A BILL

for

1 ACT relating to wildlife; providing for the 2 reclassification, harvesting and other regulation of gray 3 wolves as trophy game animals as specified; providing for 4 the regulation of wolf hybrids; providing a definition of 5 livestock for purposes of the game and fish provisions; 6 providing for meetings and for rulemaking; prohibiting the 7 private ownership of wolves and wolf hybrids; providing a statement of legislative intent; providing 8 implementation and reports; making conforming amendments; 9 10 and providing for an effective date.

12 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

13

14 **Section 1.** W.S. 23-1-108 and 23-1-304 are created to

15 read:

- 2 23-1-108. Delisting of gray wolves as experimental,
- 3 nonessential population, endangered species or threatened
- 4 species.

- 6 Gray wolves shall be deemed removed from the list of
- 7 experimental nonessential population, endangered species or
- 8 threatened species in Wyoming upon final publication in the
- 9 Federal Register by appropriate federal agencies removing
- 10 the gray wolf from all listings as an experimental
- 11 nonessential population, endangered species or threatened
- 12 species in Wyoming.

23-1-304. Classification of gray wolves.

- 16 (a) The commission shall determine the classification
- 17 of gray wolves as provided in this section. In making this
- 18 classification the commission shall rely upon information
- 19 provided by department personnel and shall consult with the
- 20 Wyoming animal damage management board created by W.S.
- 21 11-6-303 and the director of the Wyoming department of
- 22 agriculture, and consider any additional information
- 23 provided by that board and by that director.

1 (b) The department shall provide to the commission at

least a quarterly monitoring report on the number of gray 2

3 wolf packs within this state and their general location.

Within thirty (30) days of receiving a department report 4

5 the commission shall at a public meeting:

Determine if there are less than seven (7) 7 (i)

packs of gray wolves located in this state and primarily 8

9 outside of Yellowstone National Park, Grand Teton National

10 Park and John D. Rockefeller, Jr. Memorial Parkway and less

than fifteen (15) packs within this state, including 11

Yellowstone National Park, Grand Teton National Park and 12

13 John D. Rockefeller, Jr. Memorial Parkway. If such a

16 The commission shall adopt rules and (A)

17 regulations to classify the gray wolf as a trophy game

animal and prohibit the taking of gray wolves except as 18

19 provided by W.S. 23-3-115(c), within that area of the state

20 the commission determines is necessary to reasonably ensure

21 seven (7) packs of gray wolves are located in this state

22 and primarily outside of Yellowstone National Park, Grand

Teton National Park and John D. Rockefeller, Jr. Memorial 23

24 Parkway at the end of the current calendar year;

2 (B) At any time that gray wolves are

3 classified as trophy game animals outside of any area

4 specified in W.S. 23-1-101(a)(xii)(B)(I), the commission

5 shall:

7 (I) Meet in public not less than once

8 every ninety (90) days to review the classification and

9 determine the need for its continuance;

11 (II) In consultation with the director

12 of the Wyoming department of agriculture, upon receipt of

13 information from the department of agriculture, consider

14 the reclassification of wolves in all or a portion of such

15 area at the commission's next scheduled meeting, or at an

16 earlier meeting of the commission as the commission deems

17 desirable or necessary.

19 (ii) Maintain the classification of gray wolves

20 as a predatory animal and trophy game animal as specified

21 in W.S. 23-1-101(a) (viii) and (xii) (B) (I), if it determines

22 there were at least seven (7) packs of gray wolves located

23 in this state and primarily outside of Yellowstone National

24 Park, Grand Teton National Park and John D. Rockefeller,

- 1 Jr. Memorial Parkway or at least fifteen (15) packs within
- this state, including Yellowstone National Park, Grand 2
- 3 Teton National Park and John D. Rockefeller, Jr. Memorial
- 4 Parkway as of the end of the preceding calendar quarter.

- (c) For purposes of this section "pack" means five 6
- (5) or more gray wolves traveling together. If a group of 7
- gray wolves consists of more than ten (10) animals known to 8
- 9 be traveling together, the commission may, at its
- 10 discretion, recognize the number of packs within such a
- group to be equal to the number of reproductively mature 11
- 12 females bearing young found within that group of wolves.

- 14 The department shall institute and maintain an (d)
- 15 active program of population monitoring statewide. In all
- 16 areas of the state, except where otherwise provided, any
- 17 person who harvests a wolf shall notify the department
- where the harvest occurred within ten (10) days. 18
- 19 information regarding the number or nature of wolves
- 20 legally harvested within the state of Wyoming shall only be
- 21 released in its aggregate form and no information of a
- 22 private or confidential nature shall be released without
- 23 the written consent of the person to whom the information
- may refer. 24 Information identifying any person legally

- 1 harvesting a wolf within this state is solely for the use
- 2 of the department or appropriate law enforcement offices
- 3 and is not a public record for purposes of W.S. 16-4-201
- 4 through 16-4-205.

- (e) This section shall apply from and after the date 6
- 7 gray wolves are removed from the list of experimental
- nonessential population, endangered species or threatened 8
- 9 species in Wyoming as provided by W.S. 23-1-108.

9	23-1-103. Ownership of wildlife; purpose of
10	provisions.

12	For the purpose of this act, all wildlife in Wyoming is the
13	property of the state. It is the purpose of this act and
14	the policy of the state to provide an adequate and flexible
15	system for control, propagation, management, protection and
16	regulation of all Wyoming wildlife. There shall be no
17	private ownership of live animals classified in this act as
18	big or trophy game animals or of any wolf or wolf hybrid.

20	23-1-302. Powers and duties.

