A BILL

for

1	AN ACT relating to a statewide education data system;
2	establishing a statewide education data system enabling
3	data accessing and sharing between school districts and the
4	state; creating an education data management center within
5	the department of education and prescribing duties and
6	responsibilities; delegating rulemaking authority;
7	establishing a student performance data system within the
8	statewide education data system capable of tracking student
9	performance as specified; providing for system advisory
10	groups; providing appropriations and authorizing positions;
11	and providing for an effective date.
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Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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Section 1. W.S. 21-2-204 is created to read: 15

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21-2-204. Statewide education data system; education 1 2 data management center; duties and responsibilities; 3 student performance data system; advisory groups. 4 5 (a) There is created within the department of education the statewide education data system. 6 7 (b) The data system shall: 8 9 10 (i) Provide statewide capability to share and access educational information between school districts and 11 12 the state, through common labeling and storage of data, 13 both internally for school district use and externally for state and federal governmental data collections; 14 15 16 (ii) Provide for universal school district 17 participation in the data system; 18 19 (iii) To the extent possible, leverage existing 20 education data infrastructure to support the data system; 21 22 (iv) Impose training requirements for district participation; 23

1 (v) Provide necessary technical support to 2 districts. 3 4 (c) The state superintendent of public instruction 5 shall establish an education data management center within the department. The center shall through department rule 6 7 and regulation, develop policies and procedures governing data system operation and shall be responsible for: 8 9 10 (i) Implementation and administration of the 11 data system; 12 13 (ii) Development of a system operation plan including individual school district plans; 14 15 16 (iii) Collection and accumulation of school district data for compilation into state reports; 17 18 19 (iv) Development of standards for system data 20 quality and content; 21 22 (v) Administration of system documentation,

district training and system resources.

1 (d) The state superintendent shall establish and 2 appoint advisory groups comprised of representatives from 3 school districts and other state agencies involved with 4 data system management and reporting, including the state 5 information officer and a representative from the school finance section within the department of audit, to assist 6 with the implementation and administration of this section, 7 development of the system operation plan, the 8 establishment of policies and procedures 9 governing 10 education information reporting and collection, including 11 the development of data collection instruments, the use and 12 description of data within education reports and other data 13 needs, requirements and issues. In addition to the school 14 data advisory group established under W.S. 21-2-203(d), advisory groups comprised of seven (7) members each shall 15 16 be established in the following areas: 17 18 Student data and demographics; (i) 19 20 (ii) Certified and classified personnel;

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22 (iii) Technology.

(e) A component of the statewide education data 1 2 system shall include a student performance data system 3 providing support to school districts for requirements of 4 the body of evidence assessment systems implemented by 5 districts in accordance with W.S. 21-3-110(a)(xxiv) to determine levels of student performance and to comply with 6 7 state graduation requirements imposed by the state board of education under W.S. 21-2-304(a)(iv). Operation 8 9 administration of the student performance data system shall 10 be in consultation with the standards and body of evidence 11 tracking advisory group established by the 12 superintendent. The department shall through the education 13 management center established under subsection (b) of this 14 section, provide necessary training and technical support to school district personnel necessary for tracking student 15 performance and body of evidence information. 16

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18 Section 2.

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20 (a) On or before July 1, 2006, and in the manner 21 required under 2002 Wyoming Session Laws, Chapter 76, 22 Section 18(c), the state superintendent shall report to the 23 joint appropriations interim committee and the joint 24 education interim committee on the expenditure of funds

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1 under 2003 Wyoming Session Laws, Chapter 131, Section

2 327(c) and section 3 of this act, together with the

3 position filled under section 3(a) of this act and the

4 status of the position.

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In addition to reporting requirements imposed 6 7 subsection (a) of this section, the superintendent shall report to the joint education interim 8 9 committee on the statewide education data system and the student performance data system established under section 1 10 11 of this act. The report shall be made on or before 12 November 1, 2004, and shall include the status of the data 13 systems, timelines established for implementation of each system, advisory groups established to assist with system 14 development and implementation, and system expenditures. 15

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17 Section 3.

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19 (a) Three million one hundred three thousand three
20 hundred dollars (\$3,103,300.00) is appropriated from the
21 school foundation program account to the department of
22 education to begin the development and implementation of
23 the statewide education data system established under
24 section 1(a) of this act. Amounts shall be appropriated

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1 under this subsection for the period commencing on the

2 effective date of this act and expiring on June 30, 2006,

3 and shall be expended for system infrastructure

4 development, software upgrading, staff training, central

5 data management application, student identification

6 applications, data processing and system management and

7 oversight. In addition, this appropriation includes

8 funding and authorization for one (1) full-time position.

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10 (b) One million four hundred thousand 11 (\$1,400,000.00) is appropriated from the school foundation 12 program account to the department of education for the 13 implementation and operation of the student performance 14 data system, including the purchase of necessary server hardware for those districts not capable of using software 15 compatible with the system and the costs for training 16 17 school district personnel in the use of computer software. The amount appropriated under this subsection shall be for 18

the period beginning on the effective date of this act and

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ending on June 30, 2006.

1 Section 4. This act is effective immediately upon

 $2\,$ completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law

3 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming

4 Constitution.
