(ii) Maintain the classification of gray wolves

(A) The commission shall adopt rules and 1 2 regulations to classify the gray wolf as a trophy game 3 animal and prohibit regulate the taking of gray wolves 4 except as provided by W.S. 23-3-115(c), within that area of 5 the state the commission determines is necessary to reasonably ensure that at the end of the current calendar 6 7 year at least seven (7) packs of gray wolves are located in this state and primarily outside of Yellowstone National 8 9 Park, Grand Teton National Park and John D. Rockefeller, Jr. Memorial Parkway; at the end of the current calendar 10 11 year;

1 (d) The department shall institute and maintain an 2 active program of population monitoring statewide. In all 3 areas of the state, except where otherwise provided, any 4 person who harvests takes a wolf shall notify report the 5 take and required information concerning the wolf to the department where the harvest occurred within ten (10) days 6 7 as provided by commission rule and regulation. information regarding the number or nature type of wolves 8 9 legally harvested taken within the state of Wyoming shall 10 only be released in its aggregate form and no information 11 of a private or confidential personal nature shall be 12 released without the written consent of the person to whom 13 the information may refer. Information identifying any 14 person legally harvesting taking a wolf within this state is solely for the use of the department or appropriate law 15 enforcement offices agencies and is not a public record for 16 17 purposes of W.S. 16-4-201 through 16-4-205.

23 (c) The provisions of subsection (a) of this section 24 relating to the taking of animals doing damage to private

1 property shall apply to gray wolves from and after the date 2 gray wolves are removed from the list of experimental 3 nonessential population, endangered species or threatened 4 species in Wyoming as provided by W.S. 23-1-108. The owner, 5 employee or lessee acting under authority of this section shall notify the department of the killing taking of a gray 6 7 wolf within an any area of the state in which the gray wolf 8 is classified as a trophy game animal. The notification 9 shall be made within ten (10) days of the kill unless the 10 gray wolf was taken in an area where wolves have been 11 classified as trophy game animals pursuant to W.S. 12 23-1-304(b)(i)(A) in which case the notification shall be 13 made within seventy-two (72) hours as provided in W.S. 14 23-1-304(d). 16

Section 2. Contingent upon a cooperative agreement between the game and fish commission and the United States fish and wildlife service to provide for funding, the game and fish department shall purchase collars using the global positioning system or collars using a higher technology to monitor gray wolves. The collars shall be placed on two (2) wolves in each pack being monitored pursuant to W.S. 23-1-304.
