Commercial driver's license-changes.

## A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to commercial driver's licenses; amending 2 requirements for commercial driver's licenses as specified 3 to comply with federal requirements; establishing a new 4 classification for commercial driver's licenses; specifying 5 grounds for disqualification or cancellation of a commercial driver's license; providing penalties; amending 6 7 definitions; and providing for an effective date.

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         31-7-102. Definitions.
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         (a) As used in this act:

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                  (D) Improper or erratic lane changes;

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                  (F) A violation of state or local law

6-2-106, 31-5-233, 31-7-127, 31-7-128, or 31-7-134 or 1 2 31-7-305 or upon receiving notice of a violation of a 3 statute which, if committed in this state, would be grounds 4 suspension under the Motor Vehicle Safety-5 Responsibility Act. The division may suspend the license of any resident of the state or the privilege of a nonresident 6 7 to drive a motor vehicle in this state upon receiving notice of the conviction of the person in another state or 8 9 federal court of an offense which, if committed in this 10 state, would be grounds for the suspension of the license 11 of a driver under W.S. 31-7-129.

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13 **31-7-303.** Exemptions.

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(a) Notwithstanding any other provision of this act, 15 16 the department shall by rule and regulation grant an 17 exemption from compliance with the licensing requirements of this act article or with any rule or regulation adopted 18 19 pursuant to the licensing requirements of this act article 20 to a class of persons or class of commercial motor vehicles 21 exempted by the secretary of the United States department 22 of transportation pursuant to title 49 U.S.C. § 10526 of 23 the United States Code including:

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31-7-304. Issuance; classifications and endorsements. 1 2 3 (a) Commercial driver's licenses may be issued with 4 the following classifications and endorsements. The holder 5 of a valid commercial driver's license may drive all vehicles in the class for which that license is issued and 6 7 all lesser classes of vehicles except motorcycles and vehicles which require a separate endorsement, unless the 8 9 proper endorsement appears on the license: 10 (ii) The following driver's license endorsements 11 12 are special authorizations permitting the driver to operate 13 certain types of motor vehicles or transport certain types 14 of cargo if the endorsement is displayed on the driver's 15 license: 16 17 (G) "S" authorizes the driver to operate a 18 bus or any motor vehicle as defined in W.S. 19 31-7-102(a)(iii) used for the transportation of preschool, 20 elementary or secondary school students from home to 21 school, school to home or to and from school sponsored 22 events.

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1 (f) Before issuing or renewing a commercial driver's license, the department shall require that the applicant 2 3 present a current federal medical qualification 4 certificate. 5 31-7-305. Disqualification and cancellation; right to 6 7 a hearing. 8 9 (a) Any person is disqualified from driving a commercial motor vehicle for a period of not less than one 10 11 (1) year if convicted of a first violation arising from 12 separate incidents of: 13 (i) Driving or in actual physical control of a 14 commercial motor vehicle under the influence of alcohol or 15 a controlled substance to a degree which renders him 16 17 incapable of safely driving a motor vehicle; 18 19 (iii) Knowingly and willfully leaving the scene 20 of an accident involving a commercial motor vehicle driven 21 by the person; 22 23 (iv) Using a commercial motor vehicle in the 24 commission of any felony; or

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2 (v) Refusal to submit to a test to determine the 3 driver's alcohol concentration while driving or in actual 4 physical control of a commercial motor vehicle; - or 5 6 (vi) Driving a commercial vehicle when, as a result of prior convictions, the driver's driving 7 privileges are cancelled, suspended or revoked, or the 8 9 driver is disqualified from operating a commercial motor 10 vehicle; or 11 12 (vii) Causing a fatality through the negligent 13 operation of a commercial vehicle, including but not 14 limited to homicide by motor vehicle, negligent homicide, motor vehicle manslaughter or a similar local ordinance or 15 similar state law from another jurisdiction. 16 17 (e) A person may be disqualified from driving a 18 commercial motor vehicle for life who uses a commercial 19 20 motor vehicle in the commission of any felony involving the 21 manufacture, distribution or dispensing of a controlled 22 substance, or possession with intent to manufacture,

distribute or dispense a controlled substance.

