FIFTY-SEVENTH LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WYOMING 2004 BUDGET SESSION

AN ACT relating to Wyoming Controlled Substances Act; amending penalties for various offenses under the act as specified; and providing for an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

Section 1. W.S. 35-7-1031(c)(i)(intro) and 35-7-1039 are amended to read:

35-7-1031. Unlawful manufacture or delivery; counterfeit substance; unlawful possession.

(c) It is unlawful for any person knowingly or intentionally to possess a controlled substance unless the substance was obtained directly from, or pursuant to a valid prescription or order of a practitioner while acting in the course of his professional practice, or except as otherwise authorized by this act. Any person who violates this subsection:

And has in his possession a controlled (i) substance in the amount set forth in this paragraph is quilty of a misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment for not more than twelve (12) months, a fine of not more than one (\$1,000.00), or both. thousand dollars Any person convicted for a third or subsequent offense under this paragraph, including convictions for violations of similar laws in other jurisdictions, shall be imprisoned for a term not more than five (5) years, fined not more than five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00), or both. For purposes of this paragraph, the amounts of a controlled substance are as follows:

35-7-1039. Person using or under influence of controlled substance.

Any person who knowingly or intentionally uses or is under the influence of a controlled substance listed in Schedules I, II or III except when administered or prescribed by or under the direction of a licensed practitioner, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished by imprisonment in the county jail not to exceed <u>ninety (90)</u> days <u>six (6) months</u> or a fine not to exceed <u>one hundred</u> dollars (\$100.00) seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00), or by both.

Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2004.
