A BILL

for AN ACT relating to economic development; providing for the 1 2 creation of a main street program as specified; providing for the creation of a main street advisory board; providing 3 4 for membership and duties as specified; specifying duties 5 of the Wyoming business council; providing an appropriation; authorizing positions; and providing for an 6 effective date. 7 8 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 9 10 **Section 1.** W.S. 9-12-801 through 9-12-805 are created 11 12 to read:

14 ARTICLE 8

15 WYOMING MAIN STREET PROGRAM

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1 9-12-801. Definitions. 2 3 (a) As used in this article: 4 (i) "Board" means the Wyoming main street 5 advisory board; 6 7 (ii) "Business area" means a commercial area 8 9 existing at the time services under the Wyoming main street 10 program are requested by a municipality; 11 12 (iii) "Council" means the Wyoming business 13 council created by W.S. 9-12-103; 14 (iv) "Municipality" means a city, town, county 15 16 or district; 17 18 (v) "Pilot program" means a temporary program to last for no longer than three (3) years created by the 19 20 Wyoming business council pursuant to W.S. 9-12-805 for the 21 purpose of providing the board and the council experience 22 in conducting the Wyoming main street program; 23

1 (vi) "Revitalization" means the process of

2 engaging in activities to increase economic activity while

3 preserving and building upon a location's historically

4 significant characteristics.

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6 9-12-802. Wyoming main street advisory board.

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8 (a) There is created a Wyoming main street advisory

9 board. The board shall consist of seven (7) members

10 appointed by the governor, not more than four (4) of whom

11 shall be from the same political party. Board members

12 shall elect from their membership a chairman, vice-chairman

13 and secretary.

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15 (b) The governor may remove any member of the board

16 as provided by W.S. 9-1-202.

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18 (c) Board members shall serve a three (3) year term

19 provided that of the initial board, two (2) members shall

20 be appointed for a one (1) year term, two (2) members for

21 two (2) year terms and three (3) members for three (3) year

22 terms. Vacancies on the board shall be filled by

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23 appointment of the governor for the unexpired term.

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1 (d) Members of the board shall receive the same per 2 diem, expenses and travel allowance as members of the

3 legislature while in actual attendance at meetings of the

4 board and the performance of their duties relative thereto.

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6 (e) The council shall provide staff services as
7 required by the board to carry out the board's duties.

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9 (f) The board shall meet as often as necessary to 10 conduct business, but not less than three (3) times each

11 year. Meetings shall be called by the chairman. A

12 majority of members of the board shall constitute a quorum.

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14 **9-12-803**. Duties of the board.

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16 (a) The board shall:

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18 (i) Assist the council in developing a plan to
19 operate the Wyoming main street program;

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21 (ii) Annually review the program and report

22 findings and recommendations, including recommendations for

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23 future legislation, to the governor;

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1 (iii) Provide a comprehensive evaluation of the 2 Wyoming main street pilot program annually to the joint 3 minerals, business and economic development interim 4 committee, if a pilot program is commenced, and after the 5 expiration of the pilot program, provide to the interim committee a review of the Wyoming main street program in 6 7 the same manner as in paragraph (ii) of this subsection; 8 9 (iv) Promulgate rules necessary to carry out the provisions of this article; 10 11 12 (v) Perform any other duty provided for under 13 this article. 14 9-12-804. Duties of the council. 15

17 (a) The Wyoming business council shall establish and
18 administer a Wyoming main street program to coordinate
19 state and local participation in programs offered by the
20 national main street center, created by the national trust
21 for historic preservation, to assist municipalities in
22 planning, managing and implementing programs for the
23 revitalization of business areas.

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(b) In carrying out subsection (a) of this section, 1 2 the council shall: 3 4 (i) Enter into contracts to obtain business area 5 revitalization services provided by the national main street center; 6 7 (ii) Subject to legislative authorization, 8 9 employ any staff necessary to operate the Wyoming main 10 street program; 11 12 (iii) With advice from the board, develop a plan describing the objectives of the Wyoming main street 13 program and methods by which the council shall: 14 15 16 (A) Coordinate the activities of that 17 program with private and public sector revitalizations of 18 business areas; 19 20 (B) Solicit and use private sector funding 21 for revitalization of business areas; 22 23 (C) Assist municipalities engaged in the revitalization of their business areas. 24

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2 (iv) Coordinate with other state and local 3 public and private entities that provide services to 4 municipalities undertaking projects for the revitalization 5 of business areas;

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7 (v) Provide training, technical assistance and

8 information on the revitalization of business areas to

9 municipalities which do not participate in the Wyoming main

10 street program.

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12 **9-12-805**. **Pilot program**.

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14 (a) Upon recommendation of the board, the council may
15 initiate a pilot program. The council may promulgate all
16 rules and regulations necessary to carry out this section.

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(b) Upon initiation of a pilot program, the council
with advice from the board shall select five (5)
municipalities to participate in the Wyoming main street
pilot program. The council shall select pilot program
participants that represent different geographical regions
or populations. The council shall hold at least one (1)

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1 public hearing before making selections under this

2 subsection.

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4 (c) The council shall commence the pilot program for

5 the five (5) municipalities selected with the advice of the

6 board for three (3) consecutive years. Upon the completion

7 of the three (3) year period, the five (5) municipalities

8 may continue to participate in the Wyoming main street

9 program.

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11 (d) In making its selection pursuant to subsection

12 (b) of this section, the council, with the assistance of

13 the board, shall develop criteria for use in selecting

14 pilot program participants which relate to at least the

15 following issues:

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17 (i) Private and public sector interest in and

18 commitment to revitalization of a business area selected by

19 the municipality;

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21 (ii) Potential private sector investment in a

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22 business area selected by the municipality;

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1 (iii) Local organizational and financial 2 commitment to employ a pilot program manager for not less than three (3) years; 3 4 5 (iv) Local assistance in paying for the services of a design consultant recommended by the advisory board; 6 7 (v) Local commitment to assist in training 8 9 programs to direct activities related to business areas in 10 municipalities that do not participate in the Wyoming main 11 street program. 12 13 (e) After conducting the pilot program for three (3) years, the council shall expand the Wyoming main street 14 program to include other municipalities demonstrating a 15 16 commitment to participate in the program. 17 18 Section 2. 19 20 There is appropriated two hundred seventy-three (a) 21 thousand five hundred dollars (\$273,500.00), or as much 22 thereof as is necessary, from the general fund to the Wyoming business council for the fiscal year beginning July 23 1, 2004, to implement the purposes of this act. 24

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2 (b) The Wyoming business council is authorized one

3 (1) full-time equivalent position and one (1) part-time

4 equivalent position for the fiscal year beginning July 1,

5 2004, to implement the provisions of this act.

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7 Section 3. This act is effective July 1, 2004.
