A BILL

for

1 A JOINT RESOLUTION relating to crisis pregnancy centers.

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- 3 WHEREAS, more than two thousand five hundred (2,500) crisis
- 4 pregnancy centers across the United States meet the
- 5 comprehensive physical, psychological, emotional and
- 6 spiritual needs of women and men facing unplanned
- 7 pregnancies; and

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- 9 WHEREAS, crisis pregnancy centers offer women free,
- 10 confidential services, including pregnancy testing,
- 11 advocacy, housing, medical referrals, counseling and
- 12 childbirth and parenting classes; and

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- 14 WHEREAS, many crisis pregnancy centers offer ultrasound
- 15 services and information about adoption planning services

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1 to pregnant mothers; and

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- 3 WHEREAS, crisis pregnancy centers encourage women to make
- 4 positive life choices by equipping them with complete and
- 5 accurate information regarding their pregnancy options and
- 6 the development of their unborn children; and

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- 8 WHEREAS, crisis pregnancy centers ensure that women are
- 9 receiving prenatal information and services that lead to
- 10 the birth of healthy newborns; and

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- 12 WHEREAS, crisis pregnancy centers provide women with
- 13 compassionate and confidential counseling in a
- 14 nonjudgmental manner, regardless of their pregnancy
- 15 outcomes; and

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- 17 WHEREAS, the federal government and state governments are
- 18 increasingly recognizing the valuable services of crisis
- 19 pregnancy centers through the designation of public funds
- 20 for these organizations; and

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- 22 WHEREAS, many crisis pregnancy centers work to prevent
- 23 unexpected pregnancies by teaching effective abstinence
- 24 education in many venues, including in public schools, and

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- 1 provide grief assistance for women and men who regret the
- 2 loss of their children from past choices they have made;
- 3 and

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- 5 WHEREAS, crisis pregnancy centers operate primarily through
- 6 reliance on voluntary donations and the time of caring
- 7 individuals who are committed to caring for the needs of
- 8 women and promoting and protecting life; and

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- 10 WHEREAS, there are approximately six (6) crisis pregnancy
- 11 centers currently in operation in Wyoming.

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- 13 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE
- 14 STATE OF WYOMING:

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- 16 **Section 1.** That the legislature strongly supports crisis
- 17 pregnancy centers in their unique, positive contributions
- 18 to the individual lives of women and men and of babies -
- 19 both born and unborn.

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- 21 **Section 2.** That the legislature commends the compassionate
- 22 work of tens of thousands of volunteers and paid staff at
- 23 crisis pregnancy centers in Wyoming and across the United
- 24 States.

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2 **Section 3.** That the legislature encourages the Congress of

3 the United States and other federal and state government

4 agencies to grant crisis pregnancy centers assistance for

5 medical equipment and abstinence education in a manner that

6 does not compromise the religious integrity of these

7 organizations.

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9 **Section 4.** That the legislature disapproves of the actions

10 of any national, state or local groups attempting to

11 prevent crisis pregnancy centers from effectively serving

12 women and men facing unplanned pregnancies.

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14 Section 5. That the Secretary of State of Wyoming transmit

15 a copy of this resolution to each crisis pregnancy center

16 in Wyoming, to the President of the United States and to

17 the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of

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18 Representatives of the United States Congress.
