2004 STATE OF WYOMING 04LSO-0069.W3 (a) As used in W.S. 7-2-101 through 7-2-107: 1 2 (iv) "Peace officer" means: 3 4 5 (G) Any superintendent, assistant superintendent or full-time park ranger of any state park 6 7 or historic site who has qualified pursuant to W.S. 9-1-701 through 9-1-707, when acting within the boundaries of the 8 state park or historic site, or when responding to a 9 10 request to assist other peace officers performing their 11 official duties acting pursuant to W.S. 7-2-106; 12 13 7-2-106. Extraterritorial authority of peace 14 officers; requests for assignment of peace officers; liability; compensation. 15 16 17 (a) All authority that applies to peace officers as defined in W.S. 7-2-101(a)(iv)(A) through (G) and (N), when 18 19 performing their functions and duties within the 20 territorial limits of the respective city, county, college, 21 university, state park, state historic site, state agency 22 or political subdivision in which they are employed shall apply to them outside those territorial limits to the same 23

2	conditions exist:
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4	(i) The peace officer is responding to a request
5	to assist another peace officer performing his official
6	duties;
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8	(ii) The peace officer possesses probable cause
9	to believe that a crime is occurring involving a felony or

14	person whom the officer has probable cause to believe has
15	committed within the officer's jurisdiction a violation of
16	a municipal ordinance or state statute, including traffic
17	infractions, or for whom an arrest warrant is outstanding

20	(a)<mark>(</mark>b) The chief of police of any municipality or his
21	designee, or the sheriff of any county or his designee,
22	subject to in accordance with the rules and procedures
23	established by the governing body of any municipality or
24	county, may request the chief of police of any other

1 municipality, or his designee, or the sheriff of any other 2 county, or his designee, to assign certified peace officers under their respective command to perform temporary law 3 enforcement duties relating to a specific incident within 4 5 the jurisdiction of the requesting chief of police or sheriff. and under the direction and control of the 6 7 requesting chief or sheriff. Peace officers, while so assigned and performing duties, are subject to the 8 9 direction and control of the requesting chief or sheriff 10 and shall have full peace officer's officer authority 11 within the requesting agency's jurisdiction during the temporary assignment. 12

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14 (b) (c) A peace officer designated in subsection 15 acting pursuant to subsections (a) or (b) of this section 16 who makes an arrest or issues a citation pursuant to this 17 section outside his own jurisdiction shall be deemed to be acting within the scope of his duties for purposes of the 18 19 Wyoming Governmental Claims Act and the state 20 self-insurance program, W.S. 1-41-101 through 1-41-111 or 21 the local government self-insurance program, W.S. 1-42-101 22 through 1-42-207. All privileges and immunities from 23 liability, and all pension, disability, worker's 24 compensation and other benefits which normally apply to

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1 peace officers while they perform their duties in their own 2 jurisdiction shall also apply to them when acting as 3 provided in subsection subsections (a) or (b) of this 4 section. For purposes of W.S. 27-14-104, the requesting and 5 assigning law enforcement agencies shall be a joint employer as defined under W.S. 27-14-102(a)(xix) and the 6 7 designated peace officer shall be a joint employee as defined under W.S. 27-14-102(a)(xxi). The cost of salary 8 9 and benefits accruing to a peace officer, while performing 10 duties at the request of another law enforcement 11 jurisdiction, shall be borne by the individual peace 12 officer's own employing agency. The cost of any damage to 13 equipment belonging to the officer or his employer occurring while acting under the provisions of this section 14 shall be borne by the requesting law enforcement agency. 15

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22 (b) The director may employ assistants, instructors and other personnel as approved by the attorney general 23 24 with the consent of the governor. The attorney general may

appoint the director as a peace officer, if qualified 1 2 pursuant to W.S. 9-1-701 through 9-1-707. The director may 3 appoint full-time staff instructors who qualify pursuant to 4 W.S. 9-1-701 through 9-1-707 to perform as peace officers. Persons appointed as peace officers pursuant to this 5 subsection shall be considered peace officers only: 6 7 8 (iv) While responding to requests to assist other peace officers performing their official duties 9 10 acting pursuant to W.S. 7-2-106. 11 12 Section 2. This act is effective immediately upon completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law 13 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming 14 15 Constitution. 16
