2 (a) Except as provided by subsection (b) of this 3 section, if criminality of conduct in this article depends 4 on a victim being under sixteen (16) seventeen (17) years 5 of age or younger, it is an affirmative defense that the actor reasonably believed that the victim was sixteen (16) 6 7 eighteen (18) years of age or older.
