AN ACT relating to administration of government; abolishing
the state building commission; assigning functions and
duties of the state building commission to the governor's
office; and providing for an effective date.
Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: Section 1. W.S. 9-2-1016 are amended to read:
*** STAFF COMMENTS *** This draft implements the motion calling for the repeal of the state building commission and transfer of its functions to the Governor's office.

9-2-1016. General services division.

(b) For the purpose of this subsection the term 1

2 "agencies" does not include the University of Wyoming,

3 community college districts, or school districts. It does

4 not include the department of transportation except as to

5 paragraphs (xi), (xii) and (xiii) of this subsection. The

department through the general services division shall: 6

7

(viii) Supervise and approve disposition by sale 8 9 or trade-in of all agencies' property which has been deemed to be no longer cost effective to the state. Real property 10 11 in excess of forty (40) acres in one (1) tract or valued at 12 fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000.00) or more shall not be 13 disposed of at less than current appraised value as authorized in accordance with rules of the state building 14 commission governor's office. No other property shall be 15 16 disposed of at less than fair market value either for cash 17 or in exchange for credit upon purchase of new property. All sales shall be public and based upon adequate notice 18 except that state owned motor vehicles may be sold at 19 20 public or dealer auction and except that for the first 21 thirty (30) days after acquisition, any personal property 22 may be made available to those entities qualifying under federal surplus property guidelines through the state 23 24 surplus property warehouse. The proceeds of sale, less

- costs of sale, shall be remitted to the treasurer for the 1
- 2 benefit of the fund from which the property was purchased.
- 3 This paragraph shall not apply to, nor shall the department
- 4 or the state building commission governor's office approve
- 5 supervise the disposition of land by the or
- transportation commission; 6

- (xix) Lease all property for the state in 8
- 9 accordance with rules of the state building commission
- 10 governor's office. Leasing of property by the state shall
- 11 be conducted on a bid and proposal basis with advertising
- 12 of space needs and square footage in community or local
- 13 newspapers. Leasing contracts may be entered into by
- 14 noncompetitive negotiation only if:

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- 16 (xx) Maintain, repair and replace all state
- property in accordance with rules of the state building 17
- commission governor's office; 18

20 9-5-102. State office space and building sites;

21 authority to buy and lease property; acceptance of

donations, grants and devises. 22

In order to obtain building sites for additional 1 2 office space and state uses and to insure the proper 3 keeping of valuable state records and provide for the 4 expansion of functions of the state, the general services 5 division, with the approval of the state building commission governor's office, may buy, take options to buy 6 7 and lease property to be used for building sites for future state office buildings. The general services division, with 8 9 the approval of the commission governor's office may lease 10 acquired property until it is needed. The general services 11 division, with the approval of the state building 12 commission governor's office, in cooperation with the 13 department of employment, may acquire lands and buildings in the name of the state of Wyoming by purchase, lease 14 agreement, gift or devise to provide suitable quarters for 15 the administration of the Wyoming Employment Security Law 16 and to develop improvements, maintain and repair the lands 17 18 and buildings.

20 (b) To accomplish the purposes of subsection (a) of
21 this section the general services division, with the
22 approval of the state building commission governor's
23 office, may accept donations, grants-in-aid and devises.

9-5-103. Supervision and control 1 of governor's

2 residence.

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The governor's residence and the buildings, grounds and 4

5 property thereto attached belonging to the state of Wyoming

6 are under the supervision and control of the state building

7 commission governor's office.

9 9-5-104. State office buildings; maintenance; rental;

10 use of proceeds.

The general services division, in accordance with 12 (a)

rules of the state building commission governor's office, 13

14 may maintain, operate, lease, manage and equip state office

15 buildings in Wyoming.

17 (b) Every department occupying space in a building

authorized under subsection (a) of this section, if 18

19 required to do so by the general services division, in

accordance with rules of the state building commission 20

governor's office, shall pay to the state treasurer an

annual rental plus a pro rata share of maintenance, 22

23 janitorial services, utilities and other overhead costs

24 necessary to maintain the building in as good a condition

as reasonable and proper use will permit. Payments shall be 1

2 made to the state treasurer for deposit into a fund within

3 the internal service fund to be allocated as follows:

14 (a) Before purchasing any land for any state purpose,

the state agency or board shall, in accordance with rules 15

16 the state building commission governor's office,

17 determine if any land owned by the state is available and

18 could be used for the state purpose. The agency or board

shall, in accordance with rules of the state building 19

20 commission governor's office, negotiate with the agency or

board owning or controlling the land for purchase or lease 21

22 of the lands.