22	(a) The commission is directed and empowered:

5 (e) When hunting antelope, bighorn sheep, black bear, deer, mountain goat or mountain lion the longbow hunter 6 must be equipped with a longbow of not less than forty (40) 7 pounds draw weight or possessing the ability to cast a 8 9 hunting arrow of four hundred (400) grain weight at least 10 one hundred sixty (160) yards. When hunting elk, grizzly 11 bear or moose, the longbow hunter must be equipped with a 12 longbow of not less than fifty (50) pounds draw weight or 13 possessing the ability to cast a hunting arrow of five 14 hundred (500) grain weight at least one hundred sixty (160) yards. The crossbow hunter must be equipped with a crossbow 15 of not less than ninety (90) pounds draw weight which has a 16 17 minimum draw length of fourteen (14) inches (from front of bow to back of string in the cocked position), a positive 18 safety mechanism, and, except as provided in subsection (f) 19 20 of this section, which must be cocked by hand without the 21 aid of leverage-gaining devices. Crossbow bolts must be at 22 least sixteen (16) inches long. The broadhead of arrows or bolts shall be of sharp steel with a minimum cutting width 23 of one (1) 24 inch. The provisions of this subsection

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1 relating to the hunting of antelope, bighorn sheep, black

- 2 bear, deer, mountain goat and mountain lion shall also
- 3 apply to the hunting of the gray wolf as a trophy game
- 4 animal from and after the date gray wolves are removed from
- 5 the list of experimental nonessential population,
- 6 endangered species or threatened species in Wyoming as

9 23-2-303. Trapping licenses; tagging; traps and

10 snares; penalty; confiscation.

- 12 All traps and snares used for furbearing or
- 13 predatory animals shall be permanently marked or tagged
- 14 the name and address of the owner the
- identification number assigned to the owner 15 by the
- 16 department. Any identification number attached to a trap or
- 17 snare pursuant to this subsection is solely for the use of
- the department or appropriate law enforcement officers and 18
- 19 is not a public record for purposes of W.S. 16-4-201
- 20 through 16-4-205. No trap or snare shall be set for
- 21 furbearing or predatory animals within thirty (30) feet of
- 22 any exposed bait or carcass over five (5) pounds in weight.

license except as otherwise permitted by this act is quilty 11

12 of a 4th degree misdemeanor.

14 23-3-115. Taking black bear, mountain lion, gray

15 wolf, bobcat, weasel, badger, squirrels or muskrat for

16 damaging property.

18 (c) The provisions of subsection (a) of this section

19 relating to the taking of animals doing damage to private

20 property shall apply to gray wolves from and after the date

21 gray wolves are removed from the list of experimental

22 nonessential population, endangered species or threatened

species in Wyoming as provided by W.S. 23-1-108. The owner, 23

24 employee or lessee acting under authority of this section 1 shall notify the department of the killing of a gray wolf

2 within an area of the state in which the gray wolf is

3 classified as a trophy game animal. The notification shall

4 be made within ten (10) days of the kill unless the gray

5 wolf was taken in an area where wolves have been classified

as trophy game animals pursuant to W.S. 23-1-304(b)(i)(A) 6

7 in which case the notification shall be made within

8 seventy-two (72) hours.

13 (a) No person shall import into Wyoming from any

14 source any living antelope, bear, deer, elk, moose,

mountain goat, mountain lion, bighorn sheep, wolf, wolf 15

hybrid nor any living wildlife except as otherwise 16

17 permitted by this act.

(b) No person shall sell any living antelope, bear, 19

20 deer, elk, moose, mountain goat, mountain lion, bighorn

21 sheep, wolf, wolf hybrid or falcon except as permitted by

22 the commission.

- 5 (a) No person shall take or wound any game animal,
- game bird, or game fish by use of any pit, pitfall, net, 6

- 22 (a) It is the purpose of this act, unless the
- introduction of the gray wolf into Wyoming is determined by 23
- 24 lawful authorities not to have been in accordance with

1 federal law, to provide appropriate state management and

control of gray wolves in order to facilitate the removal 2

3 of the gray wolf from its listing as an experimental

4 nonessential population, endangered species or threatened

5 species in Wyoming and to prevent future listing of the

gray wolf as an experimental nonessential population, 6

7 endangered species or threatened species.

8

9 In providing appropriate state management and (b)

control of gray wolves, the state acknowledges the need to 10

11 fill the current vacuum of management of this species

12 The state retains all rights to within the state.

13 investigate and, if determined by state officials to be

14 appropriate, take legal actions against the federal

government relating to the introduction of the gray wolf 15

16 into the boundaries of this state.

17

18 (c) In order to accomplish the purposes of this act,

the game and fish commission shall enter into a memorandum 19

20 of understanding with appropriate federal agencies under

21 which the commission and federal agencies shall endeavor to

22 manage the prey base for gray wolves in a manner to

23 maintain a sufficient prey base in Yellowstone National

24 Park, Grand Teton National Park and John D. Rockefeller, 1 Jr. Memorial Parkway within the state for at least eight

- 2 (8) packs of wolves. The game and fish commission shall
- 3 endeavor to manage big game populations providing a prey
- 4 base for seven (7) packs of gray wolves in all other areas
- 5 of the state in such a manner as to mitigate to the
- greatest extent possible, adverse effects on opportunities 6
- 7 for licensed hunters to take big game.

8

- 9 (d) The game and fish commission shall report to the
- joint travel, recreation, wildlife and cultural resources 10
- 11 interim committee not later than September 1, 2003,
- 12 regarding the implementation of this act.

13

- 14 Section 5. This act is effective immediately upon
- completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law 15
- as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming 16
- Constitution. 17
