Radioactive materials transportation-amendments.

## A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to emergency response fees; modifying fees
- 2 imposed on transportation of radioactive materials;
- 3 modifying uses of fees; clarifying provisions; modifying
- 4 definitions; repealing inconsistent provisions; and
- 5 providing for an effective date.

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7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 9 **Section 1.** W.S. 37-14-103(a), (b)(i)(A) and (B) is
- 10 amended to read:

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12 37-14-103. Emergency response fee.

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- 14 (a) In addition to any other fees and taxes provided
- 15 by law, an emergency response fee of two hundred dollars
- 16 (\$200.00) one thousand five hundred dollars (\$1,500.00)

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1	shall apply to each <del>package <u>shipment</u> of radioactive</del>
2	materials transported through this state. The department
3	of transportation shall collect this fee based on a permit
4	issued by the department which is not inconsistent with
5	federal law. The department shall promulgate rules on
6	issuing and revoking permits which are not inconsistent
7	with federal law. The department shall promulgate rules on
8	quarterly reporting and payment of fees, retention of
9	records and audit requirements. All emergency response fees
10	shall be deposited in a fund within the special revenue
11	fund to be used by the Wyoming emergency management agency
12	with the approval of the governor for the payment of costs
13	associated with training for and conducting emergency
14	response procedures related to, and recovery of, incidents
15	involving the transportation of radioactive and hazardous
16	materials. Nothing in this subsection shall affect the
17	liability of the person responsible for an incident
18	involving the transportation of radioactive and hazardous
19	<pre>materials.</pre>

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21 (b) As used in this section:

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23 (i) "Radioactive materials" means:

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1 (A) Highway route controlled quantities of 2 radioactive materials as defined in 49 C.F.R. 173.403(1) as amended as of <del>January 1, 1989 August 28, 2001;</del> and 3 4 5 (B) Nuclear waste being transported to the waste isolation pilot plant in New Mexico, to any facility, 6 7 established pursuant to section 135 of the federal "Nuclear Waste Policy Act of 1982" as amended, 42 U.S.C. 10101 et 8 9 seq., to any or repository licensed for the permanent deep 10 geological storage or disposal of high-level radioactive 11 waste, transuranic waste and spent nuclear fuel., or to any 12 monitored retrievable storage facility established pursuant to section 141 of the federal "Nuclear Waste Policy Act of 13 1982" as amended. 14 15 **Section 2.** W.S. 31-18-407 and 37-14-103(b)(ii) are 16 17 repealed. 18 19 Section 3. This act is effective July 1, 2004. 20 21 (END)

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
