1	AN ACT relating to school finance and auditing; creating
2	the school finance and audit department within the
3	legislative department of government; prescribing duties
4	pertaining to school finance and school and state agency
5	audits; transferring legislative management audit and
6	school finance audit functions; providing appropriations;
7	providing funds, positions and function transfers;
8	specifying intent; and providing for an effective date.
9	
10	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:
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12	Section 1. W.S. 28-8-116 is created to read:
13	
14	28-8-116. Legislative school finance and audit
15	department; auditing of data related to administration of
16	the school finance system.
17	

1 (a) The legislative school finance and audit 2 department shall develop necessary expertise regarding the finance system to advise the legislature 3 school in 4 performing its duties related to school finance. 5 (b) As used in this section, "school finance system" 6 7 shall be as defined in W.S. 21-2-203(a). The department shall: 8 9 10 (i) Conduct periodic audits of each school 11 district pertaining to data required to be submitted to the 12 department of education under law and by rule and 13 regulation of the state superintendent of public 14 instruction for purposes of implementing and operating the school finance system. Audits under this paragraph shall 15 16 include audits of systems supporting data collection and 17 shall be performed on each school district at least once 18 within each three (3) year period;

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20 (ii) Conduct management studies of school 21 districts including program evaluations and performance 22 audits, on issues identified by the advisory committee to 23 the division of data management and reporting of the

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1 department of education, as established under W.S.
2 21-2-203(d);

3

4 (iii) Conduct compliance and effectiveness and 5 efficiency audits of the state department of education with 6 respect to data used in the school finance system, 7 implementation and computations under the school finance 8 system and the allocation of funds to school districts 9 through the school finance system;

10

(iv) Report findings and recommendations to the department of education resulting from audits and studies conducted on school districts pursuant to this subsection, including recommendations for remedies to identified problems and issues and including the identification and quantification of amounts involved in audit report and study findings;

19 (v) Provide a written report of each audit or 20 study to the school district for which the audit or report 21 was conducted;

23 (vi) Maintain a written report of each audit and 24 study conducted under this section;

2 Establish a process to ensure school (vii) 3 districts and the department of education address and 4 resolve any problems identified within audit and report 5 findings and recommendations and establish the 6 determination of the materiality levels for findings; 7

8 (viii) Provide an annual report to the legislature on audits and studies conducted by 9 the 10 department under this section and on district and 11 department of education efforts to resolve identified 12 problems within the audits and reports. Reports under this 13 paragraph shall include written responses by the districts 14 and the department of education submitted in accordance with subsection (c) of this section. 15

16

17 (C) School districts and the department of education shall provide access to all data and other information and 18 19 shall cooperate with the department as necessary to 20 implement this section and to conduct audits and reports 21 required under this section. In addition, each district 22 shall within thirty (30) days following receipt of a copy of the audit or report, file a written response to each 23 24 audit or report conducted on that district with the

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department. The state superintendent shall on behalf of the department of education and within thirty (30) days following receipt of a report or audit on the department of education, file a written response to the report with the legislative school finance and audit department.

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7 (d) The administrator or his designee shall 8 participate in the advisory committee to the division of 9 data management and reporting of the department of 10 education, as required under W.S. 21-2-203(d).

11

12 The management council shall promulgate rules (e) 13 regarding standards and procedures for auditing of school district data required to be provided to the department of 14 education under W.S. 21-2-203. These rules shall apply to 15 department school finance audit staff. These rules shall 16 17 be in accordance with standards under W.S. 16-4-121(c) and 28-8-107(e) to the extent those are reasonably applicable, 18 but shall otherwise be established to ensure that school 19 20 districts accurately and completely account for and report 21 data to the department of education necessary to implement 22 the school finance system.

(e) Within forty-five (45) days after the end of each 18 19 legislative session, the legislative service office school 20 finance and audit department shall provide the management 21 audit committee with a list of each new major program and 22 major modifications to existing programs provided for by 23 law, including programs added through а general 24 appropriations act or through individual bill enactments,

8	LEGISLATIVE SERVICE OFFICE AND LEGISLATIVE SCHOOL FINANCE
9	AND AUDIT DEPARTMENT

11	28-8-101. Creation; composition.
12	
13	(a) There is created the legislative service office
14	within the legislative branch of government. hereinafter
15	referred to as the "office". The office shall be composed
16	of the services division and the audit budget and fiscal
17	division.
18	
19	(b) There is created the legislative school finance
20	and audit department within the legislative branch.
21	
22	(c) As used in this article:
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1 (i) "Administrator" means the administrator of 2 the department; 3 4 (ii) "Department" means the legislative school 5 finance and audit department; 6 7 (iii) "Director" means the director of the 8 office; 9 10 (iv) "Office" means the legislative service 11 office. 12 13 28-8-102. Management council; membership; vacancies; meetings; rules and regulations; quorum; officers. 14 15 16 (a) Activities of the office and the department shall 17 be directed by a management council composed of the president, vice president, majority and minority floor 18 19 leaders or their respective designees of the senate, plus 20 two (2) senators selected at large not more than one (1) of 21 which shall be from the same political party as the 22 president; and the speaker, speaker pro tempore, majority 23 and minority floor leaders or their respective designees of 24 the house plus two (2) representatives selected at large,

