A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to agriculture; clarifying the grain laws

2 relating to buying, selling and storing grain; amending

3 license fees; amending bonding requirements; amending audit

4 requirements; amending insurance requirements; making

5 conforming amendments; amending penalties; providing an

6 appropriation; authorizing an additional position; and

7 providing for an effective date.

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9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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11 **Section 1.** W.S. 11-11-101(a)(ii)(vii) and by creating

12 new paragraphs (viii) through (xii), 11-11-103 through

13 11-11-105, 11-11-107 through 11-11-110, 11-11-111(a)(i)and

14 by creating a new paragraph (viii) and (b), 11-11-112,

11-11-113, 11-11-114(a) and by creating a new subsection 1 2 (c) and 11-11-115 through 11-11-117 are amended to read: 3 11-11-101. Definitions. 4 5 (a) As used in this chapter: 6 7 (ii) "Warehouseman" means any person except the 8 9 grower who buys or sells grain at wholesale, or receives or 10 solicits grain for purchase, sale, shipment transportation 11 or storage either in or outside the state of Wyoming; 12 13 (vii) "Warehouse" means an elevator, mill, 14 warehouse storage bin or building, subterminal grain warehouse storage facility, public warehouse storage 15 16 facility or other structure or facility in which for legal consideration grain is received for storage, handling, 17 processing or shipment transportation either in or out of 18 19 the state of Wyoming; --20 21 (viii) "Depositor" means any person who is in 22 possession of a commodity and entrusts or delivers the 23 commodity to a warehouse for storage;

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1	(ix) "Loss" means the destruction of the
2	commodity due to fire, theft, insects or weather;
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4	(x) "Receipt" means a warehouse receipt issued
5	under this act, including an electronic receipt;
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7	(xi) "Transportation" means the movement of
8	grain from one (1) point to another;
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10	(xii) "Verified" means signed and sworn to be
11	accurate before a person authorized to administer oaths.

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- 21 (a) The director department shall prescribe forms for
- 22 application for a warehouseman's or warehouse license.
- 23 application shall contain information necessary to inform
- 24 the director department of the qualifications, facilities,

1 experience and financial ability of the applicant to carry

2 on the business of buying, selling, warehousing and storing

3 The director department may require the submission

4 of a financial statement or audit prepared by a public

5 accountant or a certified public accountant in order to

establish the financial responsibility of the applicant. 6

If a license is refused by the director department, appeal 7

may be made to the state board of agriculture director. 8

9 All hearings for appeal shall be conducted in accordance

10 with the Wyoming Administrative Procedure Act.

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12 Each warehouse or warehouseman shall at all

13 times, including during any period of suspension of their

14 license, exercise such care in regard to stored and non-

15 storage agricultural commodities in their custody as

16 required under the licensing agreement.

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18 11-11-105. Surety bond required; amount; approval by

department; conditions; exception.

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21 Each applicant for a warehouseman's or warehouse license

22 shall post a cash bond or execute and file with the

23 director a good and sufficient provide to the department a

24 surety bond in an amount determined by the board of

1 agriculture department based on the maximum number of 2 hundred weight the warehouseman or warehouse can store in 3 the warehouses for which the bond is required, but not less 4 than twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000.00).which shall be 5 equal to seventy-five percent (75%) of total receipts of the warehouse from the previous year. If the warehouse 6 7 does not have any bonding history, the bonding requirement shall be equal to seventy-five percent (75%) of the value 8 of the most valuable potentially stored commodity as 9 10 determined by the department. A surety bond shall be executed by a responsible surety company licensed to do 11 12 business in this state, approved by the director, and 13 conditioned upon the faithful performance of the obligation of the warehouseman or person operating a warehouse under 14 the laws of this state and of any additional obligations 15 16 assumed by him under contract with those who deposit grain 17 with him. All bonds shall be payable to the state for the benefit of any injured party, and shall be in the form and 18 contain additional conditions as the director department 19 20 may prescribe. No person is required to file a bond who 21 has already posted similar bond with the United States 22 department of agriculture pursuant to the United States Warehouse Act of August 11, 1916, as amended. 23

11-11-107. Investigation by department; complaint; 1

2 service; hearing.

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4 The director department upon his its own motion or upon 5 verified complaint against any warehouseman or warehouse shall investigate as he the department deems necessary, and 6 7 shall at all times have free and unimpeded access to all facilities or places in which grain is kept, stored, 8 9 handled or transported. If the director department, upon 10 investigation, has reason to believe that any dealer 11 warehouseman or warehouse is not acting as required by law, 12 or upon the filing of a verified complaint against the 13 warehouseman or warehouse, he the department shall have a complaint or copy of the verified complaint served upon the 14 warehouseman or warehouse by personal service, service upon 15 16 a registered agent or by registered mail. Ιf the 17 warehouseman or warehouse fails to make prompt adjustment or settlement of the charges set forth, to the satisfaction 18 of the director department, the director department shall 19 20 give notice of the time and place of a hearing thereon. 21 The hearing shall be held in accordance with the Wyoming 22 Administrative Procedure Act.

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24 11-11-108. Warehouse receipts generally.

2 All warehouse receipts issued for stored grain shall be in 3 a form prescribed by the director department and shall be 4 obtainable only by the warehouseman or warehouse from the 5 director department at cost. Each warehouse receipt issued must show the amount of any cash or the value of any 6 merchandise the warehouseman or warehouse has advanced on 7 the grain represented by the receipt, but such notation 8 9 shall not be construed as fixing the date of sale of the 10 grain.

