State lands trust responsibilities.

A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to public lands; creating a task force to
- 2 review the trust responsibilities of the office of state
- 3 lands and investments as specified; creating a trust land
- 4 preservation and enhancement account; providing for funding
- 5 the trust responsibilities out of trust revenues; providing
- 6 appropriations; and providing for an effective date.

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8 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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10 Section 1.

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- 12 (a) There is created the joint legislative and
- 13 executive task force on review of the office of state lands
- 14 and investments' trust and non-trust responsibilities.

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(b) The task force shall be comprised of: 1 2 3 (i) The governor or his designee; 4 5 (ii) The secretary of state or his designee; 6 7 (iii) The state auditor or his designee; 8 9 (iv) The state treasurer or his designee; 10 state superintendent of public 11 (v) The 12 instruction or his designee; 13 14 (vi) One (1) representative shall be a person 15 working for an organization created for the purpose of 16 advocacy on behalf of the Wyoming public schools, appointed 17 by the Wyoming senate president. 18 19 (vii) One (1) representative of grazing 20 agriculture lessees on state trust lands, appointed by the 21 Wyoming senate president;

1 (viii) One (1) representative of the mineral

2 lessees on state trust lands, appointed by the Wyoming

3 senate president;

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5 (ix) One (1) representative of public

recreational users of state trust lands, appointed by the 6

7 Wyoming speaker of the house of representatives;

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9 (x) One (1) representative from either the

forest products industry or the forestry profession, 10

11 appointed by the Wyoming speaker of the house of

12 representatives; and

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14 (xi) One (1) at-large representative, appointed

by the Wyoming speaker of the house of representatives. 15

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17 (C) The public school advocacy representative shall

serve as chairman of the task force and the director of the 18

office of state lands and investments shall serve as the 19

20 secretary to the task force.

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22 (d) The task force shall be paid salary, travel and

per diem for the performance of their official duties as 23

members of the task force. State employees shall be paid 24

- salary and travel expenses out of their agency's budget in 1
- 2 the performance of their duties on the task force.
- 3 members of the task force who are not state employees shall
- 4 be paid per diem and travel expenses in the same manner as
- 5 state employees.

7 The task force shall: (e)

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- 9 (i) Familiarize itself with the trust and non-
- 10 trust responsibilities of the office of state lands and
- 11 investments;

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- 13 (ii) Conduct a comprehensive review of the
- office of state lands and investments' budget and its 14
- expenditures for trust and non-trust responsibilities to 15
- determine if any change to the funding of the office of 16
- 17 state lands and investments' trust responsibilities
- 18 necessary;

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- 20 (iii) Conduct a comprehensive review of the
- 21 yearly revenues, by source, generated by state trust
- 22 surface and mineral lands to determine if any change to the
- funding of the office of state lands and investments' trust 23
- 24 responsibilities is necessary;

2 (iv) No later than December 1, 2005, prepare and 3 submit a report to the legislative management council, the 4 appropriations committee, the joint education 5 committee, the joint agriculture, public lands and water resources committee and the joint minerals, business and 6 economic development committee. The report shall detail 7 the task force's findings, recommend whether any change in 8 9 the manner or source of funding for the office of state 10 lands and investments' trust responsibilities is necessary, 11 recommend whether the trust responsibilities should be 12 funded out of trust revenues, recommend whether the trust 13 land preservation and enhancement account should continue to be funded and recommend any statutory changes required 14 to implement any task force recommendations; and 15

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17 (v) Recommend to the joint agriculture, public
18 lands and water resources committee any statutory changes
19 that may be required to implement the task force's final
20 recommendations.

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22 (f) There is created an account for trust land 23 preservation and enhancement:

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1 (i) Seven hundred fifty thousand dollars

2 (\$750,000.00) is appropriated from the general fund to the

3 office of state lands and investments to be used for the

4 trust land preservation and enhancement account;

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6 (ii) Funds in the trust land preservation and

7 enhancement account shall be used by the office of state

8 lands and investments to fund projects which preserve and

9 enhance the market value of the trust surface and mineral

10 lands;

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12 (iii) The task force shall review proposals for

13 use of funds in the trust land preservation and enhancement

14 account and make funding recommendations to the board of

15 land commissioners;

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17 (iv) Funds from the trust land preservation and

18 enhancement account shall only be expended by the office of

19 state lands and investments on projects recommended by the

20 task force and approved by the board of land commissioners.

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22 (g) Staff support for the task force shall be

23 provided by the office of state lands and investments staff

24 and by any state agency upon request.

2 (h) This act shall terminate June 30, 2006.

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Section 2. Ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) is appropriated from the general fund to the office of state lands and investments to fund the interim meetings and activities of the task force and to contract with appropriate professionals as necessary to complete the task force study. Expenditure of these funds shall be subject

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Section 3. This act is effective immediately upon completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming Constitution.