1 not more than one (1) of which shall be from the same 2 political party as the speaker. The two (2) senators 3 selected at large shall be selected by caucus of the two 4 political parties in the senate, (2) major meeting 5 separately, and the (2) representatives selected at large shall be selected by caucus of the two (2) major political 6 parties of the house, meeting separately. These twelve (12) 7 members shall select one (1) additional member at large 8 9 from the house of which the chairman of the management 10 council is not a member. The member at large shall not be 11 from the same party as the chairman of the management 12 council. Chairmanship of the management council shall be 13 rotated between the house and senate after each two (2) 14 year session so that the chairman shall not be from the same house as the chairman who served for the preceding 15 16 legislative term. The members of the management council 17 shall be the legislative representatives in directing the day-to-day functions of the office and department and the 18 19 entire membership of the legislature shall have the 20 ultimate control and supervision over policy of the office 21 and department.

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23 (c) The management council may promulgate reasonable 24 rules and regulations for the internal management of the

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1 office and department, including the respective duties of 2 the director, administrator and the staff. The rules of practice comprised in Mason's Manual of Legislative 3 4 Procedure shall govern the management council, all interim 5 committees, and investigative committees in all cases in which they are not inconsistent with the rules and orders 6 as specifically adopted by the management council. 7 8 9 28-8-103. Director, administrator and staff. 10 11 The management council shall appoint by majority vote a director of the office and an administrator of the 12 13 department. The director, subject to the prior approval of 14 the management council, shall appoint an assistant director 15 of legislative services. and an assistant director of audit 16 services. The director and the administrator shall appoint 17 such additional professional, technical and clerical staff as necessary to perform the functions assigned to the 18 19 office and the department. The director, administrator and staff shall be selected without reference to political 20 21 affiliation and shall serve at the pleasure of the 22 appointing authority. They shall be paid salaries and receive necessary expenses as determined by the management 23 24 council.

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2 28-8-104. Direction by legislature during sessions; 3 joint interim committees; requests for services; 4 establishment of priorities; appointment of select 5 committees; vacancies; enlarging committees. 6 (a) The legislature during regular or special session 7 may direct the director, administrator and his staff their 8 9 staffs to perform such studies, duties or services as the 10 legislature may prescribe. 11 12 (b) When the legislature is not in regular or special session, the respective standing committees of the house 13 14 and senate shall function as joint interim committees. Each 15 of these interim committees may request the office and the department to perform specific studies and services for the 16 17 interim committee conditioned only upon receipt of prior 18 approval of the committee's request by the management 19 council. All priorities based upon limitation of time and 20 appropriation of the office shall be established by the 21 management council and followed by the interim committees 22 and individual legislators. Any specific study or service 23 that is approved by the management council, including bill 24 drafting and prefiling, shall be done under the supervision

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1 of the appropriate interim committee or the individual 2 legislator. 3 4 28-8-105. Duties of director and services division; 5 prefiling bills; fiscal notes. 6 7 (a) It shall be the duty of the director, through the services division of the office, to perform the following 8 9 specific functions, together with such other functions as 10 the council may prescribe: 11 (iv) Keep a record of all expenditures of the 12 legislature other than expenditures of the department, and 13 keep a correct inventory and act as custodian of all 14 15 legislative supplies and property other than those supplies and property of the department; 16 17 18 28-8-107. Auditing of state agencies; management 19 audit committee; factors to be considered in audit reports. 20 (b) The legislative service office department, at the 21 22 direction of the management audit committee, subject to management council budget priorities, and subject to 23

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1 general policies established by the legislature when in 2 regular or special session, shall:

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4 The legislative service office department shall (C) 5 prepare a report of each audit conducted and submit a copy of the audit report to the agency being reviewed for 6 comment. The agency has fifteen (15) days, unless otherwise 7 authorized by the committee, to submit a written response 8 9 to the report to the legislative service office department. 10 The completed audit report, which includes the agency 11 response, if any, shall be transmitted to the management 12 audit committee for review and discussion with the agency 13 officials and the legislative auditors. This review and 14 discussion of the audit report shall be conducted by the committee in executive session. Following review the audit 15 16 report may be released unless the committee requests the 17 legislative service office to obtain supplemental information. A copy of the completed report and 18 any supplemental information shall be distributed to 19 the 20 governor and each member of the legislature.

21

22 (d) The contents of the audit report, its findings 23 and documentation are confidential and shall not be 24 disclosed by any member of the management audit committee

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1 or employee of the legislative service office department or 2 agency being audited until the completed audit report is 3 released, but the committee may discuss the contents of the 4 audit report with the governor before release of the final 5 report.

28-8-108. Comments, recommendations and suggestions
in audit reports; disclosure of confidential information;
unauthorized reports or releases.

