Emergency insect management.

## A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to emergency insect management programs; establishing a committee to assist with development of 2 3 insect management programs; imposing additional duties upon the department of agriculture and authorizing advisory 4 5 assistance; requiring the department of agriculture to provide administrative support; creating a special revenue 6 account; providing for assistance to political subdivisions 7 8 for insect suppression programs; imposing conditions and 9 criteria; providing for initial appointments, meetings and program rules; providing appropriations; and providing for 10 an effective date. 11

13 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

15 **Section 1.** W.S. 11-5-401 through 11-5-406 are created

3 EMERGENCY INSECT MANAGEMENT PROGRAM

5 **11-5-401. Definitions.** 

6

7 (a) As used in this article:

8

- 9 (i) "Account" means the emergency insect
- 10 management special revenue account created under W.S.
- 11 11-5-402;

12

- 13 (ii) "Committee" means the emergency insect
- 14 management committee established under W.S. 11-5-403;

15

- 16 (iii) "Insect pests" mean infestations of
- 17 grasshoppers, Mormon crickets or other cyclic or outbreak
- 18 insect infestations or insect species new, recently
- 19 introduced or which present a substantial possibility to be
- 20 introduced into Wyoming such as fire ants, Africanized
- 21 honeybees or other insect pests;

- 23 (iv) "Insect vectors" mean blood-feeding
- 24 arthropods, mosquitoes, biting flies and other such insects

- 1 that harbor or transmit pathogens harmful to human health
- 2 and safety, animal health including livestock and wildlife,
- 3 agriculture or natural resources.

- 5 11-5-402. Emergency insect management special revenue
- account; established; expenditures. 6

7

- (a) The emergency insect management program special 8
- 9 revenue account is created to consist of funds appropriated
- 10 or designated to the account by law for the emergency
- 11 management of insect pests or insect vectors.

12

- 13 The department of agriculture shall distribute
- 14 funds from the account as directed by the emergency
- management allocation committee under this article for the 15
- 16 emergency management of insect pests and insect vectors.

17

- 18 11-5-403. Emergency insect management allocation
- 19 committee; membership; terms; expenses; administrative
- 20 support.

- 22 The emergency insect management allocation (a)
- committee is established to be comprised of the following 23
- 24 nine (9) members:

2	(i) The governor or his designee;

4	(ii) The president of the Wyoming state senate
5	or his designee;

7	(iii) The speaker of the Wyoming state house of
8	representatives or his designee;
9	
10	(iv) The director of the department of health or
11	his designee;

13	(v) The director of the department of
14	agriculture or his designee;
15	
16	(vi) The Wyoming state veterinarian;
17	
18	(vii) The director of the department of game and
19	fish or his designee;
20	
21	(viii) A representative of the Wyoming weed and
22	nest council appointed by the governor, and

1 (ix) A representative of the Wyoming mosquito

2 management association appointed by the governor.

3

4 (b) Terms of members appointed to the committee under

5 subsection (a) of this section shall be for four (4) years.

6

7 (c) The committee shall at the first meeting of each

8 year, elect a chairman. Meetings shall be held at the call

9 of the chairman, which shall not be less than once every

10 three (3) months. Appointed committee members who are not

11 employed by the state nor any political subdivision of the

12 state shall receive reimbursement for actual and necessary

13 expenses and mileage allowance at the rate established by

14 law for state employees. Administrative support to the

15 committee shall be provided by the department of

16 agriculture. Expenses of the committee incurred under this

17 article including administrative support shall be paid from

18 the account.

19

20 11-5-404. Program development; additional committee

21 responsibilities; annual report.

22

23 (a) Emergency insect management programs developed

24 and receiving funds from the account under this article

1 shall be based upon integrated pest management principles

using the most current, scientifically valid methods to 2

3 manage insect pests and vectors.

4

5 Subject to subsection (a) of this section, the

committee shall by rule and regulation establish policies, 6

standards and guidelines for programs receiving funds from 7

the account under this article. In accordance with 8

9 established program guidelines and policies, the committee

10 shall review applications for participation submitted under

11 this article, and based upon its review and evaluation,

approve or disapprove program applications and if approved, 12

13 establish the amount of program funding from the account.

14

(c) In addition to subsection (b) of this section, 15

the committee shall, in cooperation with the governor, 16

17 collect and compile data necessary to determine

emergency insect management programs under this article 18

19 involve any threatened or endangered species under the

20 federal Endangered Species Act of 1973, 16 U.S.C. 1531 et

21 seq., as amended. If programs involve such species, the

22 committee, in cooperation with the governor, shall request

an exemption from federal regulation under this act for 23

24 insect management purposes.

- 2 (d) The committee shall adopt necessary rules and
- 3 regulations to implement this article and establish
- 4 necessary procedures to process applications filed pursuant
- 5 to this article.

