GINTER SWORN IN TO REPRESENT SENATE DISTRICT 6

CHEYENNE – Jana Ginter, of Carpenter, was sworn in as a member of the 57th Wyoming Legislature on Tuesday, June 1, 2004 at 9:00 a.m. in Cheyenne in the Senate Chambers of the Wyoming Capitol. The Wyoming Constitution Article 6 Sections 20 and 21 provide that new legislators will take their oath of office in the legislative chamber in which they will serve.

Wyoming Supreme Court Justice, Barton Voigt, administered the oath of office and presided over the ceremony in the Senate Chambers at the Capitol in front of members of Ginter’s family, friends, members of the Laramie County legislative delegation, and legislative staff. Senator Ginter was joined during the ceremony by her husband, Tim, and daughter, Taryn, and a number of members of her extended family. Local legislators welcomed Senator Ginter to the Wyoming Legislature and Senator Ginter expressed her excitement about becoming the newest member of the 57th Wyoming Legislature.

The Laramie County Commissioners appointed Ginter on Tuesday, May 25, 2004 to fill the vacant Senate District 6 seat of Senator Rich Cathcart. Cathcart resigned from the Wyoming Senate to accept a position with the State of Wyoming to oversee state capital construction projects. Ginter, a native of Cheyenne, graduated from the University of Wyoming. She served in the United States Army and graduated from the Defense Language Institute, while serving in the Army. Senator Ginter has served as a contract negotiator, a chemist, and a contract inspector for the U.S. Forest Service. – **END** –
