to meet the following public purposes: 14 15 16 (A) Wyoming's Τo meet the demands of 17 growing elderly population; 18 19 (B) To enhance services to Wyoming's senior 20 citizens; 21 22 (C) To strengthen the opportunity for senior citizens to age in the least restrictive environment 23 24 possible;

2 (D) To be cost effective in the provision

3 of services to senior citizens;

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5 (E) To promote compliance with federal and

state mandates requiring placement of people in the least 6

7 restrictive environment; and

8

9 (F) To supplement and enhance existing

programs providing services to senior citizens in the 10

11 state.

13 (iii) Review and monitor the expenditure of

monies awarded under W.S. 9-2-1214; 14

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16 (iv) In consultation with the division on aging,

17 promulgate reasonable rules and regulations in accordance

with the Wyoming Administrative Procedure Act to implement 18

19 the provisions of W.S. 9-2-1210 through 9-2-1215; and

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21 (v) Consider other necessary matters.

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23 In fulfilling its duties under subsection (a) of

this section, the board shall: 24

2 (i) Consult with the division on aging and the

3 advisory council on aging appointed pursuant to W.S.

4 9-2-1206, as necessary;

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6 (ii) Accept federal grants and other

7 contributions, grants, gifts, bequests and donations from

8 any source.

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10 9-2-1213. Division on aging; duties.

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12 (a) The division on aging shall:

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14 (i) Maintain, manage and be responsible for the

15 distribution of the funds appropriated for distribution

16 under W.S. 9-2-1214;

18 (ii) Disburse the funds appropriated in

19 accordance with awards made by the board pursuant to W.S.

20 9-2-1214.

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22 **9-2-1214**. Disbursement of grants.

- 1 (a) From the funds available for distribution, the
- board may award grants to senior centers throughout the 2
- 3 state to support the purposes specified in W.S.
- 4 9-2-1212(a)(ii). The division on aging shall disburse the
- 5 funds in accordance with awards made by the board under
- this section. 6

- (b) Notwithstanding W.S. 9-4-207, unobligated or 8
- 9 unencumbered funds retained by the division on aging under
- 10 this section shall not lapse at the end of a fiscal period
- 11 and shall remain available for distribution as provided in
- 12 this section.

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- 14 (c) The board, in consultation with the division on
- aging, shall by rule and regulation establish a formula for 15
- distribution of funds available for distribution under this 16
- section as follows: 17

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- 19 (i) Each eligible senior center in the state may
- 20 receive a basic grant not to exceed twenty thousand dollars
- 21 (\$20,000.00) from the funds available for distribution;

- 23 (ii) Of the amounts remaining after the basic
- 24 grants are awarded, the board shall award grants to

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    eligible senior centers based on the formula developed by
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    the division on aging and approved by the board.
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         9-2-1215. Biennial report by board.
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    Beginning September 1, 2003, the board shall report to the
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 7
    division on aging, the governor and the joint labor, health
    and social services interim committee no later than
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 9
    September 1 of each odd-numbered year with respect to the
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    grants awarded, and how those grants have benefited senior
11
    citizens in the state.
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         Section 2. W.S. 9-2-1201(a) is amended to read:
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         9-2-1201. Definitions.
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         (a) As used in this act:
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              (i) "Board" means the Wyoming senior services
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    advisory board created by W.S. 9-2-1211;
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              (ii) "Division on aging" means the division
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    within the Wyoming department of health designated pursuant
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to W.S. 9-2-1302 (a) (iv);

2 (iii) "Senior center" means an organization that 3 receives funds under the federal administration on aging 4 Title IIIB supportive services program or Title IIIC 5 nutrition program, excluding organizations that only receive Title IIIB supportive services funds used 6 7 exclusively for transportation. The term "senior center" may include a community facility or statewide service, 8 9 which is the focal point for providing a broad spectrum of 10 services including health, mental health, social, nutritional, recreational and educational services for 11 12 senior citizens; 13 14 (iv) "Senior citizen" means any person sixty 15 (60) years of age or older; 16 17  $\frac{\text{(ii)}}{\text{(v)}}$  "This act" means W.S. 9-2-1201 through 18 <del>-1208</del>-9-2-1215.

20 Section 3. There is appropriated two million five 21 hundred thousand dollars (\$2,500,000.00) from the general 22 fund to the division on aging to administer the Wyoming senior services board and to provide grants authorized by 23 this act for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2003. 24
