1 A JOINT RESOLUTION designating Tracks Across Wyoming

2 corridor as a Wyoming state heritage corridor.

3

4 WHEREAS, the Fifty-seventh Legislature of the state of

5 Wyoming recognizes that southern Wyoming is rich in the

6 diversity of our state's character through the interaction

7 of natural processes, distinctive landscapes, cultural

8 traditions and economic and social forces that have

9 combined to create a particular pattern of human settlement

10 and activity; and

12 WHEREAS, in 1992, representatives from the cities and towns

13 in six (6) counties across southern Wyoming formed a

14 nonprofit organization, Tracks Across Wyoming, for the

15 purpose of developing a heritage corridor along the route

of the transcontinental railroad in southern Wyoming 1

- 2 running through Laramie, Albany, Carbon, Sweetwater,
- 3 Lincoln and Uinta Counties; and

- 5 WHEREAS, this grassroots organization has adopted the
- following in its brief history: 6

- 1. Vision. The Wyoming Union Pacific corridor project 8
- 9 will preserve, interpret and celebrate Wyoming's historic
- resources, natural beauty, quality of life and spirit. With 10
- 11 authentic preservation and interpretation of historic
- 12 sites, the corridor will be a "cerebral tourism"
- 13 experience, an opportunity for visitors to learn about the
- history and culture of southern Wyoming. 14
- cooperative effort among communities will promote the image 15
- of the southern tier within Wyoming and the nation, and 16
- 17 will contribute to the economic stability for the region.

- 2. Mission Statement. Tracks Across Wyoming is a 19
- 20 partnership of the southern tier of Wyoming formed to
- 21 promote, preserve, enhance and interpret the historic
- 22 transcontinental transportation corridor for the purpose of
- economic development, education and the celebration of our 23
- 24 heritage.

2 WHEREAS, the purpose of this resolution is:

3

4 1. To encourage appropriate partnerships among the

5 state of Wyoming and local governments, federal agencies,

6 nonprofit organizations and the private sector to preserve

7 and conserve those historical and cultural resources; and

9 2. To educate the citizens of the state of Wyoming and

10 in particular those citizens residing in the six (6)

11 southernmost Wyoming counties as to the historical,

12 economic and cultural resources within the Tracks Across

13 Wyoming corridor; and

14

3. To enrich and enhance the quality of life for the

16 present and future generations of this state; and

17

4. To enlighten visitors as to the rich history of the

19 prehistoric migration, up to and including migration that

20 has crossed this corridor, including recognition and

21 celebration of southern Wyoming's six (6) historic trails,

22 the Oregon, California, Mormon, Overland, Pony Express and

23 Outlaw trails, and related stage stops, Union Pacific

24 Railroad sites including depots and roundhouses, mining and

- 1 timber camps, ranches, frontier and territorial prisons and
- 2 those remaining resources of the first United States
- 3 Transcontinental Highway and the Lincoln Highway; and

4

- 5 5. To honor and preserve the downtown historic
- 6 districts and other listings on the National Register of
- 7 Historic Places in the corridor; and

8

- 9 6. To recognize and capture the economic opportunities
- 10 that exist in the Tracks Across Wyoming corridor.

11

- 12 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MEMBERS OF THE
- 13 LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WYOMING:

14

- 15 **Section 1.** That the Wyoming State Legislature
- 16 recognizes the vast richness of the historic and cultural
- 17 resources of the southern corridor, which encompasses
- 18 Laramie, Albany, Carbon, Sweetwater, Uinta and Lincoln
- 19 counties, and hereby declares that henceforth this corridor
- 20 shall be designated as the Tracks Across Wyoming State
- 21 Heritage Corridor.

1 Section 2. That the Secretary of State of Wyoming

2 transmit copies of this resolution to the Governor, members

3 of the Wyoming Transportation Commission and the director

4 of the Department of Transportation.