1 (b) Any state agency, assigned the operation, 2 management or use of a state leased or owned building by 3 statute shall follow rules of the state building commission

4 governor's office regarding to the operation, management

5 and use of the building unless the agency adopts rules

different than those of the commission governor's office in 6

7 accordance with the provisions of W.S. 9-5-106.

9 9-5-106. Governor's office powers relative to use of 10 state buildings; rules authorized; exceptions.

12 (a) The state building commission governor's office is authorized to adopt rules and regulations relative to 13 14 the operation, management and use of any state leased or 15 owned building. If the operation, management and use of a 16 state leased or owned building is assigned by statute to 17 any other state agency that agency may adopt rules and regulations relative to the operation, management and use 18 19 of the building different than those of the commission 20 governor's office.

22 (b) The secretary to the commission under 23 1016(b)(xxi) shall administratively governor may designate 24 a position or positions within his office to implement any

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The general services division of the department (a) of administration and information shall, subject to the direction of the state building commission governor's office and with the assistance of other state agencies as necessary, conduct and maintain a comprehensive needs assessment of existing state buildings and of future space requirements for state agencies. The assessment shall be conducted in accordance with rules of the state building commission governor's office adopted pursuant to subsection

1 (d) of this section and be designed to provide uniform

2 statewide data describing the condition of state buildings

3 and projecting building longevity and space requirements.

4 Through the identification of building conditions and

5 needs, the assessment shall enable the evaluation of

6 capital construction and renovation requirements for all

7 state buildings. The needs assessment shall be revised

8 annually on or before October 1 of each year. The needs

9 assessment shall specify construction and renovation

10 requirements for the remainder of the current fiscal year

11 and the succeeding four (4) fiscal years.

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13 (b) On or before November 1 of each year and based

14 upon the statewide needs assessment of state buildings

15 performed under subsection (a) of this section, $\frac{\text{the state}}{\text{the state}}$

16 <u>building commission</u> <u>governor's office</u> shall establish and

17 prioritize construction and renovation needs for state

18 buildings. The listing shall specifically identify and

19 prioritize those buildings in need of building construction

20 or renovation and the estimated costs of required

21 construction or renovation during the current fiscal year

22 and during the succeeding four (4) fiscal years.

1 (c) On or before December 1 of each year, the
2 commission governor's office shall provide copies of the
3 needs assessment and statewide construction and renovation
4 priorities established under this section to members of the

5 legislature.

7 (d) The state building commission governor's office 8 shall adopt rules implementing policies for the management 9 of state buildings. The rules shall establish:

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Rules and procedures adopted under this section 11 by the state building commission governor's office shall be 12 13 applicable to all state owned buildings unless the 14 operation, management and use of the building has been 15 assigned by statute to a specific state agency. The agency 16 responsible for the operation and management of a state 17 building exempted by the provisions of this subsection, 18 shall provide the assessment required by subsections (a) section to the state building 19 through (c) of this 20 commission governor's office for inclusion in the commission's governor's office report to the legislature. 21 22 The rules adopted by the commission governor's office under subsection (d) of this section shall be used as guidelines 23 24 for the management of state buildings assigned by statute

commission. Pursuant to legislative authorization for 1

2 public building construction projects and prior to

3 completion of Level III construction the

7 the commission governor's office shall turn over the

project to the general services division of the department 8

expenditure of time or funds on a project at any level of

activity, if it is established that it would be in the

1 (d) Any agency seeking to rehabilitate an existing public building shall submit that request to the commission 2

3 governor's office. The commission governor's office shall

4 review and develop plans and recommendations for the

(d) The entities of state government specified in this subsection are designated as separate operating agencies, which are separate and distinct from the departments and offices specified in subsection (a) of this section because of their quasi-judicial responsibility or because of their unique, specialized function which precludes their inclusion in another department. This act does not otherwise apply to separate operating agencies. Separate operating agencies are as follows:
