A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to railroads; authorizing the appointment
- 2 of rail police officers; specifying qualifications and
- 3 authority; specifying responsibility for liability arising
- 4 from the acts or omissions of rail police officers;
- 5 conforming provisions relating to peace officers; and
- 6 providing for an effective date.

8 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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10 **Section 1.** W.S. 37-9-1401 is created to read:

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12 **37-9-1401**. Rail police officers.

- 14 (a) A Class 1 railroad company as defined by 49
- 15 C.F.R. Part 1201, may appoint one (1) or more persons to be

1 designated by the railroad company as a rail police officer

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4 (i) Employees, passengers or patrons of the rail

5 carrier;

to protect:

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7 (ii) Property, equipment and facilities owned,

leased, operated or maintained by the rail carrier; 8

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10 (iii) Property moving in interstate or foreign

commerce in the possession of the rail carrier; and 11

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13 (iv) Personnel, equipment and material moving by

rail that are vital to the national defense. 14

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16 (b) While in the scope of employment, each appointed

17 rail police officer may possess and exercise the powers of

a peace officer in connection with a violation of law on 18

railroad premises upon certification by the peace officer 19

20 standards and training commission pursuant to W.S. 9-1-701

21 through 9-1-707. The railroad company shall provide

22 identification information that includes the officer's

name, badge or employee number, location of 23

24 residence, primary employment and other necessary 1 information as requested by the peace officer standards and

2 training commission.

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4 (c) A railroad company appointing a rail police

5 officer shall be responsible for any liability arising from

the acts or omissions of the rail police officer within the 6

scope of employment. The rail police officer is entitled 7

to any defense to liability to the same extent as otherwise 8

9 provided a peace officer under the provisions of the

10 Wyoming Governmental Claims Act, but shall not be subject

11 to the maximum liability limitations provided by W.S.

1-39-118. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, 12

13 neither the state nor any political subdivision of the

14 state is required to provide insurance or is liable for any

act or omission of a rail police officer. 15

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(j) In the case of termination of a peace officer, 22

If the officer is terminated for failure to 3 comply with this act, or rules promulgated under it, the Any officer who has been 4 notice shall so specify. 5 terminated may present a written statement to the commission responding to the claims made against him or 6 7 setting forth the facts and reasons for the termination as he believes them to be, and that statement shall become a 8 9 permanent part of the file. A potential employer may 10 contact the commission to inquire as to the facts and 11 reasons an officer was terminated from any previous 12 employing agency. Unless otherwise prohibited by law, the 13 commission shall, upon request provide to the potential 14 employer all pertinent information which is in its possession. 15

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(m) A person who is employed as a rail police officer pursuant to 49 U.S.C. § 28101 is ineligible to act as a peace officer upon a finding by the commission that the person has acted beyond the limitations contained either in 49 U.S.C. \S 28101 or W.S. 37-9-1401. If the person has been certified under this section, his certification shall be automatically revoked on the date the commission