6

- 7 (e) In addition to subsection (d) of this section,
- the committee shall annually report its activities for each 8
- 9 fiscal period as required under W.S. 9-2-1014.

10

- 11-5-405. Advisory assistance; assistance specified; 11
- 12 expenses.

13

- (a) To assist with the establishment of policies, 14
- guidelines and the development of programs under this 15
- article, the committee may assemble necessary expertise 16
- 17 from one (1) or more of the following organizations,
- institutions, groups or individuals: 18

- 20 (i) The Wyoming county commissioners
- 21 association;

23 (ii) The Wyoming association of municipalities;

- 1 11-5-406. Program participation requirements;
- 2 application; funding participation levels specified;
- 3 restriction on expenditures.

- 5 (a) Any state agency or political subdivision may
- 6 apply to the committee for participation in emergency
- 7 insect management programs under this article.
- 8 Applications shall be filed with the department of
- 9 agriculture and shall at minimum, substantiate compliance
- 10 with standards and guidelines established by the committee.

11

- 12 (b) Emergency management program participation under
- 13 this article shall be subject to the following
- 14 requirements:

15

- 16 (i) Insect vector management programs or
- 17 nonoutbreak insect programs shall receive not more than
- 18 fifty percent (50%) of total program costs from the
- 19 account;

- 21 (ii) Subject to paragraph (iii) of this
- 22 subsection, a reactive program for the suppression of
- 23 outbreaks of grasshoppers, Mormon crickets or other
- 24 outbreak insects on state and private lands shall receive

1 not more than fifty percent (50%) of total program costs

2 from the account;

3

4 (iii) If the emergency insect management program

5 under paragraph (ii) of this subsection is for grasshopper

6 suppression, the program shall consist of treatments

7 targeting infestations greater than two thousand (2,000)

8 acres or those suppressing less than the entire infestation

9 regardless of size;

10

11 (iv) Subject to paragraph (v) of this

12 subsection, a proactive, preventative program targeting

13 incipient infestations of grasshoppers, Mormon crickets or

14 other outbreak insects on state and private lands, with the

15 potential to expand into outbreaks, shall receive not more

16 than seventy-five percent (75%) of total program costs from

17 the account;

18

19 (v) If the emergency insect management program

20 under paragraph (iv) of this subsection is for

21 grasshoppers, the program shall include up to two thousand

22 (2,000) acres if the entire infestation is included within

23 the program;

24

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(vi) During the first three (3) years of operation of any emergency insect management program, not more than twenty percent (20%) of funds provided to the program from the account shall be used for administrative costs, equipment and mapping activities, and not more than

 $\,$  6 ten percent (10%) of such funds shall be used for these

7 purposes in subsequent years;

8

9 (vii) In addition to paragraph (vi) of this 10 subsection and during the first three (3) years of program 11 operation, not more than twenty percent (20%) of funds 12 provided from the account to any program shall be expended 13 for applied research specifically designed to provide 14 immediate results directly in support of improved integrated pest management practices, and not more than ten 15 16 percent (10%) of such funds may be used for this purpose in 17 subsequent years.

## 19 Section 2.

20

21 (a) There is appropriated one hundred thousand 22 dollars (\$100,000.00) from the general fund to the 23 emergency insect management program special revenue account

- established under W.S. 11-5-402, as created by section 1 of 1
- 2 this act, to be used for the purposes of:

- 4 (i) Developing a statewide coordinated response
- 5 to the threat of insect infestations; and

6

- 7 (ii) Public education regarding health issues
- arising out of these threatened insect infestations. 8

9

- 10 (b) There is appropriated five hundred thousand
- 11 dollars (\$500,000.00) from the general fund to the
- emergency insect management program special revenue account 12
- to be expended, only with the authorization of the 13
- governor, for purposes of responding to unanticipated 14
- emergencies under this act. 15

16

- 17 (c) The statewide response shall evaluate statewide
- resources that are available and are being used for the 18
- purposes specified in this section. 19

20

21 Section 3.

- 23 (a) Initial appointments to the emergency insect
- 24 management allocation committee pursuant to W.S.

- 11-5-403(a) (viii) and (ix), as created under section 1 of 1
- 2 this act, shall be made by the governor as soon as possible
- 3 after the effective date of this act, but in any event, not
- 4 later than May 1, 2003.

- The committee shall organize by May 31, 2003, and 6
- 7 commence implementation of this act in sufficient time to
- begin emergency insect management programs under this act 8
- 9 during calendar year 2003.

10

- 11 (c) The department of agriculture shall, on behalf of
- 12 the committee and upon the effective date of this act,
- 13 commence development of rules and regulations necessary to
- implement this act. The rules and regulations shall be 14
- submitted to the committee at the initial meeting held 15
- 16 pursuant to subsection (b) of this section.

17

- 18 Section 4. This act is effective immediately upon
- completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law 19
- 20 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the
- 21 Constitution.