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1 (f) A person may be disqualified from driving a
2 commercial motor vehicle for a period of not less than
3 sixty (60) days if convicted of two (2) serious traffic
4 violations or one hundred twenty (120) days if convicted of
5 three (3) serious traffic violations, committed in a
6 commercial motor vehicle arising from separate incidents
7 occurring within a three (3) year period.

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(h) For offenses specified in this subsection 9 10 relating to a railroad-highway crossing, a person who 11 holds, or is required to have, a commercial driver's 12 license is disqualified from driving a commercial motor 13 vehicle for a period of sixty (60) days if convicted of a 14 first offense under this subsection, for a period of one hundred twenty (120) days if convicted of a second offense 15 under this subsection in a separate incident within a three 16 17 (3) year period, or for a period of one (1) year for a third or subsequent conviction under this subsection within 18 19 a three (3) year period for driving a commercial motor 20 vehicle in violation of state or local law or regulation 21 pertaining to one (1) of the following offenses at a 22 railroad-highway crossing:

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1	(i) For drivers who are not required to stop at
2	all railroad-highway crossings, failing to slow down and
3	check that the tracks are clear of an approaching train;
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5	(ii) For drivers who are not required to stop at
6	all railroad-highway crossings, failing to stop before
7	reaching the crossing if the tracks are not clear;
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9	(iii) For drivers who are always required to
10	stop at all railroad-highway crossings, failing to stop
11	before driving onto the crossing;
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13	(iv) For all drivers, failing to have sufficient
14	space to drive completely through the crossing without
15	stopping;
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17	(v) For all drivers, failing to obey a traffic
18	control device or the directions of an enforcement official
19	at the crossing; or
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21	(vi) For all drivers, failing to negotiate a
22	crossing because of insufficient undercarriage clearance.
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1 (h)(j) After suspending, revoking, disqualifying or 2 canceling a commercial driver license, the state licensing 3 authority shall update its records to reflect that action 4 within ten (10) days. After suspending, revoking, 5 disqualifying or canceling a nonresident commercial driver's privileges, the department shall notify the 6 7 licensing authority of the state which issued the commercial driver license within ten (10) days. 8 9 10 (i) (k) Before a person is disqualified from driving a 11 commercial motor vehicle under this act, the department shall notify the person and provide an opportunity for a 12 13 hearing and appeal in accordance with the provisions of W.S. 31-7-105. 14 15 16 (k) (m) A disqualification under this section does not 17 affect the department's authority to suspend, revoke, cancel or deny a license under any other law. 18 19

20 (n) A discharge or dismissal under W.S. 7-13-301 21 shall not limit the authority of the department to 22 disqualify a driver from operating a commercial vehicle if the discharge or dismissal under W.S. 7-13-301 is from an 23

1 offense specified in this section and the person has been 2 placed on probation as provided in W.S. 7-13-301(a). 3 4 31-7-310. Rulemaking authority. 5 The department may adopt rules and regulations necessary to 6 7 carry out the provisions of this article and the requirements of the federal motor carrier safety 8 9 regulations in title 49, Code of Federal Regulations. 10 31-7-313. Temporary commercial driver license; fees. 11 12 13 If a person has his driving privileges suspended or revoked for a violation committed while driving a noncommercial 14 vehicle and the department, hearing officer or court issues 15 an order pursuant to W.S. 31-7-105 permitting the person to 16 17 a motor vehicle for purposes of the person's employment, the department shall issue a temporary 18 19 commercial driver license to be used by the person to drive 20 to and from work and to drive a commercial motor vehicle 21 only for employment purposes during the period of the 22 suspension or revocation. the department shall not issue a 23 temporary commercial driver's license to be used by the

person to drive a commercial motor vehicle for the period

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of the suspension or revocation. The department may issue a 1 2 noncommercial temporary license as specified in W.S. 3 31-7-105 if the person is otherwise eligible. The fee for 4 the temporary license shall be the same as for a commercial 5 driver noncommercial driver's license under W.S. 6 31-7-113(a). 7 **Section 2.** W.S. 31-7-102(a)(xli)(C) and 8 9 31-7-304(a)(ii)(F) are repealed. 10 Section 3. This act is effective July 1, 2004. 11 12
