Breastfeeding resolution.

## A Bill

for

1 A JOINT RESOLUTION recognizing breastfeeding's value to the

2 state and its citizens.

3

- 4 WHEREAS, the American Academy of Pediatrics issued a policy
- 5 statement in 1997 saying, "Extensive research, especially
- 6 in recent years, documents diverse and compelling
- 7 advantages to infants, mothers, families, and society from
- 8 breastfeeding and the use of human milk for infant feeding.
- 9 These include health, nutritional, immunological,
- 10 developmental, psychological, social, economic, and
- 11 environmental benefits"; and

12

- 13 WHEREAS, breastfeeding provides significant health benefits
- 14 to the mother as well. Breastfeeding provides maternal
- 15 protection from breast cancer, osteoporosis, urinary tract
- 16 infections and other cancers. A survey of previous research

- 1 indicates the incidence of breast cancer in the United
- 2 States and other developed countries would be reduced by
- 3 forty-two percent (42%) by longer duration of
- 4 breastfeeding; and

5

- 6 WHEREAS, many new mothers choose to use formula or other
- 7 artificial food rather than to breastfeed even before they
- 8 leave the hospital, and only a small percentage of all
- 9 mothers are still breastfeeding when their babies are six
- 10 (6) months old; and

- 12 WHEREAS, studies now show that babies who are not breastfed
- 13 have higher rates of death, meningitis, childhood leukemia
- 14 and other cancers, diabetes, respiratory illnesses,
- 15 bacterial and viral infections, diarrheal diseases, otitis
- 16 media, allergies, obesity and developmental delays.
- 17 Breastfeeding may raise an infant's intelligence quotient;
- 18 and

- 20 WHEREAS, the social constraints of modern society weigh
- 21 against the choice of breastfeeding and lead new mothers
- 22 with demanding time schedules and uninformed employers to
- 23 opt for formula feeding; and

- 1 WHEREAS, any genuine promotion of family values should
- 2 encourage public acceptance of this most basic act of
- 3 nurture between a mother and her child and no mother should
- 4 be made to feel incriminated or embarrassed for
- 5 breastfeeding her child.

- 7 Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved By The Members of the
- 8 Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

9

- 10 **Section 1.** That the Wyoming State Legislature
- 11 recognizes that breastfeeding is an important and basic act
- 12 of nurture which should be encouraged in the interests of
- 13 maternal and child health.

14

- 15 **Section 2.** That the Legislature encourages
- 16 breastfeeding in all situations and congratulates
- 17 employers, both in the public and the private sector, who
- 18 accommodate breastfeeding mothers.

19

- 20 **Section 3.** That the Legislature supports the right of
- 21 a woman to breastfeed in any location where she has the
- 22 right to be with her child.

1 Section 4. That the Legislature strongly encourages

2 any state agency that administers programs providing

maternal or child health services to provide information 3

4 that encourages breastfeeding to program participants who

5 are pregnant women or mothers with infants.