11 (a) The reports of the legislative service office 12 department may include comments, recommendations and 13 suggestions, but neither the director administrator nor the auditors shall have any authority to enforce them nor shall 14 they otherwise influence or direct executive or legislative 15 16 action. All information obtained by the legislative service 17 office department related to an audit is deemed not to be a public record and shall remain confidential information in 18 the possession of the legislative service office 19 20 department. This information may be disclosed by the 21 legislative service office department only to members of 22 the legislative committee for which the information was 23 obtained, only to the extent necessary to document a

1 statement or report, and only in such a manner as to 2 protect individual identities.

3

4 (b) Any member of the legislative service office 5 department who knowingly discloses confidential information other than as authorized by subsection (a) of this section, 6 discloses the contents of audit reports prohibited by W.S. 7 28-8-107 or releases other reports or information not 8 9 authorized by the management council, the management audit 10 committee or by statute is subject to immediate termination 11 of employment.

13 **28-8-109.** Reports by director to legislature.

14

15 <u>(a)</u> The director and his staff shall prepare and 16 deliver a report of the activities of the office to each 17 member of the next succeeding session of the legislature 18 not later than December 15th of each calendar year, or at 19 such other times as the management council deems necessary 20 or as requested by the legislature.

21

(b) The administrator and his staff shall prepare and deliver a report of the activities of the department to each member of the next succeeding session of the

1	legislature not later than December 15th of each calendar
2	year, or at such other times as the management council
3	deems necessary or as requested by the legislature.

5	28-8-111. Assistance to be provided by state and
6	local officers or agencies; duty of audited agencies.
7	
8	(a) Upon request of the director or administrator and
9	with the approval of the management council or the
10	management audit committee, each officer, board,
11	commission, department or any political subdivision of
12	state government or any local government shall provide
13	assistance, documents and information to the legislative
14	service office and legislative school finance and audit
15	department.
16	
17	28-8-112. Space in state capitol building.
18	
19	Adequate space in the state capitol building shall be
20	provided for the conduct of activities of the legislative
21	service office, legislative school finance and audit
22	department, the management council and its staff.
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28-8-113. Duty of agency officers and employees;
 legislative school finance and audit department access to
 records; failure to provide access; penalty.

5 (a) Any officer or employee of a state agency subject sunset review shall fully assist the 6 to audit or legislative service office legislative school finance and 7 audit department during the course of the audit or review. 8 9 The legislative service office department shall have access 10 to and authority to examine all books, records, accounts, 11 files, correspondence and all other documents, confidential 12 or otherwise, maintained by the agency or its employees 13 during the course of agency business. The provisions of 14 W.S. 16-4-201 through 16-4-205 do not apply to audits or investigations of state agencies performed by or on behalf 15 16 of the legislature or legislative committees. Any member 17 of the legislative service office department who discloses confidential information obtained while conducting an 18 19 audit, to any person or in any manner not authorized by 20 law, is subject to disciplinary action as provided by W.S. 21 28-8-108(b).

23 **31-7-103.** Administration and enforcement.

24

1 The administration of this act shall be exercised by the 2 department which may prescribe forms and reasonable rules and regulations in conformity with this 3 act. The 4 department shall keep records of all monies received and 5 disbursed. The records shall be open to examination by the director of the state department of audit or his designee 6 7 and the audit division of the legislative service office school finance and audit department. The highway patrol and 8 9 all peace officers of any county or municipality shall aid 10 in the enforcement of this act. 11 12 Section 3. W.S. 9-1-513 is repealed. 13 Section 4. 14 15 16 (a) There is transferred from the department of audit 17 to the legislative school finance and audit department created under this act, all records and other information 18 pertaining to the school finance section within 19 the 20 audit, together with all standards department of and 21 procedures for auditing school district data, and all 22 personnel and positions within the school finance section of the department of audit, as necessary to implement this 23 24 act.

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2 There is transferred to the legislative school (b) 3 finance and audit department all personnel and positions of 4 the management audit division within the legislative 5 service office. The management council is authorized to transfer from the budget of the legislative service office 6 to the legislative school finance and audit department 7 those funds contained within legislative budget which are 8 9 appropriated for salaries and benefits of the personnel transferred under this subsection. 10

11

12 The intent of this act is for the legislative (C) 13 school finance and audit department to develop expertise to 14 allow the legislature to use the services of the department in place of consultants previously used for school finance 15 16 The department shall be authorized to participate issues. 17 in each activity authorized under this act regarding development and implementation of 18 the school finance 19 system.

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(d) Any duties and responsibilities delegated to the school finance section within the department of audit by any legislation enacted during the 2003 general session of the Wyoming legislature shall be transferred to and become

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the responsibility of the legislative school finance and
 audit department created under this act.

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Section 5. Six hundred thirty-nine thousand seven hundred fifteen dollars (\$639,715.00) is appropriated from the general fund to the legislative service office to implement this act. In addition, an additional three (3) full-time positions are authorized for purposes of this act.

11 Section 6. This act is effective July 1, 2003.
