Proof that the tattooist 11 person performing the body-art procedure demanded, was 12 shown and acted in reasonable reliance upon the information 13 contained in any one (1) of the above documents as 14 identification and proof of age is a defense to any criminal prosecution under this section. 15

19 <u>(i) "Body-art" means the practice of physical</u>
20 body adornment utilizing body piercing, branding,
21 scarification, sculpting or tattooing. This definition does
22 not include practices conducted under the supervision of a
23 physician licensed to practice medicine under Wyoming law
24 nor does this definition include piercing of the outer

1	perimeter or lobe of the ear by means of sterilized stud-								
2	and-clasp ear piercing systems;

4	(ii) "Body piercing" means any puncturing or								
5	penetration of the skin or mucosa of a person and the								
6	insertion of jewelry or other adornment in the opening;								
7									
8	(iii) "Branding" means any invasive procedure in								
9	which a permanent mark is burned into or onto the skin								
10	using either temperature, mechanical or chemical means;								
11									
12	(iv) "Scarification" means any invasive								
13	procedure in which the intended result is the production of								
14	scar tissue on the surface of the skin;								
15									
16	(v) "Sculpting" means any modification of the								
17	skin, mucosa, cartilage or tissue of the body for								
18	nonmedical purposes;								
19									
20	(vi) " <u>T</u> attoo" means any indelible design,								
21	letter, scroll, figure, symbol or any other mark placed								
22	upon or under the skin with ink or colors, by the aid of								
23	needles or other instruments.