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11-11-109. Audit of records.

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At least once each year and more often if necessary Two (2) audits shall be conducted on each warehouse on an annual basis as scheduled by the department, or if requested by an interested person the director department shall inspect each licensed warehouse and shall audit the warehouse records. However, no audit shall be performed if the person operating the warehouse certifies that the warehouse does not have any grain stored for others. The director after conferring with interested industry groups shall fix, assess and collect fees for the inspection of facilities storing farm products. The fees shall not exceed fifty

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    percent (50%) of the cost of the inspection and shall be
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    paid by the person requesting the inspection, if any.
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         11-11-110. Warehouse's records; generally.
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    Every licensed warehouse shall maintain complete records of
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    all grain stored, all grain withdrawn from storage, all
    warehouse receipts issued and all receipts returned to and
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    cancelled by him. The records shall be available for
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    examination and audit by the director department at any
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    reasonable time.
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         11-11-111. Warehouseman's and warehouse's records;
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    contents; inspection and audit by department; issuance of

7	confidential inspection of the <u>director</u> <u>department</u> or <u>his</u>
8	<u>its</u> authorized agents at all times. Upon request of the
9	depositor, every warehouseman and warehouse shall issue a
10	receipt for all grain received for storage on a form
11	furnished by the director department.

- 4 that might impair or invalidate such insurance.

- (c) If at any time a disaster or loss occurs at or 6
- 7 within any licensed warehouse, the warehouseman shall
- 8 immediately report to the department the occurrence of the
- 9 disaster or loss and the extent of damage.

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- 11 11-11-113. Grading of grain; notation on warehouse
- 12 receipt.

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- 14 All grain accepted for storage shall be graded by the
- 15 warehouse or warehouseman according to standards of the
- United States department of agriculture, and the grade 16
- 17 established shall be specified upon the warehouse receipt
- 18 issued for the grain.

- 20 11-11-114. Stored grain to constitute
- 21 amount in storage to equal issued storage certificates;
- 22 exceptions; conversion; seizure.

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1 The storage of grain with a warehouse and the 2 movement of grain within or out of the state by a 3 warehouseman constitutes a bailment and not a sale. Upon 4 return of the scale ticket bearing the name of the bailee 5 or warehouse receipt properly endorsed and payment or tender of all advances and charges, the owner of the scale 6 7 ticket or warehouse receipt is entitled to, and the warehouseman or person operating a warehouse shall deliver 8 9 the identical grade and amount of grain placed in storage 10 or transported. Every person operating a warehouse shall 11 maintain at all times in storage, in the state of Wyoming, 12 grain equal in amount and grade to all scale tickets and 13 warehouse receipts issued, unless authorized in writing and 14 verified by holders of scale tickets or warehouse receipts or by the director department to move to other storage, and 15 16 failure to do so is a conversion thereof.

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18 (c) All warehouses shall post current fees and 19 charges at all times.

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21 11-11-115. Disposition of collected funds.

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There is created the grain warehouse inspection account 23

within the earmarked revenue fund. All funds collected by 24

1 the director department shall be deposited in the account created by this section. Interest earned by the account 2

shall be retained in the account. The account is 3

4 appropriated for use and expenditure by the board of

5 agriculture department for the costs of administering the

programs under this article. Itemized vouchers shall be 6

7 submitted to the chief executive officer of the board

department for approval. Upon approval, a warrant for the 8

9 payment of each voucher shall be issued by the state

10 auditor for payment from the grain warehouse inspection

11 account.

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11-11-116. Revocation and cancellation of license.

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15 Failure of any warehouseman or person operating a warehouse

16 to comply with the provisions of this chapter will render

17 the license of the warehouseman or person operating a

warehouse subject to revocation and cancellation by the 18

19 director department.

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21 11-11-117. Prohibited acts; penalties for violations.

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23 (a) Any person who engages in or carries on any grain

24 warehousing business without first having obtained a 1 license, or who continues to engage in or carry on such

2 business after his license has been suspended, revoked or

3 expires is guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be fined not

4 less than twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) one hundred dollars

5 (\$100.00) nor more than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) five

hundred dollars (\$500.00). Each day that such unlicensed 6

7 business is carried on is a separate offense.

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9 (b) Any warehouseman or person operating a warehouse

10 who converts to his own use or that of another, any grain

11 stored or accepted for storage of the value of five hundred

12 dollars (\$500.00) or more, is guilty of a felony and shall

13 be fined not less than five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for

each day of violation and imprisoned for not to exceed

fourteen (14) years. If the value of the grain converted 15

16 five hundred dollars (\$500.00), the is less than

17 warehouseman or person operating a warehouse is guilty of a

misdemeanor and shall be fined not to exceed one hundred 18

dollars (\$100.00) five hundred dollars (\$500.00) or 19

20 imprisoned not to exceed six (6) months, or both.

22 Section 2.

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24 (a) There is appropriated one hundred two thousand

seven hundred dollars (\$102,700.00), or as much thereof as 1

2 is necessary, from the general fund to the department of

agriculture for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2005, to 3

4 implement the purposes of this act.

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The department of agriculture is authorized one 6 (b)

(1) additional full time position to perform the audits of 7

grain warehouses. 8

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10 Section 3. This act is effective immediately upon

completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law 11

as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the 12

13 Constitution.
