2	modifying the composition of the board of radiologic
3	technologists examiners; modifying license requirements;
4	modifying license renewal requirements; amending the
5	board's disciplinary authority; and providing for an
6	effective date.
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8	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:
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10	Section 1. W.S. 33-37-102(d)(i), 33-37-103(a), (b)(i)
11	and (ii), 33-37-104, 33-37-106(a), 33-37-107(a) and (b),
12	33-37-108(a), 33-37-110(b) and (c), 33-37-111(a)(intro), by
13	creating a new paragraph (vi) and (b) are amended to read:
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15	33-37-102. Acceptable practices.
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1	(d) This act does not apply to:
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3	(i) Licensed practitioners and properly
4	certified physician assistants and properly licensed
5	advanced practice nurses qualifying under rules and
6	regulations of the state board of nursing as defined in
7	<u>W.S. 33-37-101(a)(iv)</u> ;
8	
9	33-37-103. Board of radiologic technologists
10	examiners; composition; terms; removal.
11	
12	(a) The board of radiologic technologists examiners
13	is created. The board shall consist of three (3) <u>five</u> (5)
14	members who are citizens of the United States and residents
15	of Wyoming appointed by the governor. One (1) member <u>Three</u>
16	(3) members shall be a radiologic technologist
17	technologists who is are registered or who possesses
18	possess suitable equivalent qualifications, one (1) member
19	shall be a licensed practitioner <u>person licensed</u> or
20	otherwise authorized by law to practice medicine
21	specialized in radiology and one (1) member shall be from
22	the general public. Vacancies in unexpired terms shall be
23	filled by the governor for the remainder of the term. The

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governor may remove any board member as provided in W.S. 1 2 9-1-202. 3 4 (b) The terms for each member are: 5 6 (i) One (1) Three (3) radiologic technologist 7 technologists for one (1) year two (2) years; 8 (ii) One (1) licensed practitioner person 9 10 licensed or otherwise authorized to practice medicine in 11 radiology for three (3) years; 12 13 33-37-104. Meetings; quorum. 14 The board shall meet quarterly and elect a chairman at the 15 first meeting of each year. $\frac{Two}{(2)}$ Three (3) board members 16 17 constitute a quorum. 18 19 33-37-106. Applicants; qualifications. 20 21 (a) The board shall grant a license to an applicant who is at least eighteen (18) years of age and who has 22 23 completed a course of study in radiologic technology 24 approved by the board or has otherwise met the requirements

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of this act and provides satisfactory evidence to the board 1 2 of fitness to perform duties of a radiologic technologist. 3 4 33-37-107. Examinations; fees. 5 6 (a) The board shall establish procure examinations 7 for each class of license restricted licenses. 8 9 (b) The board shall administer examinations at 10 regular intervals of not less than six (6) months as 11 established by rules. 12 13 33-37-108. Licenses. 14 15 (a) The board shall issue a license to each applicant 16 who meets the requirements of this act and the rules and 17 regulations promulgated by the board. 18 19 33-37-110. Expiration of license; renewal. 20 21 (b) All licenses issued pursuant to this act with the 22 exception of a special license shall be renewed by the board provided that the licensee has conformed with the 23 provisions of this act and submits a renewal fee in an 24

2	and provided as follows:

4	(i) Upon renewal, each person licensed by the				
5	board as a radiologic technologist shall provide proof that				
6	he has completed twenty-four (24) credit hours of				
7	continuing education credit based upon the national				
8	standards of the American Registry of Radiologic				
9	Technologists;

11	(ii) Upon renewal, each person licensed by the				
12	board as a radiologic technician shall provide proof that				
13	he has completed six (6) credit hours of continuing				
14	education credit based upon the national standards of the				
15	American Registry of Radiologic Technologists.

17	(c) A radiologic technologist who has been licensed				
18	in Wyoming, whose license has not been revoked or suspended				
19	and who has ceased activities as a radiologic technologist				
20	for not more than eighteen (18) months, may apply for a				
21	license and be evaluated by the board.				
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23	33-37-111. Revocation of license.				
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(a) A person licensed pursuant to this act may have
his license revoked, suspended, restricted, censured or
placed on probation by the board for any of the following
causes:

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(vi) Violation of this act.

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complaints alleging a violation under 8 (b) All 9 paragraphs (a) (i) through $\frac{(v)}{(v)}$ (vi) of this section shall be in writing, verified by some party familiar with the facts 10 11 charged and shall be filed with the board. Upon receiving 12 the complaint, the board if it determines the complaint 13 sufficient, shall proceed as in a contested case under the Wyoming Administrative Procedure Act. Upon revocation 14 discipline of any license, the fact shall be noted upon the 15 records of the board and the license shall be returned to 16 17 the board and marked cancelled upon the date of its revocation licensee, the board shall notify the appropriate 18 19 agencies and make other reports as required by law, rules 20 and regulations.

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Section 2. Notwithstanding W.S. 33-37-103(b)(i), one (1) of the additional radiologic technologists appointed to the board of radiologic technologists under this act shall

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1	be appointed for an	initial term of three	(3) years.
2	Thereafter all terms	under W.S. 33-37-103(b)(i) shall be
3	for two (2) year terms
