Other than adding this staff comment, this draft has not been amended from the version reviewed at the last meeting. While there was discussion regarding making further amendments and limiting multiple subsidies, no motions were adopted and thus no changes have been made. Language could be drafted to reduce any funds provided under this law by amounts provided under any of the other subsidy drafts, or to prohibit any payment both programs to the same depending on the Committee's intent. This draft could be readily incorporated into any of the three other subsidy proposals.

(a) For the period beginning July 1, 2004 through 6 7 June 30, 2005 for the first ten (10) deliveries performed by each physician who averages fewer than fifty (50) 8 9 deliveries per year for calendar years 2001 through 2003 and which were paid for under the Wyoming Medical 10 Assistance and Services Act, there may be an additional 11 12 malpractice insurance compensation payment of two thousand 13 five hundred dollars (\$2,500.00) per delivery. No physician shall be eligible for an additional malpractice insurance 14 compensation payment under this section unless the 15 16 physician is located in an area of this state which is more 17 than thirty (30) miles from not more than one (1) other physician providing obstetric services as determined by the 18 department of health. For calendar year 19 2004 only 20 deliveries performed on or after the effective date of this 21 act March 11, 2004 may be so compensated. Deliveries before the effective date March 11, 2004 may not be counted so 22 23 compensated.
