4 (a) A governmental entity is liable for damages
5 resulting from bodily injury, wrongful death or property
6 damage caused by the negligence of health care providers
7 who are employees of the governmental entity, including
8 contract physicians health care providers who are providing
9 a service for state institutions or county jails, while
10 acting within the scope of their duties.

12 (b) Notwithstanding W.S. 1-39-118(a), for claims 13 under this section against a physician health care provider employed by the state of Wyoming a governmental entity 14 15 based upon an act, error or omission occurring on or after 16 May 1, 1988, the liability of the state governmental entity 17 shall not exceed the sum of one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00) to any claimant for any number of claims 18 arising out of a single transaction or occurrence nor 19 20 exceed the sum of one million dollars (\$1,000,000.00) for 21 all claims of all claimants arising out of a single 22 transaction or occurrence.

Section 2. This act shall apply to acts or omissions occurring on or after the effective date of this act.

Section 3. This act is effective immediately upon completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming Constitution.
